LETTER DATED 21 MARCH 1991 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF KUWAIT TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

Further to my letter of 14 March 1991, I should like to forward the assessment by the Ministry of Information of **Kuwaiti** property seized or damaged by Iraq.

I should appreciate it if you would arrange for this letter to be circulated as a document of the Security Council.

- 9. Radio transmitting stations at Maqwa', Kabd and Juyun, together with the related studios and their contents
- 10. Spare parts for the engineering services

<u>Note</u>: These estimates do not include the costs stemming from the losses sustained by the National Museum and the Islamic Museum, which housed cultural treasures that cannot be valued in material terms. A full study is being conducted at present for the purpose of establishing estimates of these possessions, which we shall furnish to you upon its completion.

#### I. Radio

# 1. **Kabd** short-wave transmitting station

The Iraqi authorities dismantled and plundered the four new transmitters which were in this station, each having a capacity of 500 kilowatts. They also destroyed the station buildings housing all the other **transmitters**, of which there were seven: six had a capacity of 500 kilowatts, while the seventh had a capacity of 250 kilowatts, In addition, the antenna grids were destroyed. Consequently, the losses at this station are estimated as follows:

500-kilowatt transmitters and related equipment

250-kilowatt transmitters and related equipment

Antenna grid

Buildings required for housing the said equipment and transmitters, with all their appurtenances

## 2. Kabd medium-wave transmitting station

The transmitter buildings and the buildings of the power generating station at this station were destroyed, along with the power supply rooms of the (a) and (b) antennas. The replacement cost of this station is as follows:

750-kilowatt transmitters and related equipment

#### 1.5-megawatt generator

Refrigerator and fire-fighting equipment and other installations

Transmitter and generator buildings

# 3. Magwa' transmitting station

The new units in this station and the new antennas were dismantled and stolen, as well as the power supply rooms and other equipment in this station; also, the building constructed to house this equipment was destroyed.

In addition, the old building at this station, housing its power supply equipment, was destroyed.

- 4. Radio broadcasting studios, including transmitting, recording, editing and music studios, the music room, main control, electronic maintenance. outside broadcast, the ministry telephone exchange, reception end frequency monitoring: the equipment located in these places were dismantled and stolen.
- II. Television

Transmitting

1. Al-Mitla' transmitting station

This station was destroyed in its entirety, along with the old **station** adjacent to it which serves as a stand-by.

2. C'ailaka transmitting station

The old and new buildings of this station were destroyed, and the now equipment in the old buildings was stolen. In addition, tho main transmitting tower suffored damage to cables . . . in four places. The cost of the buildings and equipment and of the ropair of the damage to the transmitting tower amounts to:
