

	8 December 2005	Mexico co-sponsored resolution 60/95 entitled "Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty", adopted by the <b>General Assembly</b>	
	August 2005-May 2006	Mexico regularly participated in the meetings of the <b>Preparatory Commission for the</b> <b>Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty</b> <b>Organization</b> and its <b>subsidiary bodies</b> as well as in <b>consultations</b> aimed at promoting the Treaty's entry into force and the completion and full operation of the verification regime	
	August 2005-May 2006	Mexico contributed to the activities of the <b>International Monitoring System</b> with five monitoring stations (1 hydroacoustic, 1 radionuclide and 3 seismological stations). Four of these are now certified and fully operational
