Over the years, the United Nations efforts to promote gender mainstreaming have resulted in an increase in female candidates nominated for the programme and, subsequently, in the number of fellowships granted to them. In the biennium 2005-2006, 24 fellowships were granted to women compared to 19 in the biennium 2003-2004 and 13 in the biennium 2001-2002.
