

Repertory of Practice of United Nations Organs and the Repertoire of the Practice of the Security Council

Report of the Secretary-General

Summary

In conformity with General Assembly resolution 61/38 of 4 December 2006, the present report outlines the progress made by the Secretariat in 2006 and 2007 in updating the *Repertory of Practice of United Nations Organs* and the *Repertoire of the Practice of the Security Council*. The Assembly is invited, in paragraphs 13 and 22 of the present report, to take action in the light of the conclusions drawn in sections II.H and III.E of the present report.

I. Introduction

The present report has been prepared pursuant to General Assembly resolution 61/38 of 4 December 2006. In paragraph 9 of the resolution, the Assembly commended the Secretary-General for the progress made in the preparation of studies of the Repertory of Practice of United Nations Organs, including the increased use of the internship programme and the wider cooperation with academic institutions for this purpose, as well as the progress made towards updating the Repertoire of the Practice of the Security Council. In paragraphs 10 and 11, it called upon the Secretary-General to continue his efforts in updating the Repertory and the Repertoire; reiterated the responsibility of the Secretary-General for the quality of the two publications and, with regard to the Repertoire, requested him to continue to follow the modalities outlined in paragraphs 102 to 106 of his report of 18 September 1952 (A/2170). In paragraphs 12 and 13, the Assembly recognized the desirability of making available electronically the Repertory and the Repertoire in all their respective language versions; and reiterated its call for voluntary contributions to the trust fund for the updating of the Repertoire, as well as the trust fund for the elimination of the backlog of the Repertory and the sponsoring, on a voluntary basis, and at no cost to the United Nations, of associate experts to assist in the updating of the two publications. Finally, in paragraph 14, the Assembly requested the Secretary-General to submit a report on both the Repertory and the Repertoire to the Assembly at its sixty-second session.

II. Repertory of Practice of United Nations Organs

A. Preparation of Supplements to the Repertory of Practice of United Nations Organs

- 2. In 2007, the Secretariat finalized and submitted for translation and publication volume I of Supplement No. 9 (1995-1999). Consequently, in respect of volume I, Supplements Nos. 1 to 9 have been brought to completion and made available on the website of the *Repertory* (www.un.org/law/repertory). In respect of volume V, Supplements Nos. 8 and 9 are near completion; seven other volumes are in different stages of preparation. In particular, during the period under review, in addition to volume V, work also progressed with respect to volume II of Supplements Nos. 7, 8 and 9 and volume IV of Supplements Nos. 8 and 9. As a means of addressing the backlog on volume III of Supplements Nos. 7, 8 and 9 (1985-1999), Articles have been identified for which studies of the *Repertoire* and the *Repertory* overlap. In such cases, in accordance with a decision taken by the Interdepartmental Committee on Charter Repertory, cross-references have been provided to the studies of the *Repertoire*, where appropriate. Furthermore, volume II of Supplement No. 6, which has been available on the Internet for some time, has been issued in hard copy.
- 3. The Secretariat continued to make available on the Internet advance versions of several studies pertaining to individual Articles of the Charter of the United Nations which have been finalized and are awaiting completion of the respective volumes.
- 4. The current status of the publication (original *Repertory* and supplements thereto), which should consist as a whole of 50 volumes (1946-2005), is as follows:

- 28 volumes have been published, and four volumes have been finalized and submitted for publication. Consequently, the work to be completed comprises 18 volumes, 9 of which are in different stages of preparation.
- 5. Annex I sets out the responsibilities of individual Secretariat units for the preparation of *Repertory* studies on individual Articles of the Charter. Annex II provides information on the status of the *Repertory*.

B. Availability of *Repertory* studies on the Internet

- 6. Studies from 32 complete volumes, including the 4 volumes in processing for publication, as well as studies on individual Articles of the Charter from 9 volumes not yet complete, are accessible to users on the United Nations website for the *Repertory*. The electronic version of the *Repertory* has proven indispensable in reducing the backlog in the *Repertory* by making individual studies available before the issuance of the respective Supplement volumes. In addition, the Secretariat has added a full-text search feature to the website giving the user the opportunity to search all the studies instantaneously for any word or combination of words, which will enhance the value of the *Repertory* as a research tool. The search engine is available in the three languages of the publication, namely English, French and Spanish.
- 7. Currently, all studies available in English are on the Internet, while a number of them are also available in French and Spanish. Pursuant to the General Assembly's request that all versions of the *Repertory* be made available electronically, a large number of additional studies in French and Spanish have been placed on the Internet since my previous report (A/61/153) was issued in 2006. Furthermore, a number of studies that have been done in cooperation with academia have been prepared in French. The Secretariat will continue to make available electronically all three language versions of completed *Repertory* studies.

C. Publication of volumes in language versions

8. The French version of volume II of Supplement No. 6 has been published. Volume III of Supplement No. 6 and volumes V and VI of Supplement No. 7 have been published in French and Spanish.

D. Cooperation with academic institutions

9. The well-established cooperation with Columbia University Law School continued for the fourth consecutive year; seven students contributed to the preparation of studies incorporated in volume V of Supplement No. 8. Furthermore, the collaboration project established with French-speaking academic institutions (University of Paris X — Nanterre, University of Paris I — Sorbonne, University of Paris II — Assas, University of Nice, University of Aix-Marseille III, Free

University of Brussels and University of Geneva) to carry out research for the preparation of studies on certain Articles has given its first results and advance versions of such studies have been placed on the Internet, in French, after their review by the Secretariat. These studies pertain to volume IV of Supplements Nos. 8 and 9 and volume II of Supplement No. 7. Furthermore, several other studies are currently under preparation, corresponding to volume II of Supplements Nos. 7, 8 and 9 and volume IV of Supplements Nos. 8 and 9. These studies are expected to be completed in the coming months.

E. Trust fund

10. In resolution 61/38, the General Assembly reiterated its call for voluntary contributions to the trust fund established pursuant to resolution 59/44 of 2 December 2004 to eliminate the backlog in the *Repertory*. Accordingly, a note verbale was sent to all Permanent Missions to the United Nations reminding them of the possibility to make voluntary contributions to the trust fund and requesting them to bring the question of funding for the *Repertory* to the attention of private institutions and individuals who might be able to assist in that regard. The Secretary-General welcomes the donation of \$30,000 received from Greece, the first Member State to make a contribution to the trust fund.

F. Special Committee on the Charter of the United Nations and on the Strengthening of the Role of the Organization

11. The Special Committee on the Charter of the United Nations and on the Strengthening of the Role of the Organization considered the item on the *Repertory* and the *Repertoire* at its 2007 session, held from 7 to 15 February. In its report,³ the Special Committee recommended, inter alia, with respect to the *Repertory*, that the General Assembly commend the Secretary-General for the progress made in the preparation of studies, including the increased use of the internship programme of the United Nations and the further expanded cooperation with academic institutions; that it reiterate its call for voluntary contributions to the trust fund for the elimination of the backlog in the *Repertory*, and the sponsoring, on a voluntary basis, and with no cost to the United Nations, of associate experts to assist in the updating of the publication; that it call upon the Secretary-General to continue his efforts towards updating the publication and making it available electronically in all its language versions; and that it reiterate the responsibility of the Secretary-General for the quality of the *Repertory*.

G. Interdepartmental Committee on Charter Repertory

12. The Interdepartmental Committee on Charter *Repertory* noted the progress made in the preparation of studies of the *Repertory* and the innovative ways used to address the backlog, including the use of interns and externs and the cooperation undertaken with several French-speaking academic institutions. As a means of addressing the backlog in volume III, it was decided to examine whether it would be

possible to identify "overlapping" studies of the *Repertoire* and the *Repertory* in order to make cross-references in the *Repertory* to the relevant volumes of the *Repertoire*, where appropriate. Finally, the Committee decided that Supplement No. 10 would cover the six-year period from 2000 to 2005.

H. Conclusions

- 13. With respect to the *Repertory*, in the light of the above, the General Assembly may wish:
- (a) To note the current status of the publication, including the progress made in the preparation of *Repertory* studies and in their posting on the Internet in three languages (English, French and Spanish);
- (b) To consider the recommendation of the Special Committee (see para. 11 above) concerning the increased use of the internship programme of the United Nations and the further expanded cooperation with academic institutions for the preparation of studies; voluntary contributions to the trust fund for the elimination of the backlog in the *Repertory*; the sponsoring, on a voluntary basis, and with no cost to the United Nations, of associate experts to assist in the updating of the publication; the call upon the Secretary-General to continue his efforts towards updating the publication; the desirability of making the *Repertory* available electronically in all its language versions; and the reiteration of the Secretary-General's responsibility for the quality of the *Repertory*;
- (c) To express appreciation for the first contribution received to the trust fund for the elimination of the backlog in the *Repertory*.

III. Repertoire of the Practice of the Security Council

A. Mandate and preparation

- 14. The Repertoire of the Practice of the Security Council, originally mandated by the General Assembly in its resolution 686 (VII) of 5 December 1952, continues to provide a record of the evolving practice and procedure of the Security Council in the framework of the Charter of the United Nations and the Council's provisional rules of procedure. Within the limits of the resources available to it, the Secretariat has directed its efforts at producing the Repertoire in the most expeditious manner consistent with accuracy and balance, taking advantage of growing technological possibilities.
- 15. The Secretariat has continued to implement the "two-track" approach, most recently endorsed by the General Assembly in resolution 61/38. This approach has enabled the Secretariat to focus on the Security Council's contemporary practice, in which Member States have expressed the most interest, while concurrently ensuring progress in coverage of the Council's earlier practice. The two-track approach has also included efforts to capture the evolving practice of the Council within the context of the modalities outlined in paragraphs 102 to 106 of the Secretary-General's report of 18 September 1952 (A/2170).

- 16. With regard to the Council's past practice, publication of the eleventh Supplement to the *Repertoire*, covering the period from 1989 to 1992, is scheduled for the end of 2007. The twelfth Supplement, covering the period from 1993 to 1995, has also been brought to completion and is expected to be published in early 2008. In the meantime, all chapters of this Supplement have been made available on the website in their advance versions. Work on the thirteenth Supplement, covering the remaining four-year period to the end of the decade (1996-1999), is progressing. Most chapters of this volume dealing with the procedural as well as constitutional aspects of the Council's practice will be posted in an advance version by the end of 2007.
- 17. As for the coverage of the Council's contemporary practice, work on the millennium volume (fourteenth Supplement), covering the period from 2000 to 2003, is proceeding apace. The procedural chapters of this volume have been posted in an advance version and the chapters dealing with the constitutional aspects of the Council's practice are expected to be posted in an advance version by the end of 2007.
- 18. The Secretariat has initiated work on the fifteenth Supplement, covering a two-year period (2004-2005). The progress on this Supplement will depend, however, on completion of the thirteenth and the fourteenth Supplements as well as the availability of resources, which is considered further below.

B. Publication in language versions (print and electronic)

19. By General Assembly resolution 55/222, the Secretariat was mandated to publish the *Repertoire* in all six official languages starting in 2000. In addition to carrying out this mandate, the Secretariat has made the *Repertoire* available on all language versions of the United Nations website,⁴ with the most recently published Supplement (covering the period from 1985 to 1988) posted in all six languages. In a major effort to further increase language availability, and in response to General Assembly resolution 61/38, the Secretariat has digitalized and posted the original and subsequent nine Supplements of the French-language *Repertoire*, previously available only on a limited basis in hard copy.

C. Advance publication

20. To allow access to information as quickly as possible, the Secretariat has posted on the website finalized chapters of the *Repertoire* in an advance version. All chapters of the eleventh and twelfth Supplements and individual chapters of the thirteenth and fourteenth Supplements are accessible on the website (see annex III to the present report).

D. Resources

21. The preparation and production of the *Repertoire* would not have been possible without the continued support of the General Assembly. Research assistance from interns has also served as an important resource for the work on the *Repertoire*. Voluntary contributions to the trust fund for the updating of the *Repertoire* remain an important element for sustaining progress in a situation of financial constraint. Since the last report (A/61/153), in response to an appeal letter dated 13 December 2006 sent to Member States on behalf of the Secretary-General, contributions to the trust fund have been received from Albania, Angola, Greece, Ireland, Turkey, the Republic of Korea, the Russian Federation and the United Kingdom. In addition, Germany and Italy have continued to contribute by sponsoring two associate expert positions in the relevant branch of the Secretariat. The infusion of these resources has enabled the Secretariat to achieve concrete progress in bringing the *Repertoire* much closer to the goal of being up to date. The challenge, however, remains to be fully met. Member States are therefore encouraged to continue supporting the *Repertoire* in concrete ways.

E. Conclusions

- 22. With respect to the *Repertoire of the Practice of the Security Council*, in the light of the above, the General Assembly may wish:
 - (a) To note the progress made towards the updating of the Repertoire;
- (b) To note the attainment of posting the *Repertoire* in electronic form in all language versions on the United Nations website;
- (c) To note with appreciation the digitalization and electronic posting of all previously published French-language versions of the *Repertoire*;
- (d) To reiterate its call for voluntary contributions to the trust fund for the updating of the *Repertoire*, and note with appreciation the contributions made by the Governments of Albania, Angola, Greece, Ireland, Turkey, the Republic of Korea, the Russian Federation and the United Kingdom during the past year;
- (e) To note with appreciation the support which Germany and Italy have extended by sponsoring, on a voluntary basis, associate experts to assist in the updating of the *Repertoire*, and encourage other Member States in a position to do so to consider providing such assistance.
