

LETTER DATED 29 OCTOBER 1956 FROM THE REPRESENTATIVE OF DENMARK ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

The situation in Hungary with which the Security Council is now seized on the initiative of the Governments of France, the United Kingdom and the United States of America, has caused great emotion and concern in my country as everywhere in the world where news of the struggle and the fighting has spread. Allow me, Excellency, to voice feelings of the deepest satisfaction at what appears to be the most recent developments, and to express my sincere hope and my belief that the Hungarian people will in peace acquire that national independence for which it has fought since time immemorial.
