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CONCLUSION OF EFFECTIVE INTERNATIONAL ARRANGEMENTS ON THE STRENGTHENING OF THE SECURITY OF NON-NUCLEAR-WEAPON STATES AGAINST THE USE OR THREAT OF USE OF NUCLEAR WEAPONS

Report of the First Committee

I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. The item entitled "Conclusion of effective international arrangements on the strengthening of the security of non-nuclear-weapon States against the use or threat of use of nuclear weapons" was included in the provisional agenda of the forty-fourth session in accordance with General Assembly resolution 43/68 of 7 December 1988.
- 2. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 22 September 1989, the General-Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include the item in its agenda and to allocate it to the First Committee.
- 3. At its 2nd meeting, on 13 October, the First Committee decided to hold a general debate on the disarmament items allocated to it, namely, items 49 to 69 and 151. The deliberations on those items took place between the 3rd and 25th meetings, from 16 October to 1 November (see A/C.1/44/PV.3-25). Consideration of and action on draft resolutions on those items took place between the 26th and 41st meetings, from 2 to 17 November (see A/C.1/44/PV.26-41).

II. CONSIDERATION OF DRAFT RESOLUTION A/C.1/44/L.23/Rev.1

- 5. On 20 October 1989, <u>Bulgaria</u> and <u>Nigeria</u> submitted **a** draft resolution, entitled "Conclusion of effective international arrangements on the strengthening of the security of non-nuclear-weapon States against the use or threat of use of nuclear weapons" (A/C.1/44/L.23).
- 6. On 7 November 1989, the **sponso**: **s** submitted a revised draft resolution (A/C.1/44/L.23/Rev.1), which was introduced **by** the representative of Bulgaria at the 30th meeting, on 7 November. The revised draft resolution contained the following change: in operative paragraph 2, the phrase "and giving consideration to any other proposals designed to secure the **same** objective" was added to the end of the paragraph.

7. At its 35th meeting, on 13 November, the Committee adopted draft resolution A/C.1/44/L.23/Rev.1 by a recorded vote of 113 to 1, with 20 abstentions (see para. 8). The voting was as follows, 2/

111. RECOMMENDATION OF THE FIRST COMMITTEE

8. The First Committee recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft resolution:

Conclusion of effective international arrangements on the strengthening of the security of non-nuclear-weapon States against the use or threat of use of nuclear weapons

The General Assembly,

Deeply concerned at the arms race, in particular the nuclear-arms race, and the possibility of the use or threat of use of nuclear weapons,

Convinced that nuclear disarmament and the complete elimination of nuclear weapons are essential to remove the danger of nuclear war,

<u>Considering</u> that, until complete nuclear <u>disarmament</u> is achieved on a universal basis, it is imperative for the international community to develop effective arrangements to ensure the security of non-nuclear-weapon States against the use or threat of use of nuclear weapons,

Taking note of the general desire to conclude effective international measures to that end at an early date,

<u>Taking note also</u> of the unilateral declarations on the security of non-nuclear-weapon States against the **use** or threat of use of nuclear weapons made by all nuclear-weapon States,

Desirous of promoting the implementation of paragraph 59 of the Final Document of the Tenth Special Session of the General Assembly, 3/ the first special session devoted to disarmament,

Recognizing that effactive measures of such security assurances to non-nuclear-weapon States would constitute an important contribution to the non-proliferation of nuclear weapons,

Aware of the in-depth negotiations on this subject in the Conference on Disarmament during the past ten years,

Recalling the relevant parts of the special report of the Committoo on Disarmament 4/ submitted to the General Assembly at its twelfth special session, 5/ the second special session devoted to disarmament, and of the special report of the Conference on Disarmament submitted to the Assembly at

its fifteenth **special session**, **6**/ the third special session devoted to disarmament, as well as of the annual report of the **Conjerence** on its **1989** session, **7**/

<u>Welcoming</u> the unanimous support **in** the Conference on Disarmament to continuing the search for a common approach **to** the substance of negative security assurances, which could be included in a legally binding instrument,

Recognizing the need **for a fresh** look at the issue, in particular **by the nuclear-weapon** States, in order to overcome the difficulties encountered at the negotiations in previous **years**,

Taking note of the proposals on this subject submitted to the Conference on Disarmament, 8/

- 1. Reaffirms the urgent need, pending the achievement of complete nuclear disarmament, to reach an early agreement on effective international arrangements to assure non-nuclear-weapon States against the use or threat of use of nuclear weaponst
- 2. Recommends that the Conference on Disarmament pursue intensive negotiations in its Ad Hoc Committee on Effective International Arrangements to Assure Non-Nuclear-Weapon States against the Use or Threat of Use of Nuclear Weapons at the beginning of its 1990 session, with a view to reaching such an agreement, taking into account the widespread support in the Conference for conclusion of an international convention and giving consideration to any other proposals designed to secure the same objective;
- 3. Appeals to all States, in particular the nuclear-weapon States, to demonstrate willingness and to exercise the flexibility necessary to reach agreement on a common approach to, including the possibility of a common formula in, an international instrument or instruments of a legally binding character, to assure the non-nuclear-weapon States against the use or threat of use of nuclear weapons;
- 4. <u>Decides</u> to include in the provisional agenda of its forty-fifth session the item entitled "Conclusion of effective international arrangements on the strengthening of the security of non-nuclear-weapon States against the use or threat of use of nuclear weapons".
