Iraq to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

On instructions from my Government, I have the honour to attach a copy of the article entitled "Namibia uranium may fuel Iran's A-bomb" which appeared in the Sunday, 17 May 1987, edition of the British weekly The Observer. According to the article, the Iranian régime is continuing to buy uranium from the Rossing mine, in which the Iranian Government has a 10 per cent shareholding, situated in Namibian territory occupied by the South African racist régime.

I should be grateful if you would have this letter and its annex circulated as a document of the General Assembly, under items 33, 36, 47 and 51 of the preliminary list, and of the Security Council.
