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INTRODUCTION

A. <u>General remarks</u>

1. This document, prepared in response to a request by the Statistical Commission, constitutes the second (part II) in a series of three documents intended to define the objectives of the 1973 World Programme of Industrial Statistics and to indicate appropriate methods for carrying out the related inquiries in each country. Parts I and III in the series deal respectively with the general statistical objectives of the Programme and the organization and conduct of the national inquiries.

2. The list of selected products and materials included in this document is designed to be used in the 1973 World Programme of Industrial Statistics as a guide in reporting information on the production and consumption of individual commodities. The object of the list is to improve the international comparability of the information reported by each country and at the same time to establish a basic array of data for use in the analysis of national patterns of industrial output and input and in the development of regional and world aggregates of production and consumption. For this reason, the list is regarded as an important supplement to the general recommendations on the content of the 1973 inquiries given in part I of the recommendations. $\frac{1}{\sqrt{}}$

B. <u>Nature of list</u>

3. The list is not intended to take the place of a comprehensive classification of products or materials. Such a classification is available at the international level in the <u>Standard International Trade Classification</u>, <u>Revised(SITC)</u> and this classification will ultimately be supplemented by the general ISIC-based commodity classification now in preparation by the Statistical Office of the United Nations. $\frac{3}{2}$

4. The list is likely to be too limited to form the basis for the detail required at the national level in the 1973 inquiries. It should,

however, provide minimum specifications for this work and a satisfactory standard for the international reporting of data for the year. Subsequently, it may serve as an acceptable standard for international reporting on an annual basis.

C. Sources

5. The selection of commodities is largely based on the list currently used by the Statistical Office of the United Nations in its questionnaire on Industrial Commodity Production Statistics. This list has been expanded and supplemented on the basis of the experience obtained in its use and the comments received from countries since its introduction, and also on the basis of proposals for its revision made by FAO and other agencies engaged in the compilation of special types of commodity data. The Working Group on Industrial Statistics of the Conference of European Statisticians has contributed significantly to its development. $\frac{\mu}{2}$

D. Criteria for selection. ordering and coding

6. The current or prospective importance of the commodity in the international economy has normally been the main criterion for inclusion in the list. At the same time, considerations of balance within the industrial sector and of the "representativeness" of the commodity in terms of a specified group of commodities have been taken into account. An attempt has also been made to deal with commodities which were essentially homogeneous in terms of both the quantitative characteristics used in their measurement and their unit values.

7. Commodities which are principal products of a specified ISIC industry group are placed together in the main list, and the commodity groups thus formed are ordered according to the sequence of the industry groups in the revised ISIC classification. $\frac{5}{}$ Within each of the commodity groups, the items are arranged according to SITC order. Descriptions of commodities have been largely extracted from the Explanatory Notes of the Brussels

Tariff Nomenclature (BTN) and adapted and modified on the basis of national practices and the comments received.

8. The coding of the commodities is set out in terms of the ISIC industry groups of which the commodities are principal products. The first four digits of the six-digit number relate to the pertinent ISIC industry group and the remaining two digits to the serial order of the item within the commodity group. Where two or more units of measurement are recommended, the series is differentiated by the use of capital letters A, B ... following the basic code. Where the codes for a commodity are identified by the letter M, the data should be reported in terms of metal content of metalbearing ores and concentrates.

9. The items in the list are also coded in terms of their positions in the SITC. In this case, also, a six-digit code number is used, the first five digits being the code number of the most closely related SITC item and the sixth digit indicating whether the item is the equivalent of the SITC item (use of zero in sixth place) or only part of it (use of 1, 2 ... in sixth place). Where the item in the list corresponds to more than one SITC item, a plus sign is added to the code number given which corresponds to the first (lower digit) SITC reference. A further indication of the SITC equivalent in such cases is normally given in the commodity description accompanying each item.

E. Scope and coverage of reported data

10. The data to be reported on the commodities in the list should refer in principle to the production and consumption of these commodities by all establishments engaged in industry, that is, establishments engaged primarily in mining, manufacturing and the supply of electricity, gas and water (ISIC Major Divisions 2, 3 and 4).

11. Data on production should not be compiled for the purposes of this Programme for the products of agriculture, forestry and fisheries which are included in the list. Only statistics of consumption of these commodities by industrial establishments covered by the Programme are required. 12. In principle, the production and consumption of the commodities by all non-industrial establishments should be excluded. In practice, some modification in this position may be warranted. In reporting national totals on the production side, for example, the estimated production of non-industrial establishments

should be presented separately as a memorandum item whenever such production is important.

13. The work load of compiling the required data from industrial establishments may be greatly reduced without seriously affecting the completeness of the results if the collection is confined to establishments where most of the production or consumption of the commodity occurs. The choice of cut-off point in the size of establishments for this purpose varies from industry to industry and from country to country according to the relative importance of production or consumption of the commodity in the two size groups of establishments. If the portion pertaining to the small establishments is significant, it may be estimated and incorporated in the totals.

F. Concepts of production and consumption

14. Production and consumption of individual commodities within the industrial sector should be measured ideally in terms of the concepts of total production and total consumption. For purposes of the 1973 Programme, the data required is the quantity of the individual commodities of the list the production of which has been completed (either as a primary or secondary product) by the establishments during the year and intended for shipment or sale to other establishments, that is, whether actually shipped or sold in the year or entered into stock. Fixed assets of the types mentioned in the list produced by establishments for their own use should also be included.

15. The quantities of goods of the kinds described in the list, which are produced by the establishment as intermediate products for consumption within it, should be excluded from the above-mentioned figures and, when significant, tabulated separately as a memorandum item.

16. On the consumption side, the data required are the total quantities of the individual commodities of the list originally received by industrial establishments and owned by them which have entered into their production process during the year. In practice, the collection of the required data may be sought from establishments where most of the consumption takes place and estimates should be made for the consumption by other establishments and incorporated into the total, in cases where such consumption is considered significant.

17. The quantities of those goods described in the list which the establishments consume from their own production should, when significant, be tabulated separately as a memorandum item.

18. Countries who in their national practices limit the collection of information to shipments or sales and purchases or deliveries of commodities should, in addition, for the purpose of this Programme, either collect direct information on quantities produced and consumed of the individual commodities of the list or collect supplementary information on stocks which enables them to make estimates of the data required by the Programme.

G. Units of measurement

19. For the purposes of the international comparison of the results which is envisaged, it is important that the production and consumption of each commodity should be measured in uniform quantitative terms. A basic part of the list which follows is, accordingly, the specification of standard quantitative units of measurement for each item. These are based as far as possible on existing international recommendations for measurements of this kind. In some cases, more than one unit of measurement is prescribed in order to provide a better statement of the dimensions or other characteristics of the commodity. Where necessary, conversion of the reported information to the standard units should normally be undertaken at the national level, either on the basis of the available information on the relationship involved or on the basis of a special inquiry into this relationship.

20. Measurement of production and consumption in terms of value is considered to be of secondary importance for the World Programme. Not only is a considerable element of production or consumption in each country not subject to valuation in any substantive sense but, even where values can be readily reported, international comparison and aggregation are rendered difficult by the general lack of uniformity in the basis of valuation and by the absence of satisfactory factors for currency conversion. Recommendations will be found in part I $\frac{6}{}$ for the valuation of that part of production and consumption which can be identified as output or input of the establishment and, more generally, for the reporting and presentation of value data on products and materials, both at the establishment level and at the national level.

H. Problem of double-counting

21. The problem of double-counting may arise at the national level because of the inclusion in the measure of production or consumption of elements of the production or consumption of the same product or material at different stages of processing. This is likely to be of importance in those cases where minor processing activities are carried out in different establishments, and the resulting differences in the characteristics of the product or material are not reflected in separate entries in the list. In such cases, it is normally recommended that production or consumption should be measured at one specified stage of processing, normally the most important stage. The solutions proposed here are considered interim solutions, since the production or consumption taking place at other stages of processing can only be measured properly by the inclusion of the pertinent products or materials in sufficient detail in the list.

I. Dimensions of list

22. The combined list of products and materials is made up of 655 separate items. Of these, 73 items relate to materials of non-industrial origin and the remaining 582 items to products or materials of industrial origin. These include 66 minerals. For convenience in use, the list is presented in three forms: (a) according to the basic ISIC order; (b) according to SITC order; and (c) alphabetically, according to the names of the commodities.

Broadleaved timber in the natural state as felled, usually with the branches lopped off, and such timber stripped of its bark (including the inner bark) or from which merely the rough protuberances have been removed; trunks or sections of trunks of broadleaved trees, the round surfaces of which have been reduced to flat surfaces by means of axe or adze, or by coarse sawing, to form wood of roughly rectangular cross-section, parts of the bark often remaining at the corners. Logs for sleepers are included. Compact cubic metres.

1301-01 Fish, marine, fresh or chilled

Fresh (live or dead) marine fishes (teleostean and cartilaginous) nominal catches, that is, the live weight equivalent of the fish and fish products landed; frozen fish is excluded. Metric tons.

Fresh nominal catches, that is, the live weight of the crustaceans, molluscs and other invertebrates landed. Frozen crustaceans and molluscs are excluded. Metric tons.

II. Minerals and crude fertilizers

Production comprises the sum of sales, mine consumption, issues to miners and issues to coking, briquetting and other ancillary plants at mines. Metric tons.

Brown coal is a fuel intermediate between hard coal and peat. The dividing line between brown coal and hard coal is drawn on the basis of a gross calorific value of 5 700 calories/gramme on the moist, ash-free basis. Lignite, which is a variety of brown coal of a lower calorific value, is included. Metric tons.

2200-01A <u>Crude petroleum</u> 2200-01B

Liquid product obtained from oil wells and consisting predominantly of nonaromatic hydrocarbons (paraffinic, cyclanic, etc.), provided that they have been subjected to no further processes other than those of decantation, dehydration or stabilization (removal of certain dissolved hydrocarbon gases for convenience of transport), or to which have been added only hydrocarbons previously recovered by physical methods during the course of the abovementioned processes. 3211-43 Woven fabrics of cellulosic fibres

Fabrics of continuous and discontinuous rayon and acetate fibres, including pile and chenille fabrics at loom stage. Part of SITC 6535 and 6536. Square metres.

3211-46 Woven fabrics of non-cellulosic fibres

Fabrics of continuous and discontinuous non-cellulosic fibres other than textile glass fibres, including pile and chenille fabrics at loom stage. Part of SITC 6535 and 6536, Square metres.

3212-01 Blankets

Twine, cordage, ropes and cables of paper yarn are included only if plaited or reinforced with metal. Fancy cords, cords of a kind commonly used in machinery or plant as packing or lubricating materials, abrasives, coated twine, cord, etc., gymnasium apparatus and articles of twine, cordage, ropes and cables are excluded. 3219-01 Floor covering

Floor covering (other than carpets and blankets) on base of paper, paperboard or felt paper, whether or not coated with linoleum; and linoleum; and linoleum on textile base; cut in sheets or tiles. Square metres.

3220-01 Jackets, men's and boys'

Women's and girls' coats of all types other than raincoats, such as overcoats, spring coats, duffel coats (with or without hoods), capes and cloaks. Jackets, boleros, and beach wraps are excluded as well as dressing-gowns. bathrobes, négligées, bed jackets, house coats and similar indoor wear. Number.

3220-22 Dresses, women's and girls'

Women's and girls' dresses of all types, such as street dresses, cocktail dresses, evening dresses, house dresses and schoolgirls' tunics. They may include a matching jacket or bolero. Two-piece dresses consisting of a matching blouse and skirt are included. Knitted dresses made in knitting mills are excluded. Number.

3220-25 Raincoats, women's and girls'

Women's and girls' raincoats of all types and materials, except rubber. Number.

Sawnwood includes wood simply sawn lengthwise (for example, planks, beams, joists, boards, rafters, scantlings, laths, etc.) and wood which been sliced, peeled or rotary cut, and which is more than 5 mm. thick. Rough sawnwood is often further processed in the same establishment into planed, tongued, grooved, chamfered, rabbeted, V-jointed and beaded wood, etc.; where this occurs, production may be counted at the sawn stage or at a later stage, but steps should be taken to ensure that the sawn wood is not counted more than once. Boxes, whether assembled or not (part of SITC 6321) and sawn railway sleepers (part of SITC 2431) are excluded, as is wood sawn into sheets of a thickness of 5 mm. or less (part of SITC 6311). Cubic metres.

3311-10 Veneer sheets

Thin sheets of wood of a uniform thickness not exceeding 5 mm. (excluding any reinforcing material), produced by a sawing, slicing or peeling (rotary cutting) process for use in making plywood and other types of laminated boards, furniture, veneer containers, etc. Cubic metres.

3311-13 Blockboard

Blockboard, laminboard and battenboard consist of a thick core composed of blocks, laths or battens of wood glued together and surfaced with outer plies. Cubic metres.

3311-16 Plywood

A wooden sheet material consisting of three or more layers of veneers glued or cemented together, the grains of adjoining plies usually being at right angles to one another. This item includes veneered panels, that is, sheets or panels consisting of a thin veneer of wood affixed to a base, usually of inferior wood, by gluing under pressure. Cubic metres.

Cellular wood panels 3311-19

Similar in appearance to blockboards, except that the battens or laths forming the core are spaced either parallel or in lattice form. Cubic metres.

3311-22 Particle board

Sheet material manufactured from small pieces of wood or other ligno-cellulosic materials (for example, chips, flakes, splinters, strands, shreds, shives, etc.) agglomerated by use of an organic binder together with one or more of the following agents: heat, pressure, humidity, a catalyst, etc. Wood wool or other particle boards agglomerated by means of an inorganic binder such as cement or plaster are excluded. 3411-07 <u>Wood pulp, dissolving grades</u>

Bleached hardwood or softwood chemical pulp (sulphite or sulphate), of high alpha-cellulose content readily adaptable for uses other than paper-making (rayon, cellophane, lacquers etc.). Metric tons air-dry weight (10 per cent moisture content).

3411-10 Wood pulp, sulphate

Wood pulp prepared by an alkaline process in which the liquor used for digestion contains a mixture of sodium hydroxide and sodium sulphide (sulphate method), and sodium hydroxide alone (soda method). Includes chemical sulphate screenings. Metric tons air-dry weight (10 per cent moisture content).

3411-13 <u>Wood pulp. sulphite</u>

Wood pulp prepared by an acid pulping process. The liquor used is an aqueous solution of sulphurous acid in which lime or some other base has been dissolved. It may be bleached or not. Includes chemical sulphite screenings. Metric tons air-dry weight (10 per cent moisture content).

3411-16 Wood pulp, semi-chemical

Wood pulp in which the fibres are partly separated without material damage by a sequence of chemical and mechanical actions and where the conditions of the separation treatment are not sufficiently severe in themselves to bring about a complete separation of the fibres. Metric tons air-dry weight (10 per cent moisture content).

3411-19 <u>Newsprint</u>

Bleached, unsized or slack-sized printing paper, without coating, of the type usually used for newspapers; weight from 45 to 60 grammes per square metre, usually with at least 70 per cent of the weight of fibrous material derived from mechanical pulp. Metric tons.

3411-22 Other printing and writing paper

3411-28 <u>Cigarette paper</u>

Cigarette paper in rolls exceeding 15 cm. in width or in rectangular sheets of which at least one side exceeds 36 cm. It is a specially made tissue, strong, opaque, generally white but occasionally coloured, containing fillers such as calcium or magnesium carbonate. Its rate of combustion varies. The pulp from which this paper is made is very carefully refined and is drawn on narrow gauge machines. Metric tons.

3411-31 <u>Other machine-made paper and paperboard, simply</u> 64150-0 <u>finished</u>

All kinds of simply finished paper and paperboard in the form of rolls (exceeding 15 cm in width) or rectangular sheets (of which one side exceeds 36 cm) other than newsprint, printing and writing paper, kraft paper and kraft paperboard and cigarette paper. Examples of paper falling under this heading are blotting paper, filter paper, carbon tissue, wrapping paper other than kraft, felt, duplex, triplex and multiplex paperboards, straw paper and strawboard, cable paper, etc. Excludes transformed paper and paperboards such as parchment paper, composite paper or paperboard, impregnated, coated, surface coloured paper and paperboard etc. Metric tons.

3411-34 Fibreboard, compressed

Sheet material manufactured from fibres of wood or other ligno-cellulosic materials, with the primary bond deriving from the arrangement of the fibres and their inherent adhesive properties, with a density over 0.40 g/cm³ (25 lb/ft^3). It includes semi-hardboard, hardboard and super-hardboard as variously defined. Metric tons.
