# Confirmation of the appointment of members of the Investments Committee

# Note by the Secretary-General

1. As indicated in document A/54/104 of 15 July 1999, it will be necessary for the General Assembly, during its current session, to confirm the appointment by the Secretary-General of three persons to fill vacancies in the Investments Committee resulting from the expiration, on 31 December 1999, of the terms of office of Francine Bovich (United States of America), Takeshi Ohta (Japan) and Peter Stormonth Darling (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland)

2. In accordance with the provisions of article 20 of the regulations of the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund, the Secretary-General, after consultation with the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Board and the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, submits for confirmation by the General Assembly the reappointment of Francine Bovich (United States), Takeshi Ohta (Japan) and Peter Stormonth Darling (United Kingdom) as members of the Investments Committee for three-year terms of office beginning on 1 January 2000. Ms. Bovich has served on the Committee since 1991, Mr. Ohta since 1995 and Mr. Stormonth Darling since 1990. The Secretary-General greatly appreciates their willingness to carry on this important international public service.

3. In accordance with past practice, the Secretary-General proposes to appoint Emilio J. Cárdenas (Argentina), Frigyes Hárshegyi (Hungary) and Hélène Ploix (France) as ad hoc members for one year, beginning 1 January 2000.
