GENERAL AND COMPLETE DISARMAMENT

Prohibition of the development, production, stockpiling and use of radiological weapons

Report of the Secretary-General

1. On 15 December 1989, the General Assembly adopted resolution $44/116 \lambda$, the operative part of which reads as follows;

"The General Assembly,

"...

"1. <u>Reaffirms</u> that armed attacks of any kind against nuclear facilities are tastamount to the use of radiological weapons, owing to the dangerous radioactive forces that such attacks cause to be released;

"2. <u>Requests once again</u> the Conference on Disarmament to intensify further its efforts to reach, as early as possible, an agreement prohibiting armed attacks against nuclear facilities2

"3. <u>Requests</u> again the International Atomic Energy Agency to provide the Conference on Disarmament with the technical studies that could facilitate the conclusion of such an agreement;

"4. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to report to the General Assembly at its forty-fifth session on the progress made in the implementation of the present resolution. "
