Draft programme of work of the Population Division, Department of Economic and Social Affairs, for the biennium 2008-2009

Note by the Secretariat

- The draft programme of work of the Population Division, Department of Economic and Social Affairs, for the biennium 2008-2009, which is contained in the annex to the present note, is submitted for the consideration of the Commission on Population and Development in compliance with the Regulations and Rules Governing Programme Planning, the Programme Aspects of the Budget, the Monitoring of Implementation and the Methods of Evaluation. The General Assembly, in its resolution 58/269, decided that the programme narratives of the programme budget fascicles shall be identical to the biennial programme plan. In this connection, the General Assembly, in its resolution 61/235, approved the biennial programme plan for the period 2008-2009 containing the narrative of the subprogramme, which describes the objectives, accomplishments, indicators of achievement and strategy of the subprogramme.
- 2. The draft programme of work, which includes information on outputs, has been formulated within the framework of subprogramme 6, Population, of programme 7, Economic and social affairs, of the biennial programme plan for the period 2008-2009.
- 3. The Commission is invited to take note of the programme narrative and review the proposed outputs to be included in the Secretary-General's proposed programme budget for the biennium 2008-2009, which will be submitted to the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions and the General Assembly at its sixty-second session.

Draft programme of work for the biennium 2008-2009 for the Population Division, Department of Economic and Social Affairs

Objective

1. The aim is to enable the international community to better understand and effectively address current and foreseeable population issues and population dimensions of development at the national and international levels.

2. The subprogramme is expected to achieve its objective and expected accomplishments on the assumption that Member States will remain committed to the goals and objectives of the International Conference on Population and Development and the relevant goals of the outcome documents of the Millennium Summit and the 2005 World Summit.

Strategy

- 3. The Population Division is responsible for the subprogramme. The objective will be achieved by:
- (a) Providing substantive support to United Nations bodies, especially to the Commission on Population and Development, and assessing progress made in the implementation of the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development;
- (b) Facilitating the discussion of key or emerging population issues by experts or government representatives;

- (c) Preparing comprehensive studies on population issues and population trends relating to fertility, mortality, international and internal migration, HIV/AIDS, urbanization, population growth, population ageing, population prospects, population policy and population in relation to development;
- (d) Disseminating population information and policy-relevant findings in the area of population, in particular through the Population Division website;
- (e) Building capacity to address population issues at the national level through workshops or the dissemination of technical material, such as manuals and software.
