Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine dated
27 August 1995 on the declaration by Ukraine of a
moratorium on the export of anti-personnel land-mines

Supporting resolution 49/75 D of 15 December 1994 of the United Nations General Assembly and taking into consideration that the declaration of a moratorium on the export of anti-personnel land-mines will substantially limit the spread of this type of weapon, which has an indiscriminate effect, the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine resolves:

To declare a four-year moratorium, with effect from 1 September 1995, on the export by Ukraine of anti-personnel land-mines of all types.
