LETTER DATED 2 AUGUST 1950 FROM THE SECRETARY-GENERAL OF THE URUGUAYAN DELEGATION TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL IN REPLY TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL'S CABLEGRAM OF 14 JULY 1950 (S/1619) CONCERNING THE SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS OF 25 AND 27 JUNE AND 7 JULY 1950 (S/1501, S/1511, S/1588)

I have the honour to communicate the text of the following telegram received from my Government this morning in reply to the Secretary-General's telegram 126 of 14 July:

"REFERENCE YOUR TELEGRAM 126 REQUESTING, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED BY THE SECURITY COUNCIL, THE EFFECTIVE ASSISTANCE OF THIS GOVERNMENT IN GIVING EFFECT TO THE ABOVE-MENTIONED RESOLUTIONS IN DEFENCE OF PEACE AND INTERNATIONAL SECURITY IN CONNEXION WITH THE AGGRESSION OF WHICH THE REPUBLIC OF SOUTH KOREA HAS BEEN THE VICTIM, I HAVE THE HONOUR TO INFORM YOU:

1. THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF URUGUAY REAFFIRMS ITS INTENTION TO SUPPORT RESOLUTELY MEASURES ADOPTED OR WHICH MAY BE ADOPTED FOR THE PURPOSES ALREADY STATED AND TO FURNISH THE FULLEST CO-OPERATION WITHIN ITS POWER IN SUCH MEASURES HAVING REGARD TO THE CHARACTER OF ITS RESOURCES AND ITS GEOGRAPHICAL POSITION (STATEMENT OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC DATED 27 JUNE, COMMUNICATED THROUGH THE PERMANENT DELEGATION IN TELEGRAM OF 4 JULY TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL).

2. THAT TO ENSURE THAT THE CO-OPERATION WITH THE UNITED NATIONS SHOULD BE CARRIED OUT IN CONFORMITY WITH THE EXISTING INTERNATIONAL INSTRUMENTS AND BE AS EFFECTIVE AS THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC DESIRES THE GOVERNMENT HAS RESOLVED, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RECOMMENDATIONS CONTAINED IN YOUR TELEGRAM 126, TO WHICH THE PRESENT IS A REPLY, THAT THE DETAILS OF THE CO-OPERATION OF THE REPUBLIC SHALL BE CONSIDERED WITH THE UNIFIED COMMAND, TO WHICH END IT HAS BEEN DECIDED THAT CONTACT SHALL BE MADE WITH THE UNIFIED COMMAND BY THE MILITARY ATTACHE OF THE EMBASSY OF THE REPUBLIC IN WASHINGTON, GENERAL ALBERTO BIANCHI, TO WHOM THE NECESSARY INSTRUCTIONS HAVE BEEN GIVEN, "CESAR CHARLONE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS OF THE REPUBLIC OF URUGUAY."
