#### ANNEX

Final communique of the Meeting of Ministers for Foreign Affairs and Heads of Delegation of the Movement of Non-Aligned Countries to the forty-third session of the United Nations General Assembly held in New York on 3 October 1988

The Ministers for Foraiga Affairs and heads of delegation of non-\*ligaod countries to the forty-third session of the United Nations General Assembly mot in Now York on 3 October 1988 in order to consider and co-ordinate their views and actions on all issues of special interest to non-aligned countries on the agondr of the General Assembly.

The Ministers and heads of delegation recalled that the Conference of Foreign Ministers of Non-Aligned Countrior hold from 5 to 10 September 1988 at Nicosia, Cyprur, had assessed and analysed current developments in international political compared conomic affairs, and reviewed the implementation of the decisions of the Eighth Summit Conference of Heads of State or Government hold at Harare and subsequent Ministerial and other mootings of the non-aligned countries. They also noted that the Nicosia Ministerial Conference had deptrd comprehensive action-oriented declarations, and that the Chairman of the Co-ordinating Euraau had submitted a report on the state of the implementation of the decisions of the Eighth Summit and subsequent meetings of the Movement.

The Ministers and heads of delegation rarffirmed their faith in end commitment to the principles and purposes of the Charter of the United Nations a8 well a8 their conviction that faith in the United Nations was contral to the Movement of Non-Aligned Countries and that the United Nations was the most proprieto international forum with a contral role in the making and maintenance of international peace and security, in the peaceful settlement of disputes; and in the achievement of the xarciro of the right to olf-determination of peoples under colonial domination and foreign occupation, a8 well 88 in the strengthening of international co-operation in all fields; the establishment of quitable and just conomic relations, and the strengthening of poacoful coexistence, universal détente, disarmament and development. They stressed that recent developments had once again vindicated and confirmed their faith in and commitment to the United Nations and proven the efficacy of the Organisation in finding adultions to major international issues and they prepared their determination to make their contribution to its activities in continued co-operation with other countries.

The Ministers and heads of delegation • Xpr888@d deep concern and allxiety over the davratating impact of hurricane Gilbert in Jamaica and of the sudden and unprecedented floods in Bangladoah, the Sudan end other countries. They called upon the international community to render the necessary assistance towards immediate relief and rehabilitation and also to consider longer term measures to help thour countries to reconstruct their severely damaged infrastructure.

The Ministers and heads of delegation reaffirmed their call to the United Nations to provide adequate protection to the Palestinian people under Israeli occupation.

The Ministers and heads of delegation called upon the international community to give priority to the solution of the serious conomic problems of the developing countries. Thry observed that the important strides made in finding solutions to regional conflicts and in disarmament had not born matched by commensurate progress in solving thr acute oconomia problems that beset the developing countries. The Ministerr and heads of delegation expressed concern that, in the absence of an improvedinternational conomic nviroament, the positive developments in the international political climate might prove merely phemoral.

The Ministers and heads of delegation reaffirmed their commitment to abide faithfully by the original principles of non-alignment as embodied in successive Summit declarations of the Movement of Non-Aligned Countries since 1961. They resolved that the non-aligned countries would rat in close co-operation with one another, and with other Member States of the United Nations, on all items of special concern to the Movement on the Assembly's and taking into a coount the Decker countries and objectives of the Movement, and taking into a coount the Decker countries by the Eighth Summit Conference at Harare, as well as the subsequent declarations of conferences and mootings of Foreign Ministers.

Thr Ministers and heads of delegation decided to renew the mandates of working, contact and drafting groups in respect of various agenda items before the forty-third session of the United Nations General Assembly.

The Ministers and heads of delegation took note of the proposal made by the Federal Secretary for Foreign Affairs of Yugoslavia that the Ninth Summit of the Heads of State or Government be hold at Belgrade during the first week of September 1989, They further noted the proposal by the Permanent Representative of Cyprus that the first mooting of the Ministerial Committee on procedures of the Movement be held at Nicosia from 10 to 13 January 1989.
