Statement by the Presidency on behalf of the European Union on the accession of Argentina to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons

The European Union welcomes the fact that Argentina has deposited on 10 February its instrument of accession to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons as a non-nuclear-weapon State. This accession confirms Argentina's firm commitment to contribute towards international nuclear non-proliferation efforts, as already demonstrated by the quadripartite agreement concluded between Argentina, Brazil, the Brazilian-Argentine Agency for Accounting and Control of Nuclear Materials and the International Atomic Energy Agency, and the Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America (Treaty of Tlatelolco) ratified by Argentina on 18 January 1994.

The European Union takes this opportunity to underscore its belief in universal adherence to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons and calls upon States which have not yet done so to accede to the Treaty as non-nuclear-weapon States.

The Central and Eastern European countries associated with the Union align themselves with this statement.
