#### **I. Introduction**

1. Led a team of five attorneys to the Appeal Court to argue the test case of poaching of elephants in Mole National Park and succeeded by the force of legal arguments in having the Appeal Court abandon an earlier contrary decision — 1986.
- Servicing the Public Agreements (Review) Committee, which vets all public agreements in Ghana. Led Ghana's negotiating team to negotiate and sign an agreement between the Government of Ghana and Stanley Associates Engineering Ltd. of Edmonton, Alberta, Canada, a multinational corporation — April 1988.
- Attorney-in-charge of the Attorney-General's Office, Volta Region of Ghana, 1973-1977, with the rank of Senior State Attorney. Performed all the functions of the Attorney-General in the region and served as the Legal Adviser to all Government departments in the region, and also represented the Government in both civil and criminal cases within the region. Main function here was the prosecution of offences in the courts within the region; in addition civil cases were also dealt with.

James L. Kateka was born on 29 April 1945 in the Karagwe District, United Republic of Tanzania.

**Qualifications**

Ambassador Kateka is a lawyer by training. He received his Bachelor of Laws degree with Honours at the University College-Dar es Salaam of the University of East Africa in 1970. He obtained a Master of Laws degree (specializing in International Law) at King's College, University of London, in 1974.

He is a partner in the law firm of South Law Chambers, which is based in Dar es Salaam. He is a member of the International Law Commission (1997-2001). He is a Judge ad hoc of the International Court of Justice in the case concerning *Armed Activities on the Territory of the Congo (Democratic Republic of the Congo v. Uganda)*.

**Diplomatic career**

James L. Kateka is a career diplomat who joined the Tanzanian Ministry of Foreign Affairs on 23 March 1970. He has been the Ambassador of the United Republic of Tanzania to Sweden since 1998, with residence in Stockholm. He is concurrently accredited to the other Nordic countries of Denmark, Finland, Norway and Iceland and the Baltic Republics of Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania. He was the Tanzanian Ambassador to the Russian Federation from 1994 to 1998. Before going to Moscow he was the Ambassador of the United Republic to the Federal Republic of Germany for five years, from 1989 to 1994, with residence in Bonn. He was concurrently accredited to Austria, the Holy See, Poland, Romania and Switzerland.

Ambassador Kateka served as Director of the Department for Legal Affairs and International Organizations of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs from 1983 to 1989. From 1980 to 1983, he was Minister Counsellor and later was promoted to the rank of Minister Plenipotentiary and served as head of the Treaties Section in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

From 1976 to 1980, James L. Kateka was posted to the Permanent Mission of the United Republic of Tanzania to the United Nations in New York where he served as Counsellor (1978-1980) and as First Secretary (1976-1978). From 1973 to 1975, he served as Second Secretary and Head of the Legal Section in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. From 1970 to 1973, he was a Third Secretary in the Protocol and Treaties Division of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

**Conference experience**

Ambassador Kateka attended 12 sessions of the General Assembly from 1976 to 1988 and in 1996. He served on the Sixth (Legal) Committee and in the First (Political and Security) Committee. As a specialist in the law of the sea, he attended all sessions of the Third United Nations Conference on the Law of the Sea, from 1973 to 1982.

From 1983 to 1993, he attended all sessions of the Preparatory Commission for the International Seabed Authority and for the International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea. In 1994 and 1995, he participated in the first session of the Assembly of the International Seabed Authority in Kingston, Jamaica. From 1971 to 1973, he attended all sessions of the United Nations Committee for the Peaceful Uses of the Seabed Beyond the Limits of National Jurisdiction, which was the preparatory committee for UNCLOS III.

In 1972, he participated in the London Conference which drafted the Dumping Convention. In 1973, he took part in the IMCO (now IMO) Conference which adopted the Marine Pollution Convention (MARPOL).

In 1977, Mr. Kateka was Head of the Tanzanian delegation to the Diplomatic Conference on Territorial Asylum in Geneva. The same year he led the Tanzanian delegation to the Conference which adopted the Vienna Convention on the Succession of States in respect of Treaties in 1978. In 1983, he participated in the Commonwealth Heads of Government meeting in New Delhi. In 1985, he attended the World Conference on Women in Nairobi. In the same year he attended the twenty-fifth session of the Asian-African Legal Consultative Committee (AALCC) in Arusha.

Dr. Opertti Badan has vast and outstanding experience in the field of international law. Graduated in 1960 from the School of Law and Social Sciences of the University of the Republic, Uruguay, he has been awarded the Chair of International Private Law of both the University of the Republic (1986) and the Catholic University "Damaso Antonio Larrañaga" (1994). In 1983 he was a Guest Professor at the Academy of International Law of The Hague, lecturing in a course within his field of expertise, and since 1975 he has co-chaired and acted as Professor of International Private Law of the Inter-American Juridical Committee of the Organization of American States Annual Course on International Law in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

He has been invited as a Special Guest to the Uruguayan Institute of Procedural Law and has been chairman, rapporteur or special guest at numerous academic meetings, seminars and round tables throughout Latin America and Europe. He has also lectured at several Latin American and European universities. Recently, at the meeting of the Council of the Southern Common Market (Mercosur) in Florianopolis, Brazil (December 2000), he introduced to the Council his "Draft Principles for an integrated proposal for the settlement of disputes within Mercosur", a subject on which he has published a series of essays as part of his extensive and updated work on the law of integration.

Dr. Opertti Badan has published numerous books, articles and jurisprudence commentaries which range from subjects of international private law to human rights, State responsibility on transboundary pollution, bank secrecy, the relationship between Mercosur and the European Union and inter-judicial criminal assistance. His work has achieved special relevance in the areas of embargo on alien properties, international adoption of children and international commercial contracts, in addition to his draft Conventions which he submitted to the Inter-American Conference on International Private Law, where he represented his country as head of delegation and chaired the fourth session of the Conference.

Dr. Opertti Badan is a founding member and member of the Board of the International Law Association of Uruguay. He is also member of the Portuguese-Iberoamerican International Law Institute, the International Law Association of Argentina and the Comparative Law Academy of Brazil. He is also the Director of the Uruguayan Institute of Comparative Law and President of both the Bar Association of Uruguay and the Interamerican Lawyers' Association.

As a member of the International Law Commission (since 1996), Dr. Opertti Badan has participated very actively in its work, making valuable contributions, in particular in his presentations regarding the diplomatic protection of nationals, countermeasures within the area of State responsibility and transboundary pollution.

Dr. Opertti Badan has held several positions in international bodies. In August 1998, he was unanimously elected to the presidency of the fifty-third session of the United Nations General Assembly. Discharging his duties as President, he

accomplished significant advances regarding, inter alia, the negotiations to reform the Security Council with the adoption of resolution 53/30 of 23 November 1998 and the elaboration of minimum rules of consensus within the Ad Hoc Group which he chaired.

Ambassador Sepúlveda has served (1976-1980) as member of the Mexican delegation to the annual meetings of the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank, as well as the Interim Committee, the Development Committee and the Group of 24. He holds a D.Phil. in Law from the University of Oxford, where he was awarded a prestigious prize for his D.Phil. thesis, and an LL.M. with Distinction from the University of Hull, where he was declared the best LL.M. student of the year in 1988 and awarded a prize. He holds his first degree in Law and an M.A. from Tribhuvan University, Kathmandu.

The areas of his expertise include international law, human rights law, international economic trade/law and international environmental law. He has written two single-authored books and a large number of articles published in leading international law journals, such as the *American Journal of International Law*, *International and Comparative Law Quarterly*, *German Yearbook of International Law*, *Netherlands International Law Review* and *European Human Rights Law Review*. Oxford University Press in the prestigious Oxford Monographs in International Law series published one of his major monographs in international law in 1996. For this book he was awarded a prize for Outstanding Legal Scholarship in 1997 by the Society of Public Teachers of Law.

He has lectured widely in the United Kingdom, the United States, the Netherlands, Sweden and Nepal. He was a Visiting Professor of Law at the Brooklyn Law School, New York, in 1999 and taught a full course in International Law. He taught and co-directed a full course in the law of the sea at the World Maritime University, Sweden, in 1994, 1995 and 2000. He has been teaching a course in International Law as a visiting professor at the Institute of Social Studies in The Hague since 1997. He is General Editor of the *Asia Yearbook of International Law* and a member of the Editorial Board of the *European Bulletin of Himalayan Research* published by the School of Oriental and African Studies, University of London.

He is the external examiner for the University of London for their LL.M. programme on International Natural Resources Law and for the School of Oriental and African Studies and Lancaster University for their LL.B. programmes. He is an elected/appointed member of a number of learned international associations. He is an Executive Member of the British Association of University Professors of Law, a member of the Committee on Water Resources Law of the International Law Association and the Commission on Environmental Law of the World Conservation Union.
