### IDENTIFICATION OF AN ORGANIZATION TO HOUSE THE GLOBAL MECHANISM

Note by the Secretariat

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## I. INTRODUCTION

1. After discussion of the Global Mechanism in Working Group I and the Committee, at its seventh session, the INCD adopted resolution 7/2, which requested the Secretariat to:

- (a) compile inputs regarding the Global Mechanism from the seventh session of the Committee, along with any supplementary submissions from member States to the Secretariat not later than 15 October 1995;
- (b) identify and compile from the Convention and regional implementation annexes articles relevant to the functions and modalities of the Global Mechanism; and
- (c) prepare a preliminary draft list of criteria for selection of an institution to house the Global Mechanism.

2. This note responds to these requests. Its major sections cover the three areas that the INCD indicated. The last section suggests possible action by the Committee at the eight session.

## II. INPUTS AND SUPPLEMENTARY SUBMISSIONS FROM MEMBER STATES

3. Part A below is a summary of comments made in Working Group I during the seventh session of the INCD regarding the mission, functions and modalities of the Global Mechanism. Part B similarly summarizes submissions supplementing inputs at the seventh session that the Secretariat had received from member states as of the date of this note. Any submissions received later will be made available to delegations at the eighth session. The summaries in Parts A and B do not cover discussion of the procedural matters that the adoption of decision 7/2 resolved nor do they record at this stage preferences regarding the appropriate institutions to host the Global Mechanism. While there was broad agreement on many points, there has thus far been no attempt to reach consensus. In some cases, therefore, there may be contradictions and overlap between the points listed below, as is often the case in documents reflecting the totality of views on a matter. The points in both Part A and Part B are grouped under three sub-headings to facilitate understanding of them.

### A. Inputs at seventh session

- (a) *Objective and mission of Global Mechanism (GM)*
  - (i) The basic mission of the GM is to maximize both the availability of funds for implementation of the Convention and the efficiency of existing financial mechanisms.
  - (ii) The GM is a new concept. Although it is not a fund, it has important facilitative functions in mobilizing, as well as channelling, existing and additional resources.
  - (iii) The GM should have a facilitative and advisory mandate. It should not raise funds for the institution that houses it. Its activities should fall between the low and high (clearing house and proactive) options outlined in the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) submission to the INCD.
  - (iv) Coordination is an important aspect of GM operations.
  - (v) Pursuant to article 21, paragraph 4, of the Convention, the basic objective of the GM is to "increase the effectiveness and efficiency of existing financial mechanisms." To do this, it will generally "promote actions leading to the mobilization

and channelling of substantial financial resources" through existing mechanisms.

- (vi) The GM should be more than a "letter box." It must play a role in ensuring the availability of funds even if it does not itself raise funds. Its activities should fall between the low and high options suggested by IFAD.
- (vii) The GM should act as a coordinator and facilitator of existing funding sources, including both bilateral and multilateral ones. Lack of coordination is a key constraint to implementation of the Convention.
- (viii) The GM has to be more than a source of information, clearing house and facilitator.
- (ix) The basic mission of the GM is to ensure that all affected developing countries, in particular those in Africa, can easily obtain needed financing.
- (x) The GM should identify resource gaps and then do something about them by mobilizing, catalysing and leveraging financial resources.
- (xi) The GM should facilitate a programme and process, not a project, basis for implementing the Convention. It should support the bottom-up approach, emphasizing awareness and participation.

(b) *Functions of Global Mechanism (GM)*

- (i) Article 21, paragraph 5, of the Convention lists some GM functions but the list is not exhaustive as the words *inter alia* indicate. Non-governmental organizations (NGOs) could make a contribution to the inventory of programmes referred to in article 21, subparagraph 5 (a). In accordance with subparagraph 5 (b) of the same article, the GM could offer advice about national desertification funds. As part of its functions pursuant to subparagraph 5 (c), the GM should process, analyse and summarize information it gathers. Provision of information to facilitate financing of transfer of technology should be included.
- (ii) Article 21, paragraph 5, enumerates specific GM responsibilities. The GM clearly should include as a priority the identification of existing financial mechanisms, both bilateral and multilateral, and actions to promote in relation to them. Beyond Article 21, paragraphs 4-7, there is much else in the Convention in which the GM could play a role, not only in articles 20 and 21 but elsewhere, for example in article 6 of the Convention and articles 14 and 15 of the African Annex.
- (iii) In determining the functions of the GM, it is necessary to examine all relevant articles of the Convention and the annexes, not just articles 20 and 21.
- (iv) The Convention and its integral annexes should be the sole basis for determining the functions of the GM.

(c) *Characteristics of host organization of Global Mechanism (GM)*

- (i) The host organization should have long experience in developing countries.
- (ii) The main characteristic of the host organization should be its capacity to perform the functions of the GM, which only the Conference of the Parties can determine. It should also be able to link the GM to other relevant organizations. A link with the OECD could, for example, help promote actions by bilateral donors.

- (iii) Organizations other than the host institution should play a role in GM activities.
- (iv) The GM should draw on experienced partners among other organizations, acting in effect as a focal point for a GM "hosting system."
- (v) The host organization should clearly establish the accountability of the GM to the Conference of the Parties.

## B. Supplementary submissions

### (a) *Objective and mission of Global Mechanism (GM)*

- (i) There are four important aspects to the mission of the Global Mechanism. First, it should support Convention implementation in affected developing country Parties by encouraging and attracting additional and adequate financial resources for action programmes at all levels from all potential sources, both official and private. Second, it should increase mobilization of domestic savings and identify gaps where regional and subregional cooperation can supplement national efforts. Third, it should improve coordination and cooperation among various funding sources, particularly in the framework of related United Nations conventions. Lastly, it should support establishment or enhancement of appropriate national institutional arrangements.
- (ii) The GM should mobilize and coordinate existing funding mechanisms to ensure that they are used more effectively to combat desertification. While its primary mandate should be as a clearing house, should appropriate opportunities arise, it could also take a more proactive role in facilitating access by affected developing countries to funding. It should not, however, collect or administer funds itself. Its operations should reflect the role of national action programmes as focal points for the determination of funding.

### (b) *Functions of Global Mechanism (GM)*

- (i) Some of the functions of the GM in carrying out its basic mission include: convening, as appropriate, consultative meetings and pledging conferences; supporting economic and technical cooperation among affected developing country Parties, including joint projects and programmes; and identifying and reviewing measures to facilitate accelerated transfer of relevant technologies.
- (ii) Functions of the GM could include advising affected developing countries on sources of funding, establishing contacts with financing sources to promote funding of desertification activities, and coordinating with broader consultative mechanisms such as World Bank Consultative Groups and UNDP Round Tables.

### (c) *Characteristics of host organization of Global Mechanism (GM)*

- (i) The host institution should operate the GM consonant with guidelines and recommendations of the Conference of the Parties based on the COP's periodic reviews of policies and trends related to financial resources for Convention implementation.

- (ii) The host institution should already be active in combating desertification and have experience implementing project activities in country through an established field network. It should also possess a good capacity to coordinate with other institutions on desertification activities and to work with non-governmental organizations (NGOs).

### III. COMPILATION OF RELEVANT ARTICLES OF CONVENTION

4. Annex I contains a compilation of Convention provisions related to financial resources that are relevant to the functions and modalities of the Global Mechanism. The first column of the compilation matrix catalogues relevant articles pertaining to finance in both the body of the Convention and its annexes. These articles are grouped to differentiate obligations of the Conference of the Parties as well as different groups of Parties.

5. The second column summarizes the relevant articles in capsule form. Since the summaries clearly cannot capture all the nuances of highly negotiated text, they should, therefore, in no way be regarded as substitutes for the provisions themselves but rather as memory aids pointing to the provisions.

6. The third column suggests some possible roles for the Global Mechanism in supporting the implementation of the relevant articles, consistent with its mandate in Article 21, paragraphs 4 to 6, of the Convention. Since there is considerable overlap in the articles themselves, the majority of possible roles suggested show up a number of times.

### IV. PRELIMINARY DRAFT LIST OF CRITERIA FOR SELECTION OF AN INSTITUTION

7. Annex II is the text of the preliminary draft list of criteria for selection of an institution to house the Global Mechanism. It is modelled as much as possible, as a number of delegations suggested during the seventh session, after Annex I of document A/AC.241/34 showing the categories of information which might be requested from international organizations that might provide administrative services to the Conference of the Parties and the Permanent Secretariat.

8. An appendix to Annex II presents a preliminary draft list of functions of the Global Mechanism. This appendix was derived by consolidating the functions in the third column of Annex I to eliminate both duplication and general references to the mission of the Global Mechanism.

### V. POSSIBLE ACTION BY THE COMMITTEE

9. After holding a general discussion of this note, Working Group I could concentrate on the wording of Annex II and its appendix. If it could reach agreement on the functions of the Global Mechanism and the criteria that partially flow from them for selecting a host institution, the Working Group could recommend to the INCED a decision inviting interested organizations to make submissions based on the criteria. The submissions could then be considered at a later session of the Committee.

## ANNEX II

### Preliminary draft criteria for selection of an institution to house the Global Mechanism (GM)

#### Functional capacity

1. Relevance of mandate, general objectives and activities of institution to overall objective of GM, "to increase the effectiveness and efficiency of existing financial mechanisms", and to its mission "to promote actions leading to the mobilization and channelling of substantial financial resources, including for the transfer of technology, on a grant basis, and/or on concessional or other terms, to affected developing country Parties"
2. Capacity of institution to organize GM to perform efficiently functions listed in Appendix, either on its own or in collaboration with other entities, in order to assist Conference of the Parties (COP), as well as individual Parties and groups of Parties, particularly those in Africa, to meet Convention obligations regarding financing
3. Modalities by which institution would perform functions listed in Appendix, including necessary arrangements with other entities
4. Context which institution offers for establishing effective relationships with other relevant entities, including its experience with, and knowledge of, operations of, bilateral, regional and multilateral financial institutions, as well as NGOs and other private-sector entities
5. Knowledge of institution regarding desertification and drought issues, and its experience working with government, local communities and other entities in affected developing countries, particularly those in Africa, in dryland management, local-area development and other relevant fields

#### Relationship to COP

6. GM's status within institution including organizational and administrative arrangements to ensure accountability to COP/responsiveness to COP guidelines
7. Modalities of GM accountability to COP and reporting on GM activities
8. Procedures for COP to enter into agreements with institution regarding GM functions and modalities, including nature, form and timing

#### Administrative and other support

9. Administrative infrastructure available to support GM activities, including location, office space, personnel, financial, communications, information management and field-office frameworks
10. Modalities of staffing GM
11. Projected costs of GM operation, extent to which institutions would absorb them and nature of charges to COP for costs not absorbed, if any

APPENDIX

Possible functions of Global Mechanism (GM)  
in implementation of financial aspects of Convention

Information functions

- (a) Identify, and establish continuing contact with, actual and potential sources of financing from bilateral donors, UN agencies, multilateral financial institutions and regional/subregional financial mechanisms, as well as NGOs, foundations and other private sector entities
- (b) Draw up, regularly review and update, in collaboration with these sources and the OECD, an inventory of relevant cooperation programmes in different developing countries and regions
- (c) Gather, process, analyse and synthesize information on the activities and patterns of these sources in different developing countries and regions, using standard definitions of relevant expenditures
- (d) Disseminate such information, including information to facilitate discussion in the governing bodies of multilateral financial institutions, to interested Parties, groups of Parties, organizations and entities, including participants in consultative processes and consultations among developed country Parties in different regions, both on request and through publications, electronic fora and presentations
- (e) Provide Parties with materials to assist in the preparation of communications required in the review by the Conference of the Parties of implementation of the Convention

Reporting Functions

- (a) Provide the Conference of the Parties with reports, both to evaluate Global Mechanism activities and to facilitate review of the financial aspects of Convention implementation

Advisory functions

- (a) Advise interested Parties, groups of Parties, organizations and entities in different regions, including participants in consultative processes, about:
  - (i) possible improvements in the financial aspects of consultative processes to facilitate the financing of partnership arrangements,
  - (ii) mechanisms to mobilize domestic financial resources in affected developing country Parties,
  - (iii) mechanisms to channel resources to the local and national levels, including through NGOs,
  - (iv) innovative methods and incentives for mobilizing and channelling resources,
  - (v) the financing and institutional strengthening of national, regional and subregional financial mechanisms

Facilitation and coordination functions

- (a) Promote, synthesize and disseminate methodologies for identifying and prioritizing the financial needs of action programmes at all levels and serve as a clearing house for resulting information

- (b) Promote financial support, including financing for the transfer, acquisition, adaptation and development of relevant technology and technology cooperation to and among affected developing countries, at all levels in different regions from bilateral donors, UN agencies, multilateral financial institutions and regional financial mechanisms, as well as NGOs, foundations and other private sector entities
- (c) involve these entities in multiple-source financing arrangements; facilitate coordination among them, including in the operations of consultative processes; and work with broader consultation mechanisms such as consultative groups and roundtables
- (d) Collaborate with relevant organizations, including the OECD, in promoting financial support from developed countries at all levels in different regions
- (e) Promote, and facilitate coordination of, consortia, joint-programme and parallel financing arrangements, as well as promoting, participating in and utilizing assessments of such multiple-source financing
- (f) Analyze, promote and facilitate the operations of mechanisms to channel resources to the local level, including through NGOs, while promoting the provision of seed money to these mechanisms and funding for local-level programmes more generally
- (g) Promote and facilitate assistance on mechanisms to mobilize domestic financial resources in affected developing Parties
- (h) Promote and facilitate the financing and institutional strengthening of regional and subregional financial mechanisms in different regions of the developing world
- (i) Facilitate the assessment and exchange of information on the effectiveness of financial assistance in different regions, including its predictability, flexibility, quality and local-level orientation
- (j) Promote and facilitate the financing, including through multiple-source packages, of programmes for information and data collection, analysis and exchange
- (k) Identify, analyze and promote innovative methods and incentives for mobilizing and channeling financial resources
- (l) Work with the staffs of the Global Environment Facility (GEF) and its implementing agencies, as well as with affected developing country Parties and other participants in consultative processes, in the design of projects suitable for GEF financing
