Definition of straddling stocks of marine life and list of their main species

Submitted by the delegation of the Russian Federation

Straddling fish stocks are the stocks formed by those species of marine life which reproduce and spend the greater part of their life cycle (spawning, drifting of eggs and larvae, growth of young fish, migration, etc.) within the 200-mile economic zone and which, in some cases (under the influence of climatic conditions or the need to extend their stock area because of an increase in numbers), may temporarily migrate beyond the 200-mile economic zone into adjacent areas or by species whose natural habitat area includes both the 200-mile zone of the coastal State (the larger part of the stock area) and the adjacent area (the smaller part of the stock area).

Straddling fish stocks form part of a single coastal ecosystem and their conservation should be carried out in accordance with unified principles both within the 200-mile economic zone and in adjacent areas.
