#### GENERAL AND COMPLETE DISARMAMENT

### Report of the First Committee (Part I)

Rapporteur: Mr. Kazimierz TOMASZEWSKI (Poland)

#### I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. The item entitled:
  - "General, and complete disarmament:
  - "(a) Prohibition of the development, production, stockpiling and use of radiological weapons:
    - "(i) Report of the Conference on Disarmament;
    - "(ii) Report of the Secsetary-General;
  - "(b) Objective information on military matters: report of the Secretary-General;
  - " (a) Conventional disarmament: report of the Diearmament Commission;
  - " (d) Nuclear disarmament8
  - "(e) Naval armaments and disarmament: report of the Disarmament Commission;
  - "(f) Prohibition of the production of f issionable material for weapons purposest report of the Conference on Disarmament;
  - "(g) Conventional disarmament on a regional scale;
  - "(h) Notif ication of nuclear tests;

"(i) Review of the role of the United Nations in the field of disarmament: report of the Disarmament Commission"

was included in the provisional agenda of the forty-second session in accordance with General Assembly resolutions 41/59 A, B, C, F, G, I, K, L, M, N and Cl of 3 December 1986.

- 2. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 18 September 1987, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include the item in its agenda and to allocate it to the First Committee.
- 3. At its 2nd meeting, on 1 October, the **First** Committee decided to hold a **general** debate on the disarmament items allocated to it, namely, items 48 to **69**, followed by statements **On** specific disarmament agenda items and a continuation of the general debate, as necessary. The deliberations on those items began at the 3rd meeting, on 12 October.

#### II. CONSIDERATION OF PROPOSALS

5. The consideration of proposals submitted under this agenda item is divided into two parts. Part I deals with draft resolution A/C.1/42/L.1 and draft decision A/C.1/42/L.3. Part II will deal with all other proposals submitted under the agenda i tern.

### A. Draft resolution A/C, 1/42/L.1

6. On 13 October, Romania submitted a draft resolution entitled "General and complete disarmament: nuclear disarmament" (A/C. 1/42/L. 1). The draft resolution was introduced by the representative of Romania at the 4th meeting, on 13 October, and read as follower

## "The General Assembly,

"Noting the joint statement released by the United States of America and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics at the end of the meeting of their Secretary of State and Minister of Foreign Affairs, held at Washington, L.C. from 19 to 17 September 1987,

"Expressing its satisfaction on the agreement in principle reached at that meeting to conclude a treaty on the elimination of intermediate-range and shorter-range missiles in Europe and all over the world,

"Noting with satisfaction that at the same meeting a full spectrum Of questions regarding nuclear, conventional and chemical weapon8 was reviewed and the two parties agreed to intensify their effort to achieve a SO per arm reduction in strategic offensive arms within the framework of nuclear and space talks at Geneva and to begin nuclear-test-ban negotiations,

"Convinced that an early conclusion of the treaty on the • lisaination of intermediate-range and shorter-range missiles would be of aruaial importance for the betterment of the international political climate and would create conditions conducive to further disarmament agreements.

"Reaffirming the central role and primary responsibility of the United Nation 0 in the sphere of disarmament,

- "1. Appeals to the Government of the Union of Soviat Socialist Republics and to the Government of the united States of America to spare no affort in concluding at an earliest date, during 1997, the treaty on the elimination of intermediate-range and shorter-range missiles in Europe and elsewhere;
- "2. <u>Calls upon</u> all European States as well as all interested States to do their utmost in order to assist the process of negotiation and its succeeeful aonalueion:
- "3. Calls upon all States to undertake concrete measures to halt the arms race and to proceed to disarmament, and first of all to nuclear disarmament, as well as to contribute to the relaxation of international tension and the resumption of the policy of détente, to the strengthening of international co-operation and respect for the national independence of all peoples."
- 7. At the request of the sponsor, no action was taken on draft resolution A/C.1/42/L.1.

### B. Draft decision A/C. 1/42/L. 3

- 8. On 20 October, the Chairman of the First Committee submitted a draft decision entitled "Genera) and complete disarmament" (A/C. 1/42/L.3), which he introduced at the 13th meeting, on thr same date.
- 9. A the same meeting, the Committee adopted draft resolution A/C.1/42/L.3 without a vote (see para. 10) .

#### XXX. RECOMMENDATION OF THE FIRST COMMITTEE

10. The Pirst Committee recommends to the Genera.1 Assembly the adoption of the following draft decision:

### General and complete disarmament

The General Accembly, noting the joint statement released by the United States of America and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republiae at the end of the meeting between the Secretary of State and the Minister for Foreign Af fairs, held at Washington, from 15 to 17 September 1987, urges the Governments of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and of the United States of America to spare no effort in aonaluding, in aaaordanae with the agreement in principle reashed at that meeting, at the earliest possible date a treaty on the elimination of their intermediate-range and chorter-range missiles to be signed at a summit meeting to be held in the fall of 1987 between President Reagan and General Seuretary Gorbachev, as it was agreed, and to make a similarly intensive effort to ashieve a treaty on 50 par aent reductions in their strategic offensive arms within the framework of the Geneva Nuclear and Spaae Talks.
