

# Admission of the International Criminal Court to membership in the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund

## **Report of the Fifth Committee**

#### I. Introduction

- 1. At its 28th plenary meeting, on 13 October 2003, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include in the agenda of its fifty-eighth session the item entitled "Admission of the International Criminal Court to membership in the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund" and to allocate it to the Fifth Committee.
- 2. The Fifth Committee considered the item at its 16th and 22nd meetings, on 5 and 26 November 2003. Statements and observations made in the course of the Committee's consideration of the item are reflected in the relevant summary records (A/C.5/58/SR.16 and 22).
- 3. For its consideration of the item, the Committee had before it a note by the Secretary-General on the admission of the International Criminal Court to membership in the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund (A/C.5/58/13) and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/58/545).

### II. Consideration of draft resolution A/C.5/58/L.15

- 4. At the 22nd meeting, on 26 November, the representative of Argentina, coordinator of the informal consultations on this item, introduced, on behalf of the Chairman, a draft resolution entitled "Admission of the International Criminal Court to membership in the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund" (A/C.5/58/L.15).
- 5. At the same meeting, the Committee adopted draft resolution A/C.5/58/L.15 without a vote (see para. 6).

### III. Recommendation of the Fifth Committee

6. The Fifth Committee recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft resolution:

## Admission of the International Criminal Court to membership in the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund

The General Assembly,

Having considered the note by the Secretary-General on the admission of the International Criminal Court to membership in the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund<sup>1</sup> and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions,<sup>2</sup>

*Decides* to admit the International Criminal Court to membership in the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund, in accordance with article 3 of the Regulations of the Fund, with effect from 1 January 2004.
