ANNEX

Statement by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine  
issued at Kiev on 28 May 1998

It is the second time during the current month that the hopes of mankind for the non-nuclear world have been seriously challenged. Despite numerous appeals from the world community to refrain from taking steps in response to India's nuclear explosions, Pakistan has conducted its own nuclear tests. Therefore, the spirit of the Treaty on the Non-proliferation of Nuclear Weapons and the Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty has been violated, and a dangerous basis for further proliferation of nuclear weapons on the globe has been created.

As was the case with India, Ukraine condemns this step of Pakistan and calls upon both countries to observe restraint and responsibility in their bilateral relations that will meet the interests of preserving peace and stability in South Asia and in the whole world.

The actions of the two countries have also demonstrated the inefficiency of the existing non-proliferation control mechanisms and the pressing need for their urgent and cardinal improvement. In view of the emergency situation that exists in the South Asia region, Ukraine deems it necessary to consider, as a matter of urgency, the issue of convening a meeting of the United Nations Security Council.
