ANNEX

Statement issued on 20 June 1997 by the Presidency of  
the European Union concerning the Congo (Brazzaville)

Deeply concerned at the situation in the Congo, the European Union calls on all parties to cease hostilities on a permanent basis and to work together for the restoration of civil peace and national reconciliation.

The European Union fully supports the mediation undertaken by President Omar Bongo of Gabon in cooperation with Mr. Mohamed Sahnoun, Special Representative of the Secretaries-General of the United Nations and the Organization of African Unity.

The European Union considers it essential for the future of the Congo that the democratic process that was to lead to the presidential election should be resumed without delay. It is prepared to support the electoral process and to recommend that the appropriate bodies respond to any requests for emergency humanitarian aid submitted to it by the Congolese authorities.
