## NOTE

The resolutions and decisions of the General Assembly are identified as follows:

### **Regular sessions**

Until the thirtieth regular session, the resolutions of the General Assembly were identified by an arabic numeral followed by a roman numeral in parentheses indicating the session (for example: resolution 3363 (XXX)). When several resolutions were adopted under the same number, each of them was identified by a capital letter placed between the two numerals (for example: resolution 3367 A (XXX), resolutions 3411 A and B (XXX), resolutions 3419 A to D (XXX)). The decisions were not numbered.

Since the thirty-first session, as part of the new system adopted for symbols of General Assembly documents, resolutions and decisions have been identified by an arabic numeral, indicating the session, followed by an oblique stroke and another arabic numeral (for example: resolution 31/1, decision 31/301). When several resolutions or decisions were adopted under the same number, each of them has been identified by a capital letter placed after the two numerals (for example: resolution 31/16 A, resolutions 31/6 A and B, decisions 31/406 A to E).

### **Special sessions**

Until the seventh special session, the resolutions of the General Assembly were identified by an arabic numeral followed, in parentheses, by the letter "S" and a roman numeral indicating the session (for example: resolution 3362 (S-VII)). The decisions were not numbered.

Since the eighth special session, resolutions and decisions have been identified by the letter "S" and an arabic numeral indicating the session, followed by an oblique stroke and another arabic numeral (for example: resolution S-8/1, decision S-8/11).

### **Emergency special sessions**

Until the fifth emergency special session, the resolutions of the General Assembly were identified by an arabic numeral followed, in parentheses, by the letters "ES" and a roman numeral indicating the session (for example: resolution 2252 (ES-V)). The decisions were not numbered.

Since the sixth emergency special session, resolutions and decisions have been identified by the letters "ES" and an arabic numeral indicating the session, followed by an oblique stroke and another arabic numeral (for example: resolution ES-6/1, decision ES-6/11).

In each of the series described above, the numbering follows the order of adoption.

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The present volume contains the decisions adopted by the General Assembly from 10 September to 20 December 2002. Resolutions adopted by the Assembly during that period appear in volume I, together with information on the allocation of agenda items. Resolutions and decisions adopted subsequently during the fifty-seventh session will be published in volume III.



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# Decisions

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## A. Elections and appointments<sup>1</sup>

### 57/401. Appointment of the members of the Credentials Committee

At its 1st plenary meeting, on 10 September 2002, the General Assembly, in accordance with rule 28 of its rules of procedure, appointed a Credentials Committee for its fifty-seventh session consisting of the following Member States: ARGENTINA, BARBADOS, BELGIUM, CHINA, MALL, NAMIBIA, PAPUA NEW GUINEA, RUSSIAN FEDERATION and UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

### 57/402. Election of five non-permanent members of the Security Council

At its 20th plenary meeting, on 27th September 2002, the General Assembly, in accordance with Article 23 of the Charter of the United Nations and rule 142 of the rules of procedure of the Assembly, elected ANGOLA, CHILE, GERMANY, PAKISTAN and SPAIN as non-permanent members of the Security Council for a two-year term of office beginning on 1 January 2003 to fill the vacancies occurring on the expiration of the terms of office of COLOMBIA, IRELAND, MAURITIUS, NORWAY and SINGAPORE.

Koroma (Sierra Leone), Mr. Shigeru Oda (Japan) and Mr. Shi Jiuyong (China). The following persons were elected: Mr. Abdul G. **57/525. Military activities and arrangements by colonial Powers in Territories under their administration**

At its 73rd plenary meeting, on 11 December 2002, the General Assembly, by a recorded vote of 106 to 53, with 1 abstention,<sup>37</sup> and on the recommendation of the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee),<sup>38</sup> adopted the following text:

“1. The General Assembly, having considered the chapter of the report of the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples relating to an item on the agenda of the Special Committee entitled ‘Military activities and arrangements by colonial Powers in Territories under their administration’,<sup>39</sup> and recalling its resolution 1514 (XV) of 14 December 1960 and all other relevant resolutions and decisions of the United Nations relating to military activities in colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories, reaffirms its strong conviction that military bases and installations in the Territories concerned could constitute an obstacle to the exercise by the people of those Territories of their right to self-determination, and reiterates its strong views that existing bases and installations, which are impeding the implementation of

the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples, should be withdrawn.

“2. Aware of the presence of such bases and installations in some of those Territories, the General Assembly urges the administering Powers concerned to continue to take all necessary measures not to involve those Territories in any offensive acts or interference against other States.

“3. The General Assembly reiterates its concern that military activities and arrangements by colonial Powers in Territories under their administration might run counter to the rights and interests of the colonial peoples concerned, especially their right to self-determination and independence. The Assembly once again calls upon the administering Powers concerned to terminate such activities and to eliminate such military bases in compliance with its relevant resolutions. Alternative sources of livelihood for the peoples of the Non-Self-Governing Territories should be provided.

“4. The General Assembly reiterates that the colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories and areas adjacent thereto should not be used for nuclear testing, dumping of nuclear wastes or deployment of nuclear and other weapons of mass destruction.

“5. The General Assembly deplores the continued alienation of land in colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories, particularly in the small island Territories of the Pacific and Caribbean regions, for military installations. The large-scale utilization of the local resources for this purpose could adversely affect the economic development of the Territories concerned.

“6. The General Assembly takes note of the decision of some of the administering Powers to close or downsize some of those military bases in the Non-Self-Governing Territories.

“7. The General Assembly requests the Secretary-General to continue to inform world public opinion of those military activities and arrangements in colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories which constitute an obstacle to the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples.

“8. The General Assembly requests the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples to continue to examine this question and to report thereon to the Assembly at its fifty-eighth session.”

#### **57/526. Question of Gibraltar**

‘The establishment of a negotiating process aimed at overcoming all the differences between them over Gibraltar and at promoting cooperation on a mutually beneficial basis on economic, cultural, touristic, aviation, military and environmental matters. Both sides accept that the issues of sovereignty will be discussed in that process. The British Government will fully maintain its commitment to honour the wishes of the people of Gibraltar as set out in the preamble of the 1969 Constitution’,

takes note of the fact that, as part of this process, the Ministers for Foreign Affairs of Spain and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland hold annual meetings alternately in each country, the most recent of which were held at Barcelona on 20 November 2001 and in London on 4 February 2002, and urges both Governments to continue their negotiations with the object of reaching a definitive solution to the problem of Gibraltar in the light of relevant resolutions of the General Assembly and in the spirit of the Charter of the United Nations.”

## Annex I

### Organization of work of the Third Committee

#### A. Guidelines concerning time limits of statements

1. In accordance with rule 106 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly and paragraph 22 of Assembly decision 34/401 on the rationalization of the procedures and organization of the Assembly, at the beginning of each session the Chairman of the Third Committee should propose to the Committee the limitation of the time to be allowed to speakers.

2. Further to General Assembly resolutions 45/175 of 18 December 1990 and 46/140 of 17 December 1991, on the rationalization of the work of the Third Committee, statements made by delegations and by Secretariat officials, unless decided otherwise by the Committee at the beginning of the session, should not exceed seven minutes. Statements made on behalf of a group of delegations or made in connection with the sub-items of the agenda item on human rights questions should not exceed fifteen minutes. These time limits will be applied with a degree of flexibility towards all speakers. With a view to saving time, all speakers are encouraged to exercise self-discipline, in particular delegations associated with group statements. For practical reasons, group statements are encouraged for the first day of the discussion of an item or a sub-item. In this connection, it is important to emphasize the timely distribution of documentation in accordance with the rules of procedure of the Assembly, in order to enable delegations to inscribe themselves on the list of speakers at an early stage.

#### B. Draft resolutions on reports of treaty bodies and reports of the Secretary-General on the status of the treaties

3. Reports of all treaty bodies will be submitted to the General Assembly in accordance with the respective legislative mandates of those bodies. Substantive resolutions on those reports should be adopted biennially, in accordance with the programme of work of the Third Committee. It is recommended that, where possible, draft resolutions on the status of the treaties not be submitted separately but be incorporated in the draft resolution relating to the report of the treaty body. In alternate years, the Committee should simply take note of the reports unless more substantive action is deemed appropriate.

#### C. Proposals emanating from subsidiary organs of the Economic and Social Council

4. In transmitting proposals to the General Assembly, the Economic and Social Council should, to the extent possible, bear in mind the programme of work of the Third Committee.

#### D. Programme of work

5. An informal meeting of the Third Committee should be held immediately after the election of the members of its Bureau in order to consider the programme of work of the Committee based on a draft to be prepared by the Secretariat and to consider other organizational aspects relating to the work of the Committee, especially the status of documentation.

6. The items allocated to the Third Committee for consideration during the fifty-eighth session of the General Assembly should be taken up in the following order:

- Item 2. Implementation of the outcome of the World Summit for Social Development and of the twenty-fourth special session of the General Assembly
- Item 3. Social development, including questions relating to the world social situation and to youth, ageing, disabled persons and the family
- Item 4. Follow-up to the International Year of Older Persons: Second World Assembly on Ageing
- Item 5. Crime prevention and criminal justice
- Item 6. International drug control
- Item 7. Advancement of women
- Item 8. Implementation of the outcome of the Fourth World Conference on Women and of the twenty-third special session of the General Assembly, entitled “Women 2000: gender equality, development and peace for the twenty-first century”
- Item 9. Report of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, questions relating to refugees, returnees and displaced persons and humanitarian questions
- Item 10. Promotion and protection of the rights of children

**57/580. Future operation of the International Research and Training Institute for the Advancement of Women**

At its 78th plenary meeting, on 20 December 2002, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the Fifth Committee,<sup>130</sup> having considered the statement submitted by the Secretary-General<sup>169</sup> on the programme budget implications of draft resolution A/C.3/57/L.16/Rev.1 on the future operation of the International Research and Training Institute for the Advancement of Women and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions:<sup>170</sup>

(a) Noted that the adoption of the draft resolution would give rise to additional requirements of 500,000 United States dollars under section 9, Economic and social affairs, of the programme budget for the biennium 2002–2003,<sup>171</sup> and also noted that, under the procedures established by the Assembly in its resolutions 41/213 of 19 December 1986 and 42/211 of 21 December 1987, this provision would represent a charge against the contingency fund;

(b) Approved, in the context of the consolidated statement of programme budget implications, a charge in the amount of 250,000 dollars against the contingency fund to finance core activities of the Institute, defined as the salaries and common staff costs of the four Professional posts currently in the staffing table;

(c) Decided that an amount of 250,000 dollars would be set aside in the contingency fund for the biennium 2002–2003, as an additional provision to the Institute for core activities in 2003, which brings the total amount to 500,000 dollars, pending firm pledges and/or payments of voluntary contributions necessary for the viable operations of the Institute;

(d) Requested the Secretary-General to report to the Assembly, through the Fifth Committee, before the end of its resumed fifty-seventh session, on the financial situation of the Institute, including the status of voluntary contributions to meet the resource requirements necessary to ensure its viability and to consider the additional charge against the contingency fund referred to in subparagraph (c) above;

(e) Noted that the statement on programme budget implications submitted by the Secretary-General<sup>169</sup> was based on the recommendations of the Working Group on the Future Operation of the International Research and Training Institute for the Advancement of Women,<sup>172</sup>

Secretary-General<sup>178</sup> on the programme budget implications of draft resolution A/C.2/57/L.62 on ensuring effective secretariat support for sustained follow-up to the outcome of the International Conference on Financing for Development and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions,<sup>179</sup> endorsed the recommendations of the Advisory Committee, and noted that the adoption of the draft resolution would give rise to additional requirements of up to 95,500 United States dollars under section 9, Economic and social affairs, 85,700 dollars under section 27, Management and central support services, and a related amount of 22,000 dollars under section 32, Staff assessment, offset by an amount of 22,000 dollars under income section 1, Income from staff assessment, of the programme budget for the biennium 2002–2003.<sup>171</sup>

**57/584. Revised estimates resulting from resolutions and decisions adopted by the Economic and Social Council at its substantive session of 2002**

At its 78th plenary meeting, on 20 December 2002, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the Fifth Committee,<sup>130</sup> having considered the report of the Secretary-General on the revised estimates resulting from resolutions and decisions adopted by the Economic and Social Council at its substantive session of 2002<sup>180</sup> and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions,<sup>181</sup> endorsed the recommendation of the Secretary-General:

(a) To approve the provision of 44,700 United States dollars in additional appropriations under section 22, Human rights, of the programme budget for the biennium 2002–2003<sup>171</sup> as a charge against the contingency fund for financing activities in respect of Council decision 2002/285 of 25 July 2002;

(b) To invite the Council to review its decision 2002/281 of 25 July 2002 with a view to ensuring that additional meetings of the Commission on Human Rights are not required in connection with its fifty-ninth session;

(c) To request the Secretary-General to provide such conference services as might be required consequent to Council decision 2002/257 of 25 July 2002 and decision 2002/281, as reviewed, and to report to the General Assembly at its fifty-

eighth session on the related expenditures in the context of the second performance report on the programme budget for the biennium 2002–2003.

**7. Decisions adopted on the reports of the Sixth Committee**

**57/512. International convention against the reproductive cloning of human beings**

At its 52nd plenary meeting, on 19 November 2002, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the Sixth Committee:<sup>182</sup>

(a) Welcomed the report of the Ad Hoc Committee on an International Convention against the Reproductive Cloning of Human Beings on its work from 25 February to 1 March 2002<sup>183</sup> and the report of the Working Group of the Sixth Committee established pursuant to General Assembly resolution 56/93 of 12 December 2001 on its work from 23 to 27 September 2002;<sup>184</sup>

(b) Decided that a working group of the Sixth Committee shall be convened during the fifty-eighth session of the General Assembly from 29 September to 3 October 2003 in order to continue the work undertaken during the fifty-seventh session;

(c) Decided also to include in the provisional agenda of its fifty-eighth session the item entitled “International convention against the reproductive cloning of human beings”.

**57/513. Observer status for the International Institute for Democracy and Electoral Assistance in the General Assembly**

At its 52nd plenary meeting, on 19 November 2002, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the Sixth Committee,<sup>185</sup> decided to defer further consideration of and a decision on the request for observer status for the International Institute for Democracy and Electoral Assistance<sup>186</sup> in the General Assembly until its fifty-eighth session.
