ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION

Subject: AFTER-SERVICE HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE

- 1. This addendum to Administrative Instruction ST/AI/172 of 27 March 1967, which should be read in conjunction with the said Administrative Instruction, extends the after-service health insurance coverage to the following categories of former staff and to their spouses and dependent children or surviving spouses and dependent children who were insured at the time of separation:
- (a) A former staff member who was separated between the ages of 55 and 60 years, provided that:
 - (i) On separation he had at least ten years of health insurance coverage in a health insurance scheme available to United Nations staff; and
 - (ii) The cost of participation in the after-service health insurance scheme will be borne in its entirety by the insured.
- (b) A former staff member who on separation had not completed three years of insurance coverage in an insurance scheme available to United Nations staff, provided that:
 - (i) He or his surviving spouse or dependent children receive a periodic payment from the Pension Fund or under appendix D to the Staff Rules; or
 - (ii) His separation from service with the United Nations was caused by death; and
 - (iii) The cost of participation in the after-service health insurance scheme will be borne in its entirety by the insured.
- 2. This addendum shall become effective on 1 July 1968. Persons who, on 1 July 1968, are eligible under the terms of this addendum may apply for participation normally within three months. Applications from persons who become eligible in future will be governed by the time-limits stipulated in paragraph 5 of ST/AI/172.

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
