ANNEX

Final communiqué of the Meeting of Ministers for Foreign Affairs
and Heads of Delegation of the Movement of Non-Aligned Countries
to the forty-third session of the United Nations General Assembly
held in New York on 3 October 1988

The Ministers for Foreign Affairs and heads of delegation of non-aligned countries to the forty-third session of the United Nations General Assembly met in New York on 3 October 1988 in order to consider and co-ordinate their views and actions on all issues of special interest to non-aligned countries on the agenda of the General Assembly.

The Ministers and heads of delegation recalled that the Conference of Foreign Ministers of Non-Aligned Countries held from 5 to 10 September 1988 at Nicosia, Cyprus, had assessed and analysed current developments in international political and economic affairs, and reviewed the implementation of the decisions of the Eighth Summit Conference of Heads of State or Government held at Harare and subsequent Ministerial and other meetings of the non-aligned countries. They also noted that the Nicosia Ministerial Conference had adopted comprehensive action-oriented declarations, and that the Chairman of the Co-ordinating Bureau had submitted a report on the state of the implementation of the decisions of the Eighth Summit and subsequent meetings of the Movement.

The Ministers and heads of delegation reaffirmed their faith in and commitment to the principles and purposes of the Charter of the United Nations as well as their conviction that faith in the United Nations was central to the Movement of Non-Aligned Countries and that the United Nations was the most appropriate international forum with a central role in the making and maintenance of international peace and security; in the peaceful settlement of disputes; and in the achievement of the exercise of the right to self-determination of peoples under colonial domination and foreign occupation, as well as in the strengthening of international co-operation in all fields; the establishment of equitable and just economic relations, and the strengthening of peaceful coexistence, universal détente, disarmament and development. They stressed that recent developments had once again vindicated and confirmed their faith in and commitment to the United Nations and proven the efficacy of the Organisation in finding solutions to major international issues and they expressed their determination to make their contribution to its activities in continued co-operation with other countries.

The Ministers and heads of delegation expressed deep concern and anxiety over the devastating impact of hurricane Gilbert in Jamaica and of the sudden and unprecedented floods in Bangladesh, the Sudan and other countries. They called upon the international community to render the necessary assistance towards immediate relief and rehabilitation and also to consider longer term measures to help those countries to reconstruct their severely damaged infrastructure.

The Ministers and heads of delegation reaffirmed their call to the United Nations to provide adequate protection to the Palestinian people under Israeli occupation.

The Ministers and heads of delegation called upon the international community to give priority to the solution of those serious economic problems of the developing countries. They observed that the important strides made in finding solutions to regional conflicts and in disarmament had NOT been matched by commensurate progress in solving the acute economic problems that beset the developing countries. The Ministers and heads of delegation expressed concern that, in the absence of an improved international economic environment, the positive developments in the international political climate might prove merely ephemeral.

The Ministers and heads of delegation reaffirmed their commitment to abide faithfully by the original principles of non-alignment as embodied in successive Summit declarations of the Movement of Non-Aligned Countries since 1961. They resolved that the non-aligned countries would ratify in close co-operation with one another, and with other Member States of the United Nations, on all items of special concern to the Movement on the Assembly's agenda in accordance with the principles and objectives of the Movement, and taking into account the Declaration adopted by the Eighth Summit Conference at Harare, as well as the subsequent declarations of conferences and meetings of Foreign Ministers.

The Ministers and heads of delegation decided to renew the mandates of working, contact and drafting groups in respect of various agenda items before the forty-third session of the United Nations General Assembly.

The Ministers and heads of delegation took note of the proposal made by the Federal Secretary for Foreign Affairs of Yugoslavia that the Ninth Summit of the Heads of State or Government be held at Belgrade during the first week of September 1989. They further noted the proposal by the Permanent Representative of Cyprus that the first meeting of the Ministerial Committee on procedures of the Movement be held at Nicosia from 10 to 13 January 1989.
