Annotations

1. Election of officers

Following the opening of the open-ended intergovernmental working group on drug demand reduction, the working group will elect a bureau composed of a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman and a Rapporteur.

2. Adoption of the agenda and other organizational matters

Following the election of the Bureau, the working group will adopt the agenda and agree on the organization of work (see Annex).



The provisional agenda for the meeting was prepared in accordance with Commission on Narcotic Drugs resolution 51/4 “Preparations for the high-level segment of the fifty-second session of the Commission on Narcotic Drugs, relating to the follow-up to the twentieth special session of the General Assembly”, adopted on 14 March 2008. In that resolution, the Commission decided to establish open-ended intergovernmental expert working groups to work in a coordinated manner, on the following topics:

- (a) Drug demand reduction;
- (b) Supply reduction;
- (c) Countering money-laundering and promoting judicial cooperation;
- (d) International cooperation on the eradication of illicit drug crops and on alternative development;
- (e) Control of precursors and of amphetamine-type stimulants.

In the same resolution, the Commission decided that each of the working groups should meet once for three days to assess the achievement of the goals and targets set by the General Assembly at its twentieth special session, as well as areas requiring further action, and to draw conclusions for further intersessional discussions.

3. Significant and measurable results in drug demand reduction

The open-ended intergovernmental expert working group on drug demand reduction will review the measures taken by Member States since 1998 to achieve the goals and targets set at the twentieth special session of the General Assembly.

6. Conclusions

Pursuant to Commission resolution 51/4, intersessional meetings shall be held during the second half of 2008 to prepare recommendations for the decisions to be adopted by the Commission at its fifty-second session in 2009. The intersessional meetings should take into account, inter alia, the conclusions of the working groups in order to provide the material on which the drafting of the outcome for the high level segment can be based.

In that resolution it was also decided that a political declaration and, as appropriate, other declarations and measures to enhance international cooperation should be considered and adopted by the high-level segment, identifying on the basis of the results of the review process, future priorities and areas requiring further action, as well as goals and targets to be set in countering the world drug problem beyond 2009.

7. Adoption of the report of the working group

It is expected that the working group will adopt its report, containing conclusions, on the last day of the meeting.
