<u>Letter dated 30 November 1988 from the Permanent Representative of Pakistan to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General</u>

Further to my letter dated 21 November 1988 (A/43/849-5/20283), I have the honour to inform you that recently the Afghan WAD (Intelligence) Organization in Khost provided the following sabotage material to an agent for carrying out explosions in Afghan refugee camps in Kurram Agency:

- (a) TNT slabs 2
- (b) Detonators 2
- (c) Detonating cord · 12 ft.

The Afghan Chargé d'affaires was called to the Foreign Office at Islamabad in the morning of 29 November 1988, and a strong protest was lodged with him over this action of the Afghan régime, which constitutes a violation of the Geneva Accords. He was asked to inform his authorities that if such activities did not cease the entire responsibility for the serious consequences would rest with the Kabul authorities,

I request to have this letter circulated as a document of the General Assembly, under agenda items 30, 72, 129, 133 and 136, end of the Security Council.
