UNITED NATIONS COMMAND COMMUNIQUE NO. 1,444, ISSUED
IN TOKYO 10:00 A.M., TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 25, 1952
(KOREAN TIME)

The ground situation along the Korean battlefront remained relatively the same yesterday as action continued at a reduced scale. A United Nations Command raiding party in the western sector engaged enemy forces for approximately eighty minutes before breaking contact. Five enemy probes were repulsed in the west central sector, and one was thrown back in the eastern sector. The remainder of the front was quiet with only minor enemy contacts reported by United Nations Command patrols.

Weather hampered air operations during the day yesterday. However, at night medium bombers struck enemy barracks and supply areas at Hoeschang while a medium bomber hit enemy front-line positions. Light bombers, also flying at night, blasted two enemy-held rail bridges north of Songchon, destroyed enemy vehicles and hit enemy battle-line positions.

Surface elements of the United Nations Command fleet bombarded enemy targets near Kosong, while carrier-based fliers conducted operations from Haeju to Chinnampo.
