The second mooting of Ministers for Foreign Affairs of the States members of the Permanent Commission for the South Pacific (CPPS), held at Viña del Mar, Chile, in February 1984, reaffirmed the unswerving and categorical opposition of their Governments to the conduct of nuclear \bullet xplorionr and the dumping of radioactive wastes, \bullet rpocially in the Pacific Basin, as \bigcirc \blacksquare xprorrion of their common policy on thr protection of the marine \bullet nvironment and called for the immediate and definitive cessation of those \bullet ctivitier.

The 18th ordinary meeting of the Permanent Commission, held in the Galapagos Islands, Ecuador, in August 1985, instructed the Secretary-General, in pursuance Of that common policy, to continue to protest on behalf of that maritime organisation of the South American Pacific countries whenever any further nuclear \bullet xplo8ion8 are conducted in the region,

Accordingly, on behalf of the Permanent Commission for the South Pacific (CPPS), the Secretary-General once again draws attention to the serious danger posed by nuclear ● xploSionS to the marine environment and its resources, reiterates the Commission's opposition to and strong protest against such activities, and calls for their immediate and definitive cessation. 1. On 26 May 1988 France conducted another nuclear explosion at thr Mururoa Atoll, having an ● Stimated force of 80 kilotons.

2. The second meeting of Ministers for Foreign Affair8 of the State8 members of the Permanent Commission for the South Pacific (CPPS), held at Viña del Mar, Chile, in February 1984, reaffirmed the unswerving and categorical opporition of their Governments to the conduct of nuclear \bullet xploaion8 and the *dumping* of radioactive wastes, \bullet 8pocially in the Pacific Basin, as an expression of their common policy on the protection of the marine environment and called for the immediate and definitive cessation of those activities.
