Note by the Secretary-General

1. In paragraph 6 of its resolution 1997/17, adopted on 11 April 1997, the Commission on Human Rights, inter alia, requested the Secretary-General to submit reports to the General Assembly at its fifty-second session and to the Commission on Human Rights at its fifty-fourth session on progress towards the realization of the rights set forth in the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights, giving due reflection to:

(a) The views of all relevant national and international organizations, governmental or non-governmental, on the opportuneness and resource implications of appointing a special rapporteur to encourage the promotion and protection of economic, social and cultural rights in general;

(b) Their reactions to the report of the Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights on a draft optional protocol for the consideration of communications concerning non-compliance with the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (E/CN.4/1997/105, annex).

2. Upon the endorsement of the Economic and Social Council at its 1997 substantive session (decision 1997/244 of 22 July 1997), a note verbale and a letter have been sent by the Secretariat to collect information, which will be made available to the General Assembly as soon as possible.
