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FINANCING OF THE UNITED NATIONS PEACE-KEEPING FORCES IN THE MIDDLE EAST: UNITED NATIONS DISENGAGEMENT OBSERVER FORCE

Report of the Fifth Committee

I. INTRODUCTION

1. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 23 September 1988, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include in the agenda of its forty-third session, and to allocate to the Fifth Committee, the item entitled:

"Financing of the United Nations peace-keeping forces in the Middle East:

- "(a) United Nations Disengagement Observer Force;
- "(b) United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon".
- 2. The Fifth Committee considered sub-item (a) of agenda item 124 at its 44th and 45th meetings, on 9 and 12 December 1988. It had before it the report of the Secretary-General on the financing of the United Nations Disengagement Observer Force (A/43/769) and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/43/941).

II. CONSIDERATION OF DRAFT RESOLUTION A/C.5/43/L.6

3. At the 44th meeting, on 9 December, the representative of Canada introduced a draft resolution (A/C.5/43/L.6), sponsored by Australia, Austria, Canada, Denmark, Fiji, Finland, Germany. Federal Republic of, Ghana, Ireland, Nepal, New Zealand, Norway and Sweden.

- 4. At its 45th meeting, on 12 December, the Committee adopted the draft resolution without a vote (see para. 6).
- 5. Statements and observations made in the course of the Committee's consideration of this ub-item are reflected in the relevant aummary records (see A/C.5/43/SR.44 and 45).

III. RECOMMENDATION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

6. The Fifth Committee rrcommrnda to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft roadution:

Financing of the United Nations Disengagement Observer Force

The General Assembly,

Having considered the report of the Secretary-General on the financing of the United Nation8 Disengagement Observer Force, 1/ as well as the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, 2/

Rearing in mind Sraurity Council roadution 350 (1974) of 31 May 1974, by which the Council • stablished the United Nations Disengagement Observar Force, and the subsequent resolutions by which tha Council • xtanded the mandate of the Force, the latest of which was roadution 624 (1988) of 30 November 1988,

Recalling its roadution 3211 B (XXIX) of 29 November 1974 on the financing of the United Nation8 Emergency Force and the United Nation8 Disengagement Observer Force and its subsequent readulationa thereon, the latrat of which was roadulation 42/70 A of 3 December 1987,

Reaffirming its previous decisions regarding the fact that, in order to moot the expenditure8 caused by such operations, a different procedure is required from that applied to meet expenditures of the regular budget of the United Nations.

Taking into account the fact that the economically more developed countries are in a Quaition to make relatively larger contribution8 and that the economically less developed countries have a relatively limited capacity to contribute towardr peace-keeping operation involving heavy expenditurea,

Bearing in mind the special responsibilities of the States permanent members of the Security Couaoil in the financing of such operations, as indicated in General Assembly resolution 1874 (S-IV) of 27 Juno 1963 and other resolutions of the Assembly,

Having regard to the financial position of the Special Account for the United Nation8 Emergency Force and the United Nation8 Disengagement Observer Force, an set forth in the report of the Secretary-General, 1/ and referring to paragraph 6 of the report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, 2/

Recalling its resolution 33/13 B of 14 December 1979 and the subsequent resolutions in which it decided that the provisions of regulations 5.2 (b), 5.2 (d), 4.3 and 4.4 of the Financial Regulations of the United Nations

hould be suspended, the latest of which was resolution 42/70 B of 3 December 1987,

<u>Mindful</u> of th8 fact that it is essential to provide the United Nation8 Disengagement Observer Force with the necessary financial resources to enable it to fulfil its responsibilities under the relevant resolutions of the Security Council,

<u>Concerned</u> that the Secretary-General continuer to face difficulties in mooting the obligations of the Forces on a current basin, particularly those due to the Governments of troop-acatributing States,

Recognizing that, in consequence of the withholding of contributiona by certain Member States, the surplus balances in the Special Aaaount for the United Nation8 Emergency Force and th8 United Nation8 Disengagement Observer Force have, in effect, bean drawn upon to the full • xtont to supplement the income received from aontributiona for meeting • speneer of the Forces,

Concerned that the application of the provisions of regulations 5.2 (b), 5.2 (d), 4.3 and 4.4 of the Financial Regulation8 of the United Nations would aggravate the already difficult financial situation of the Forces,

- 1. Decides to appropriate to the Special Account referred to in section II, paragraph 1, of General Assembly resolution 3211 B (XXIX) the amount of \$17,664,000 gross (\$17,358,000 not) uthorized and apportioned by section III of Assembly resolution 42/70 A for the operation of the United Nation8 Disengagement Observer Force for the period from 1 June to 30 November 1955, inclusive;
- 2. <u>Decides also</u> to appropriate to the **Special Account an amount** of \$18,114,000 for the operation of the United Nations Disengagement Observer Force for the period from 1 December 1955 to 31 May 1959, inclusive;
- 3. <u>Decides further</u>, an <u>an <u>ad hoc</u> arrangement, without prejudice to the positions of principle that may be taken by Member States in any consideration by the General Assembly of arrangements for the financing of peace-keeping</u>

operations, to apportion the amount of \$18,114,000 among Member States in aaaotdaaa8 with the scheme set Out in Assembly resolution 3101 (XXVIII) Of 11 December 1973 and the provisions Of section II, paragraph 2(b) and (g), and section V, paragraph 1, of resolution 3374 C (XXX) of 2 December 1975, section V, paragraph 1, of resolution 31/5 D Of 22 December 1976, section V, paragraph 1, Of resolution 32/4 C of 2 December 1977, section V, paragraph 1, of resolution 33/13 D of 5 December 1978, section V, paragraph 1, of resolution 34/7 C of 3 December 1979, section V, paragraph 1, of resolution 35/45 A of 1 December 1980, section V, paragraph 1, of resolution 36/66 A of 30 November 1981, section V, paragraph 1, of resolution 37/38 A of 30 November 1952 and section V, paragraphs 1 and 2, of resolution 39/28 A of 30 November 1984; the scale Of \bullet 88888118!1t8 for the year 1955 3/ shall be pplibd against a portion thereof, that is, \$3,019,000, being the amount pertaining on a pro rata basis to the period ending 31 December 1985, and the scale of assessments for the year 1989 4/ shall be Ooligd +nBt the balana8, that is, \$15,095,000, for the period thereafter;

- 4. Decides that there shall be set Off against the QQOrtiOMl@nt among Member Staten, an provided in paragraph 3 above, their respective share in the Stimatbd iaaom8 Of \$6,000 other than rtaff 88888lll8Utincome pptOV@dforthe period from 1 December 1958 to 31 May 1989, inclusive;
- 5. Decides that, in aaordana8 with the provisions of its resolution 973 (X) of 15 December 1965, there Shall be set off 1/0 (1) (1) the apportionment among Member States, am provided for in Qaragtaph 3 above, their respective share in the Tax Equalisation Fund Of the estimated staff assessment income Of \$330,000 a proved for the period from 1 December 1955 to 31 May 1959, inclusive;
- 6. Authorizes the Secretary-General to enter into commitments for the United Nations Disengagement Obs; rver Force at 8 rate not to exceed \$3,019,000 groam (\$2,963,000 net) par month for the period from 1 June to 30 November 1959, inclusive, ahould the Security Council decide to continue the Force beyond the period of nix months authorised under its resolution 624 (1988), the said amount to be apportioned among Member States in accordana8 with the scheme set Out in the present resolution;
- 7. Decides that the provisions of regulations 5.2 (b), 5.2 (d), 4.3 and 4.4 Of the Financial Regulations Of the United Nations shall be suspended in respect of the amount of \$2.413,235, which otherwise would have to be surrendered pursuant to those provisions, this amount to be entered into the account referred to in the operative part Of General Assembly resolution 33/13 E and held in suspense until a further decision is taken by the Assembly;
