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Report of the Secretary-General

Summary

The present report has been prepared in accordance with paragraph 5 (d) of the annex to General Assembly resolution 58/316. It contains the draft programme of work of the plenary for the sixty-fourth session of the General Assembly. The draft programmes of work of five of the six Main Committees of the Assembly, which were adopted by the Assembly during the main part of its sixty-third session, can be found in the respective decisions of the Assembly. The status of documentation will be issued as an addendum to the present report.

I. Introduction

1. The General Assembly, in paragraph 5 (d) of the annex to its resolution 58/316, entitled "Further measures for the revitalization of the work of the General Assembly", decided that in July of each year the General Committee should conduct a review of the proposed programme of work for the forthcoming session of the Assembly, on the basis of a report submitted by the Secretary-General, and should also submit recommendations on the matter to the Assembly at its forthcoming session. The report should include information on the status of documentation to be issued during the forthcoming session.
2. The present report has been prepared in response to that request.
3. The draft programmes of work of the Main Committees, with the exception of the Fifth Committee,¹ have been approved by the respective Committees and were adopted by the General Assembly in the following decisions: First Committee (decision 63/521 of 2 December 2008); Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee) (decision 63/527 of 5 December 2008); Second Committee (decision 63/545 of 19 December 2008); Third Committee (decision 63/537 of 18 December 2008); and Sixth Committee (decision 63/529 of 11 December 2008).
4. To assist the General Committee and the General Assembly in their efforts to maximize both effectiveness and efficiency, this report contains only the draft programme of work of the plenary for the sixty-fourth session of the General Assembly. The details of the draft programmes of the Main Committees are available in the respective decisions.
5. The status of documentation will be issued as an addendum to the present report.
