أولاً - مقدمة

لدواعي الاقتصاد في النفقات طُبعت نسخ محدودة من هذه الوثيقة، ويرجى من المندوبين التفضل بإحضار نسخهم للاحتماعات وعدم طلب نسخ إضافية. التدابير التشريعية الوطنية والتدابير الأخرى التي تعتمدها الأطراف، وأن تتيح تلك التدابير على موقع الاتفاقية على الإنترنت، وأن تنظم حلقة تدريب إقليمية ودون إقليمية بالتعاون مع المراكز الإقليمية التابعة لاتفاقية بازل تتناول وضع وصياغة التشريعات الوطنية، وأن تستمر في تزويد الأطراف بناء على طلبها بالمشورة والمساعدة في مجال التشريعات الوطنية.

#### ثانياً - التنفيذ

Y – لم تتلق الأمانة أية مساهمات طوعية لتغطية تكاليف وضع مشروع دليل التعليمات للمهن القانونية للمحاكمة على الاتجار غير المشروع، وتبعاً لذلك استخدمت الأمانة مواردها الخاصة في وضع مشروع مخطط مفصل بناء على المخطط العام المرفق بمقرر مؤتمر الأطراف، ومع مراعاة التعليقات والمعلومات التي وردها من أربعة بلدان. وقد تم عرض مشروع المخطط المفصل على الفريق العامل المفتوح العضوية (۱) للنظر فيه. ولم يتم الاضطلاع بأية أعمال إضافية في هذا الصدد منذ الدورة السادسة للفريق العامل المفتوح العضوية نظراً لعدم ورود أية مساهمات طوعية لهذا الغرض ولعدم توفر الموارد الداخلية الكافية للأمانة للاضطلاع بهذا العمل. كما لم ترد أي تعليقات منذ الدورة السادسة للفريق العامل المفتوح العضوية. وفيما يتعلق بالتدابير التشريعية الوطنية وغيرها من التدابير، المانة، بقدر الموارد المتاحة لها، من مواصلة جمع التدابير التشريعية والتدابير الأحرى، وأتاحتها على موقع الأمانة على الإنترنت، وقامت بتقديم المساعدة إلى الأطراف بناء على طلبها.

تضمن المرفق<sup>(۱)</sup> لهذه المذكرة تقارير مفصلة عن تنفيذ الأنشطة التدريبية.

## ثالثاً – الإجراء المقترح

٤ - قد يود مؤتمر الأطراف أن يعتمد مقرراً على غرار ما يلي:

إن مؤتمر الأطراف،

۱ – يحث الأطراف على الوفاء بالتزاماتها بموجب الفقرة ٤ من المادة ٤ والفقرة ٥ من المادة ٩ من الاتفاقية، وعلى وجه الخصوص:

- (أ) إصدار، أو استكمال أو تطوير تشريعات صارمة لمكافحة نقل النفايات الخطرة عبر الحدود؛
- (ب) تضمين تشريعاتها الوطنية جزاءات أو عقوبات مناسبة على الاتجار غير المشروع في النفايات الخطرة والنفايات الأحرى التي تغطيها اتفاقية بازل؛
- ٢ يطلب إلى الأمانة، رهنا بتوفر التمويل، تنظيم أنشطة تدريب عن الإنفاذ، بالتعاون
   مع المراكز الإقليمية التابعة لاتفاقية بازل، وأمانات الاتفاقات البيئية المتعددة الأطراف الأخرى

والمنظمات والوكالات أو البرامج الدولية الأخرى، من أجل مساعدة الأطراف، وعلى وجه الخصوص البلدان النامية والبلدان التي تمر اقتصاداتها بمرحلة انتقال، في تمكينها من وضع تدابير تشريعية وغيرها من التدابير الوطنية الأخرى لتنفيذ الاتفاقية وإنفاذها، ولمنع الاتجار غير المشروع والمعاقبة عليه؛

٣ - يشجع الأطراف على الاستمرار في تزويد الأمانة بنصوص التدابير التشريعية
 وغيرها من التدابير الوطنية الأخرى التي اعتمدتها لتنفيذ اتفاقية بازل وإنفاذها؛

٤ - يطلب إلى الأمانة مواصلة تجميع التدابير التشريعية والتدابير الوطنية الأحرى التي تعتمدها الأطراف لتنفيذ اتفاقية بازل، يما في ذلك التدابير الخاصة يمنع الاتجار غير المشروع والمعاقبة عليه، وإتاحة هذه التدابير على موقع الاتفاقية على الإنترنت؟

٥ - يطلب إلى الأمانة أن تعد، رهناً بالمساهمات الطوعية التي تردها لهذا الغرض، مشروع دليل تعليمات للمهن القانونية للمحاكمة على الاتجار غير المشروع، يقوم على أساس مشروع المخطط المفصل الوارد في الوثيقة UNEP/CHW/OEWG/6/12، بالإضافة إلى أية مقترحات أو تعليقات تقدم وفقاً لهذا المقرر وأن تقدم المشروع إلى الفريق العامل المفتوح العضوية للنظر فيه وفي إمكانية اعتماده؛

٦ - يطلب إلى الأطراف وغيرها تزويد الأمانة، في موعد أقصاه [\_\_\_\_] مقترحات وتعليقات على مشروع المخطط المفصل المشار إليه في الفقرة ٥ أعلاه ومعلومات عن تجارب وحالات معينة تتصل بدليل التعليمات؛

٧ - يطلب إلى الفريق العامل المفتوح العضوية أن ينظر في مشروع دليل التعليمات ويعتمده؟

٨ - يدعو الأطراف والجهات الأخرى القادرة على تقديم مساهمات مالية أو عينية لتنفيذ الأنشطة التجريبية الخاصة بالإنفاذ وإعداد مشروع دليل التعليمات للمهن القانونية للمحاكمة على الاتجار غير المشروع، أن تفعل ذلك؛

٩ - يطلب إلى الأمانة أن تواصل في تزويد الأطراف بناء على طلبها بالمشورة والمساعدة في المسائل المتصلة لتنفيذ وإنفاذ الاتفاقية، يما في ذلك، فيما يتعلق بوضع التشريعات الوطنية.

A grant was received in the amount of USD 178,794, and implementation is due to commence in May 2008. It is intended that while the base activities are carried out in Trinidad and Tobago, the results of the project are shared and disseminated in the region through the organization of regional workshops at each of the phases of implementation. The project will involve all relevant Ministries in Trinidad and Tobago, and has received the support of the Secretariats of the Rotterdam and Stockholm Conventions.</li> <li>The Secretariat will serve as the executing agency for this project in Trinidad and Tobago. The Secretariat's involvement in coordinating this project is funded from a voluntary contribution received from Sweden for this purpose.</li> <li>The Secretariat continues to assist other interested countries in adapting the project proposal to their national needs, for presentation to donors for possible funding.</li> </ul>
