

Letter dated 21 June 2000 from the Secretary-General addressed to the President of the Security Council

I have the honour to submit to you, and through you to the members of the Security Council, the text of an exchange of letters between the Secretariat of the United Nations and the Permanent Mission of Iraq to the United Nations extending, in the light of Security Council resolution 1302 (2000) of 8 June 2000, the Memorandum of Understanding of 20 May 1996 concerning the implementation of Security Council resolution 986 (1995) for a period of 180 days, effective 9 June 2000.

Letter dated 21 June 2000 from the Legal Counsel addressed to the Permanent Representative of Iraq to the United Nations

I have the honour to refer to resolution 1302 (2000), adopted by the Security Council on 8 June 2000, by which the Council decided that the relevant provisions of resolution 986 (1995) would remain in force for a new period of 180 days beginning at 00.01 hours, Eastern Daylight Time, on 9 June 2000. I should also like to refer to an exchange of letters between the Secretariat of the United Nations and the Permanent Mission of Iraq to the United Nations dated 11 December 1999 extending, in the light of Security Council resolution 1281 (1999) of 10 December 1999, the Memorandum of Understanding of 20 May 1996 between the Secretariat of the United Nations and the Government of Iraq on the implementation of Security Council resolution 986 (1995) for a period of 180 days, effective 12 December 1999.

In view of the foregoing, I have the honour to propose that the provisions of the Memorandum of Understanding of 20 May 1996 be extended for an additional period of 180 days, effective 9 June 2000.

It is understood that the distribution plans which have already been approved but have not yet been implemented shall continue to apply for goods purchased with oil revenues generated under the respective Security Council resolutions.

If your Government agrees to this proposal, I suggest that this letter, and your reply thereto, shall constitute an agreement between the Secretariat of the United Nations and the Government of Iraq. This, however, does not apply to the second sentence of your reply, which is a unilateral statement by the Government.
