THAILAND'S SLANDER REJECTED

HANOI VNA October 16. Japan's News Service KYODO has reported that in a recent note to the U.N. Secretary-General, Thailand listed a series of Vietnamese "violations" of its sovereignty and territorial integrity during September 1982, particularly an "incursion" by Vietnamese soldiers in Surin province of Thailand on September 11.

Viet Nam News Agency is authorized to flatly reject this fabrication which was made to distort Vietnam's goodwill, oppose the developing trend of dialogue in the region, and thus benefit the scheme of Chinese expansionism and hegemonism to foment tension between the ASEAN and Indochinese countries.
