# MISCELLANEOUS DRAFT AMENDMENTS TO THE MODEL REGULATIONS ON THE TRANSPORT OF DANGEROUS GOODS

### Listing and classification

#### UN 2680 Lithium hydroxide, solid

## Transmitted by the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO)

### **Background**

- 1. Lithium hydroxide is available in two forms the monohydrate (UN 2680) and the anhydrous form. Both the IMDG Code and domestic United States of America regulations recognize the anhydrous form, with shipping requirements similar to that for the monohydrate. For air transport, however, it is necessary to ship it under the generic entry CORROSIVE SOLID, N.O.S. (UN 1759).
- 2. In chapter 3.2, the last sentence of Column 2 text states: "Hydrates of organic substances may be included under the proper shipping name for the anhydrous substance, as appropriate." It is queried if only hydrates of organic substances should be treated this way.

## **Proposal**

- 1. Delete MONOHYDRATE from the proper shipping name LITHIUM HYDROXIDE, MONOHYDRATE.
- 2. Delete "organic" from the text for Column 2 of Chapter 3.2.
- 3. Move the text "Hydrates of substances may be included under the proper shipping name for the anhydrous substance" to 3.1.2 as a new paragraph.
