REVIEW OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DECLARATION ON THE STRENGTHENING OF INTERNATIONAL SECURITY

Letter dated 10 January 1986 from the Permanent Representatives of Bulgaria and Romania to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

We have the honour to transmit herewith the Declaration-Appeal by the President of the Socialist Republic of Romania, Nicolae Ceauşescu, and the President of the Council of State of the People's Republic of Bulgaria, Todor Jivkov, concerning the establishment of a chemical-weapon-free zone in the Balkans, signed at Bucharest on 22 December 1985.

We should be grateful if you would circulate the text of the Declaration-Appeal as a document of the General Assembly under the agenda items entitled "Chemical and bacteriological (biological) weapons", "General and complete disarmament" and "Review of the implementation of the Declaration on the Strengthening of International Security".

DECLARATION-APPEAL BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE SOCIALIST REPUBLIC OF ROMANIA, NICOLAE CEAUSESCU, AND THE PRESIDENT OF THE COUNCIL OF STATE OF THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF BULGARIA, TODOR JIVKOV, CONCERNING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A CHEMICAL-WEAPON-FREE ZONE IN THE BALKANS

The President of the Socialist Republic of Romania, Nicolae Ceaugeacu, and the President of the Council of State of the People's Republic of Bulgaria, Todor Jivkov,

Considering the development of the international situation and, in particular, Problems relating to the strengthening of peace and security in Europe, and expressing their deep concern at the extreme tension which continues to exist in Europe and throughout the world,

Noting the serious threats posed by the continuation of the arms race and the testing, production and deployment of new nuclear weapons and other means of mass destruct ion,

Emphasizing the need to take all possible measures to rid Europe of nuclear weapons and all other weapons of mass destruction,

<u>Reiterating</u> the determination of their countries to work steadfastly for the transformation of the Balkans into a zone of peace and co-operation free of nuclear weapons, and affirming their support for the launching and implementation of new actions and initiatives to that end,

<u>Proceeding</u> from the fact that research in the area of **chemical weapons** and the **testing** and production of such weapons have continued to expand in recent **years**, and being of the view that this **further increases the threat** of the destruction of **civilization** and life on Earth,

<u>Conoidering</u> that the conclusion of an effective and verifiable international convention would promote the complete prohibition of chemical weapons, declare the readiness of their countries to participate in its elaboration and welcome the efforts to establish a chemical-weapon-free zone in Central Europe,

Desiring to promote the strengthening of peace and security in the Balkans,

Declare that Romania and Bulgaria are most resolutely opposed to chemical weapons as a means of mass destruction;

<u>Solemnly appeal</u> to the Heads of State and Government of the Balkan countries to concert and co-ordinate the efforts of all States in the region with a view to transforming the Balkans into A chemi A-weapon-free zone;

<u>Propose</u> that negotiations for the conclusion of an agreement among the Balkan countries prohibiting the testing, production, acquisition and stockpiling of any chemical weapons on their territory should be initiated without delay.

The declaration of the Balkans **as** a chemicai-weapon-free zone would constitute an important step towards eliminating a class of extremely **dangerous** weapons from **Europe** and would help to strengthon confidence and co-operation amang the countries and peoples of the region.

The implementation of this Appeal would make a genuine contribution to efforts to bring ebout the general and complete prohibition of chemical weapons and the elimination of existing stockpiles, and would also provide momentum for the negotiatione conducted to that end.

The President of the Socialist Republic of Romania and the President of the Council of State of the People's Republic of Bulqaria are convinced that the Declaration-Appeal concerning the transformation of the Balkans into a sone free of chemical as well as nuclear weapons will elicit a positive response from the Heads of State and Government of the region, and that those leaders' sense of responsibility for the lives of their peoples and the common interests of peace and security in the Balkans, Europe and the entire world will prevail over any differences of social system or other differences.
