**Report of the Secretary-General on the work  
of the Organization****Corrigendum****Paragraph 54**

For the existing text, *substitute*

54. The search for a mutually acceptable solution between the parties in Western Sahara remained the focus of the United Nations efforts to overcome the multiple problems impeding implementation of the settlement plan. After meeting with officials of the Government of Morocco to determine if Morocco, as the administrative Power in Western Sahara, was prepared to offer or support some devolution of authority to the Territory that would be substantial and in keeping with international norms, my Personal Envoy presented a draft framework agreement on the status of Western Sahara to the Frente POLISARIO and to the Government of Algeria. In view of the adoption of resolution 1359 (2001) by the Security Council, the parties are expected to meet directly or through proximity talks under the auspices of my Personal Envoy to discuss the draft framework agreement and negotiate specific changes to the document, and to discuss any other proposal for a political solution that may be put forward by the parties, in order to arrive at a mutually acceptable agreement. The official proposals submitted by the Frente POLISARIO to overcome the obstacles to the implementation of the settlement plan will also be considered.
