Communication from the press centre of the State secretariat of the security council of the Republic of Belarus

On 16 April 2000, an article was published in *The Sunday Telegraph* in which the Republic of Belarus was accused of military cooperation with Iraq, in violation of the United Nations arms embargo against that country. The article claims that Belarus intends to assist Iraq in upgrading air defence systems, re-equipping the air force, and providing air defence training for military specialists.

The press centre of the State secretariat of the security council is authorized to state that the allegations made in the newspaper are groundless. Belarus has not cooperated and is not cooperating with Iraq in the military sphere. It is regrettable that an authoritative organ like *The Sunday Telegraph* published false information, misleading the public and discrediting the peace-loving foreign policy of the Republic of Belarus, which has always strictly complied with the decisions of the United Nations and the provisions and principles of international law, and continues to do so.
