PROHIBITION OF THE DEVELOPMENT AND MANUFACTURE OF NEW TYPES OF WEAPONS OF MASS DESTRUCTION AND NEW SYSTEMS OF SUCH WEAPONS

I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. The item entitled *Prohibition of the development and manufacture of new types of weapons of mass destruction and new systems of such weapons: report of the Conference on Disarmament" was included in the provisional agenda of the forty-second session in accordance with General Assembly resolut ion 41/56 of 3 December 1986.
- 2. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 18 September 1987, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include the item in its agenda and to allocate it to the First Committee.
- 3. At i ts 2nd meeting, on 1 October, the First Committee decided to hold a general debate on the disarmament items allocated to it, namely, items 48 to 69, followed by statements on specific disarmament agenda items and a continuation of the general debate, as necessary. The deliberations on those items took place between the 3rd and the 31st meetings, from 12 October to 3 November (see A/C. 1/42/PV. 3-31).
- 4. In connection with item 59, the First Committee had before it the following documents:

- (b) Note verbale dated 16 June 1987 from the Permanent Mission of Mozambique to the United Nations addressed to the Seutetary-General, transmitting the text of the final communiqué of the VII Summit Conference of the Hoads of State of Angola, Cape 'Verde, Guinea-Bissau, Mozambique and Sao Tome and Principe, held at Maputo on 21 and 22 May 1987 (A/42/352-S/18930):
- (a) Letter dated 9 October 1987 from the Permanent Representatives of Argentina, Greece, India, Mexico, Sweden and the United Republic of Tanzania to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General, transmitting the text of the joint statement issued on 7 October 1987 by the Precident of Argentina, the Prime Minister of Greece, the Prime Minister of India, the Precident of Mexico, the Prime Minister of Sweden and the First President of the United Republic! of Tanzania (A/42/652-S/19201):
- (d) Letter dated 23 October 1987 from the Permanent Representative of Zimbabwe to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General, transmitting the final communique of the Meeting of Ministers for Foreign Affairs and Heads of Dulegation to the forty-second session of the General Assembly, held in New York from 5 to 7 October 1997 (A/42/681).

If. CONSIDERATION OF DRAFT RESOLUTION A/C.1/42/L.55

- 5. On 27 Oatobor 1987, Afghanistan, Angola, Benin, Bulgaria, the Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Domocratia Yemen, Ethiopia, the German Democratic Republic, Hungary, the Lao People's Democratic Republic, Mongolia, Mozambiquo, Poland, Romania, the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and Viat Nam submitted a draft rocolution, entitled "Prohibition of the development and manufacture of new types of weapons of mass destruction and now systems of euch weapons" (A/C. 1/42/L.55), which was later also sponsored by Burkina Faso and the Syrian Arab Republic. The draft recolution was introduced by the representative of the Byeloruesian Soviet Socialist Republic at the 39th meeting, on 10 November.
- 6. At its 40th meeting, on 11 November, the Committoo udopted draft recorded A/C.1/42/L.55 by a recorded vote of 106 to 1, with 18 abstentions (see para. 7). The voting was as follows:

III. RECOMMENDATION OF THE FIRST COMMITTEE

7. The First Committee recommends to the General Assembly the adoption Of the following draft resolution:

Prohibition of the development and manufacture of new types of weapons of mass destruction and new systems of ouch weapons

The Genera i Assembly,

Recalling its previous recolutions on the prohibition of the development and manufacture of new types of weapons of mass de, truction and new systems of such weapons,

Recalling also the decision contained in paragraph 77 of the Final Document of the Tenth Special Session of the General Assembly, 2/ the first

special session devoted to disarmament, to the effect that, in order to help prevent a qualitative arms race and so that scientific and technological achievemente might ultimately be used solely for peaceful purposes, effective measures ehould be taken to provont the emergence of new types of weapons of mass destruction based on new scientific principles and achievement8 and that efforts aimed at the prohibition of such new types and new systems of weapons of mass destruction should be appropriately pureuad,

Noting that in the course of i to 1987 session the Conference on Diearmament considered the item entitled "New typos of weapons of mass destruction and new systems of ough weapons; radiological weapons",

Taking into consideration the section of the report of the Conference on Disarmament relating to this question, 3/

Convinced that all ways and neans should be utilized to prevant the development and manufacture of new types of weapons of mass destruction and new systems of ouch weapons,

Determined to prevent modern science and technology from loading to the development of new types of weapons of mass destruction that hove characteristics comparable in destructive effect to those of weapons of mass destruction identified in the definition of weapons of mass dootruction adopted by the United Nat ions in 1948, 4/

- 1. Reaffirms on the basis of the common desire of the international community the necessity of prohibiting the development and manufacturu of new types of weapons of mass destruction and new systems of such weapons;
- 2. Requests the Conference on Disarmament, in the light of its existing priorities, to keep constantly under review, with appropriate export assistance, the question of the prohibition of the development and manufacture, of new types of weapons of mass daotruation and new systems of ouch weapons with a view to making, when necessary, recommendations on undertaking specific negotiations on the identified types of such weapons)
- 3. <u>Calls upon</u> all **States**, immediately following the identification of any new typo of weapon of mass destruction, to renounce practical development of such a weapon and to commence negotiations on its prohibition;

- 4. Once again urges all States to refrain from any action that could lead to the emergence of now types of weapone of mass destruction and new systems of such weapons;
- 5. Calls again upon all States to undertake effort8 to ensure that ultimately scientific and technological achievements may be used solely for peaceful purposes;
- 6. Requests the Secretary-General to transmit to the Conference on Disarmament all documents relating to the consideration of this item by the General Assembly a t its forty-second session;
- 7. Requests the Conference on Diearmament to submit to the General Assembly for consideration at its forty-third session a report on the results achieved)
- 0. Decides to include in the provisional agenda of its forty-third session the item entitled 'Prohibition of the development and manufacture of new typos of weapons of mass destruction and new systems of such weapons: report of the Conference on Disarmament".
