ANNEX

Letter dated 3 June 1997 from the Director General of International
Organizations and Conferences of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs
of Panama addressed to the Secretary-General

I have the honour to bring to your attention the concern expressed by the Government of the Republic of Panama regarding anti-personnel landmines and their adverse impact on the effective development of human rights and the necessary humanitarian actions.

Our Government, which respects the rules of international humanitarian law, acceded to the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects and to its Protocols I, II, III and IV.

In this connection, I should like to inform you that the Government of Panama does not import, export, manufacture, use or store anti-personnel landmines, and joins other members of the international community in supporting a total ban on anti-personnel landmines.
