LETTER DATED 29 AUGUST 1950 FROM THE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL TRANSMITTING A TELEGRAM FROM THE GILBERT ASSOCIATES, INC., CHAPLESTON, SOUTH CAROLINA

I have the honour to quote below a telegram dated 24 August 1950 from Gilbert Associates, Inc., of Charleston, South Carolina, the firm to which the Representative of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics made reference in the course of the Security Council meeting on 22 August:

"APPRECIATE MALIK'S RECOGNITION OF OUR ENGINEERING ORGANIZATION'S EFFORTS TO SUPPLY ELECTRIC POWER TO THE PEOPLE OF SOUTH KOREA. GILBERT ASSOCIATES, INC. DESIGNED AND DELIVERED ELEVEN ELECTRIC POWER PLANTS FOR USER DURING THE WAR UNDER LEND LEASE. SUPPOSE THIS PROVES GILBERT ASSOCIATES, INC. HAS MONOPOLY OF ELECTRIC POWER CENERATION IN USER.
