ANNEX

Statement issued on 10 June 1996 by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Kazakstan

It was with great concern that Kazakstan learned of the recent nuclear test at the Lop Nor test site in the Xinjiang-Uygur Autonomous Republic, which borders our State. Kazakstan has consistently advocated a nuclear-test ban and the signing of a treaty on the subject, and has also consistently held the view that China should make its contribution to the achievement of this goal, sought by all countries that desire to make the world safer by removing the nuclear threat.

In this regard, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Kazakstan welcomes the statement issued by the Chinese Ministry of Foreign Affairs that China has joined the moratorium on nuclear testing. This important step, which marks the cessation of testing by all the nuclear Powers, will undoubtedly create conditions conducive to the signing of a comprehensive nuclear-test-ban treaty and will ensure reliable conditions for the further harmonization of international relations.
