Extensions of ongoing country programmes

Note by the secretariat

Summary

In accordance with Executive Board decision 2009/11, this note informs the Executive Board of the one-year extensions of the country programmes for Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Congo, Cuba, Mexico and Sierra Leone, all approved by the Executive Director.

The note further presents the reasons for the proposed one-year extension of the country programme for the Syrian Arab Republic, following a previous one-year extension. The Executive Board is requested to approve this programme extension.

Draft decision

The Executive Board

1. *Takes note* of the one-year extensions of the country programmes for Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Congo, Cuba, Mexico and Sierra Leone, which were approved by the Executive Director and are presented in table 1.

2. *Approves* the one-year extension of the country programme for the Syrian Arab Republic, following a previous one-year extension, as presented in table 2.

Cuba	2014–2018	2019 <i>one-year extension</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – To align the UNICEF country programme with the UNDAF, which has been extended until 2019.
Mexico	2014–2018	2019 <i>one-year extension</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – To align the UNICEF country programme with the UNDAF, which has been extended until 2019. – Elections will be held in mid-2018, and changes are anticipated in key ministries and related government institutions. – To align with the 2014–2019 National Development Plan.
Sierra Leone	2015–2018	2019 <i>one-year extension</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Presidential, parliamentary and local council elections were scheduled for March 2018. – The development of a new country programme document (CPD) will follow rather than precede the adoption of the next national development strategy, which is to be developed following the elections. – To align with the UNDAF, which has been extended to 2019.
