- 20.1 The overall purpose of the programme is to promote the economic and social development of Latin America and the Caribbean through interactive cooperation with member States, by undertaking a comprehensive analysis of the development process and providing the relevant operational services.
- 20.2 The mandate for the programme, which falls within the purview of the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC), derives from Economic and Social Council resolution 106 (VI), by which the Council established the Commission for the purpose of contributing to and coordinating action towards the economic development of the region and reinforcing economic relationships among the countries of the region as well as worldwide. In 1996 it was decided, in its resolution 553 (XXVI), that the Commission would, inter alia, collaborate with member States in analysing the development process of formulating, evaluating and monitoring public policies to provide operational services on specialized information, advisory services, training and support in regional and international cooperation.
- 20.3 ECLAC will continue to pursue key objectives shared by all the regional commissions, to foster economic integration at the subregional and regional levels, to promote implementation of internationally agreed development goals, including the Millennium Development Goals and to support sustainable development by helping to bridge economic, social and environmental gaps between its member countries and subregions. To achieve those objectives, the Commission will continue conducting multilateral dialogue, sharing knowledge and networking at the regional level, and will promote intraregional and interregional cooperation between regional commissions and through collaboration with other regional organizations.
- 20.4 The Commission's overall strategy for achieving the objectives of the programme is structured around 12 interdependent and complementary subprogrammes implemented through an integrated and multidisciplinary approach. In formulating the present strategic framework, the basic guidelines and overarching orientation for the work to be undertaken in the biennium 2010-2011 were drawn from the internationally agreed development goals stemming from the major United Nations conferences and summits in the economic and social fields, including those set forth in the United Nations Millennium Declaration and the 2005 World Summit Outcome.

- 20.5 The economic and social performance of Latin America and the Caribbean since 2003 has been encouraging as the region enjoyed expansion resulting mainly from favourable conditions in the world economy. The region has achieved significant improvements in reducing its external vulnerability as a result of sound macroeconomic policies and progress in the social sphere, particularly in reducing poverty levels as well as the levels and quality of employment. The region recorded an increase in per capita gross domestic product of 16 per cent, while simultaneously maintaining a current-account surplus in the balance of payments. Sustaining those positive features will largely depend on a favourable and lasting international environment and on how the region addresses emerging challenges in its development processes.
- 20.6 In the context of globalization, the region has been unable to benefit fully from the opportunities offered by competitive integration with the international economy. The region has strongly felt the effects of the existing inequalities and risk owing to, inter alia, the limited progress achieved in the multilateral trade negotiations and the international economic order. The region still faces the challenge of transforming current growth into long-term assets to enhance its position in the world markets. Success will largely depend on how efficiently the countries can enhance their capabilities to forge public-private partnerships in implementing productive development strategies.
- 20.7 Although the region has recorded improvements in social spending, life expectancy, infant mortality and gender equity in education, it remains the world's least equitable in terms of the distribution of income and wealth. Poverty still affects on average 35 per cent of the population, and social vulnerabilities represent causes of the significant internal and international migratory flows affecting the region's growth. Such problems continue to erode social cohesion, generate tension within countries and accentuate the fragility of democracies and their institutions.
- 20.8 The region remains vulnerable to natural disasters and the impact of climate change, especially in the Caribbean Rim and the Central American subregion, and it is facing challenges relating to the deterioration of its natural resources and biodiversity.
- 20.9 The basic development challenges facing the region in the medium and long term could be summarized as the need to deepen the progress made in poverty reduction; to sustain the improvements achieved in the macroeconomic sphere while stepping up advances through counter-cyclical policies to avoid excessive exchange rate appreciation and fiscal vulnerabilities; to create an enabling environment that will boost investment opportunities; to enhance its global position and foster productive diversification; to strengthen social cohesion; and to broaden and increase the scale and efficiency of social spending to invest in human capital formation. To meet those challenges, the Commission will focus the programme of work in the biennium 2010-2011 on the following priorities:
- (a) Consolidating the progress achieved in macroeconomic stability and further enhancing policies that reduce vulnerability;
 - (b) Increasing the region's productive potential and reducing productivity gaps;
 - (c) Improving the region's position in the international economy and fostering long-term productive development strategies with the appropriate forms of public-private partnerships and participation;
 - (d) Promoting a social covenant by improving social cohesion, reducing social risks and reinforcing gender mainstreaming in public policies;
 - (e) Enhancing sustainable development policies and addressing the economic and social impacts of climate change;
 - (f) Strengthening public management;

- (g) Improving institution-building related to the management of global and transboundary issues at the regional level.
- 20.10 To that end, the strategy will emphasize analytical, advocacy and capacity-building work. The focus will be on the formulation of public policies and the facilitation of their practical implementation by providing operational services in the areas of specialized information, technical assistance and training, and by fostering cooperation and sharing best practices at the regional (South-South cooperation) and international levels. The Commission will continue to work on the integrated follow-up to the world summits from a regional perspective, in particular on the monitoring and evaluation of the region's progress towards the accomplishment of the Millennium Development Goals. For that purpose, the Commission will continue to carry out analytical and normative work in the region to complement the role of the resident coordinator in terms of operational work at the country level to enhance United Nations system-wide coherence. Furthermore, the Commission will reinforce its leading role as the convener of the regional coordination meeting of all specialized agencies, funds and programmes of the United Nations system in the region, its active participation in the United Nations Development Group and its mechanism already in place. Close collaboration will also be enhanced with other inter-American, Ibero-American and Bretton Woods institutions, such as the Organization of American States (OAS), the Ibero-American Secretariat, the Inter-American Development Bank (IADB), the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and World Bank. To further enhance its development function, the Commission will also strengthen its collaboration with private sector associations, non-governmental organizations, think tanks and universities to promote policy dialogues and to engage them in the implementation of the development agenda of the Latin American and Caribbean countries.
- 20.11 Consultations have taken place among concerned entities of the Executive Committee of Economic and Social Affairs at the thematic cluster level. The consultations are expected to lead to more strategic planning and coordinated programmes in major common work areas of the United Nations Secretariat in the social and economic sectors.
- 20.12 The issue of publications as part of the programme of work has been reviewed in the context of each subprogramme. It is anticipated that recurrent and non-recurrent publications will be issued as shown in summary, below in table 20.3, and as distributed in the output information for each subprogramme.

- 20.13 The overall resources required for the biennium 2010-2011 for this section amount to \$106,442,200 before recosting, reflecting an increase of \$3,282,900 (or 3.2 per cent). The growth in table 20.5 can be summarized as follows:
- (a) The net decrease of \$4,500 under policymaking organs relates to reduced requirements under non-post resources for various meetings in 2010-2011;
- (b) The decrease of \$245,300 under executive direction and management is largely the net result of the decrease for post resources as a result of an outward redeployment of one P-3 post to subprogramme 8 to strengthen the research and policy analysis capabilities and the provision of technical cooperation services in the areas of sustainable development and climate change;

- (c) The net increase of \$3,900,500 under programme of work relates mainly to the full cost of the 20 new posts established in 2009 in connection with General Assembly resolution 63/260 on improving the effective and efficient delivery of mandates of the development-related activities;
- (d) A net decrease of \$367,800 under programme support, which includes an increase of \$104,800 for posts and a decrease of \$472,600 for non-post requirements. The increase for post resources relates to the delayed impact of two posts at the National Officer category established in 2008-2009. The net reduction in non-post resources reflects a decrease in requirements for communication costs owing to use of the most economical providers, lower requirements under supplies and materials based on expenditure patterns and refinement of needs.
- 20.14 The projected extrabudgetary resources of \$24,500,000, reflecting an increase of \$500,000, as compared to the biennium 2008-2009, will finance activities such as applied research, advisory services, training activities, expert group meetings. The increase in the estimates for the biennium 2010-2011 relates to the expected increase in activities in the areas of information and communications technologies applications and sustainable development and climate change.
- 20.15 Pursuant to General Assembly resolution 58/269, resources identified for the conduct of monitoring and evaluation will amount to \$966,100, representing a total of 64 work-months of Professional staff and 37 work-months at the local level category, comprises \$931,000 from regular budget resources and reflected under each subprogramme, and \$35,100 from extrabudgetary resources, including \$26,000 of non-post resources as reflected under executive direction and management and the programme of work.
- 20.16 The estimated percentage distribution of the resources for ECLAC in the biennium 2010-2011 is shown in table 20.4 and the distribution of posts and non-posts is summarized in tables 20.5 and 20.6.

A. Policymaking organs

Resource requirements (before recosting): \$1,283,200

- 20.17 The terms of reference of ECLAC were established by the Economic and Social Council in its resolution 106 (VI) of 25 February and 5 March 1948 and subsequent amendments. The Commission is composed of 44 members and 8 associate members and holds biennial sessions during even-numbered years for five days, to review the work of the ECLAC secretariat and approve its biennial programme of work. The biennial session has two ad hoc committees, one on South-South cooperation, and the other on population and development. The thirty-third session of ECLAC will be held in Santiago in the first half of 2010.

Committee of the Whole

- 20.18 The Committee of the Whole was established in 1952. It normally meets at United Nations Headquarters with permanent representatives of ECLAC member States, if and when required, during the years in which the Commission does not hold a biennial session. The plenary Committee of the Whole is expected to meet in New York for three days in 2011, to discuss issues of concern to the Commission.

Presiding Officers of the Regional Conference on the Integration of Women into the Economic and Social Development of Latin America and the Caribbean

- 20.19 The Presiding Officers provide overall direction to the work of the secretariat on issues related to the integration of women into development in the region, in accordance with paragraph 88.2 of the

Regional Plan of Action on the Integration of Women into the Economic and Social Development of Latin America and the Caribbean. The Presiding Officers will meet on three occasions in the coming biennium: twice in 2010 and once in 2011.

- 20.20 The Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean (formerly known as the Regional Conference on the Integration of Women into the Economic and Social Development of Latin America) was established as a permanent subsidiary body of ECLAC at the eleventh extraordinary session of the Committee of the Whole, held on 21 November 1977. At that session, the Commission approved the above-mentioned Regional Plan of Action, which had been adopted in Havana in the same year. The purposes of the Regional Conference are to identify women's needs at the regional and subregional levels, present recommendations, undertake periodic assessments of the activities carried out in fulfilment of regional and international plans and agreements on the subject, and serve as a forum for debates on relevant issues. Its sessions are held every three years and it is expected to meet in Brazil in 2010.

Committee of High-Level Governmental Experts

- 20.21 The Committee of High-Level Governmental Experts was established on 7 May 1971. It is a subsidiary organ of the Commission and acts as a forum devoted to the analysis of various aspects of the implementation and appraisal of development strategies in Latin America and the Caribbean. In the past, it has dealt with industrialization and issues of science and technology, although recently its main focus has been on population matters. It meets, if and when required, annually. The Committee is scheduled to meet in New York in 2010 and 2011.

Caribbean Development and Cooperation Committee

- 20.22 The Caribbean Development and Cooperation Committee was established in 1975. It coordinates economic and social development cooperation and addresses other development concerns of the Caribbean members of ECLAC. It also serves as an advisory and consultative body to the Executive Secretary of ECLAC on issues concerning the Caribbean. The Committee will meet annually in the biennium 2010-2011.

Committee on Central American Economic Cooperation

- 20.23 The Committee on Central American Economic Cooperation was established in 1952. It provides overall coordination and direction to the secretariat in relation to activities to promote the integration of national economies in Central America. It also serves as an advisory and consultative body to the Executive Secretary of ECLAC on issues related to the Central American region and as a subsidiary organ of the Commission. The Committee will meet annually during the biennium 2010-2011.

Regional Council for Planning and Presiding Officers of the Regional Council for Planning of the Latin American and Caribbean Institute for Economic and Social Planning

- 20.24 The Regional Council for Planning of the Latin American and Caribbean Institute for Economic and Social Planning (ILPES), comprising 40 member Governments, was established in 1974. It is the principal intergovernmental body of ILPES and meets every four years.
- 20.25 The Presiding Officers of the Regional Council for Planning, comprising 11 member Governments, examine the work programme for ILPES and evaluate its past activities. The Presiding Officers meet at least once a year and are expected to meet in Havana in 2010 and in Mexico in 2011.

Executive Committee of the Statistical Conference of the Americas of ECLAC

20.26 The Executive Committee of the Statistical Conference of the Americas was established at the same time as the Statistical Conference of the Americas (see below). It meets annually to provide support for the Statistical Conference. The main responsibilities of the Executive Committee are to prepare a biennial programme of regional and international cooperation concerning statistical matters to be presented to the regular conference, to follow up the implementation of the agreements and carry out the tasks assigned by the Conference, and to decide on the substantive documentation to be presented to the Conference.

20.27 The Executive Committee will meet in Buenos Aires in 2010 and in Brasilia in 2011.

Statistical Conference of the Americas of ECLAC

20.28 The Statistical Conference of the Americas was established as a subsidiary organ of the Commission, pursuant to Commission resolution 580 (XXVIII) and Economic and Social Council resolution 2000/7.

20.29 The Conference meets on a biennial basis with the objectives of promoting the development and improvement of national statistics and their international comparability, strengthening cooperation among national statistical offices and international and regional agencies, and preparing a biennial programme of regional and international cooperation to meet the demands of the countries of the region in the field of statistics. The Conference will meet in Santiago in 2011.

20.30 The amount of \$1,283,200, for policymaking organs, reflecting a decrease of \$4,500, provides for the servicing of the meetings of ECLAC intergovernmental bodies. The decrease is due mainly to a reduction in operating requirements.

B. Executive direction and management**Resource requirements (before recosting): \$6,306,200**

20.31 The Office of the Executive Secretary provides overall direction, supervision and management to the ECLAC secretariat, with a view to implementing the legislative mandates and the approved programme of work. It continues to be responsible for the preparation of a biennial institutional substantive report on the main topics to be discussed at the session of the Commission, as well as for the publication of the *CEPAL Review*.

20.32 In addition, the Office will provide direction and policy orientation and will continue to establish the criteria for coordinating the implementation of and the follow-up to Internationally Agreed

Development Goals, including those contained in the Millennium Declaration and other cross-cutting issues, such as gender mainstreaming and sustainable development, throughout the substantive subprogrammes. It is also responsible for coordinating the work programme with other United Nations funds, programmes and specialized agencies to ensure coherence. This also includes the Office of the Secretariat of the Commission with responsibility for maintaining political relations with Governments and authorities of ECLAC member States, ensuring diplomatic and protocol functions and is entrusted with the task of servicing inter-governmental meetings.

- 20.33 The Programme Planning and Operations Division, on behalf of the Executive Secretary, will continue to provide overall coordination, guidance and advice to the ECLAC subprogramme managers with respect to the formulation of the proposed strategic framework and priorities and its revisions, the preparation of the draft programme of work and the biennial report on the work of the Commission for consideration and adoption at the biennial session of the Commission, the preparation of the biennial proposed programme budget, the budget and programme performance reports.
- 20.34 The Division will continue to substantively monitor the implementation of the work programme and will coordinate, organize and report on the implementation of the ECLAC evaluation plan. The Division will be responsible for coordination, guidance and supervision in respect of the ECLAC extrabudgetary technical cooperation programme and its relevant fund-raising activities, as well as the work of the ECLAC Library, for which resources are provided under subsection D, Programme support.
- 20.35 The Information Services Unit is part of the Office of the Executive Secretary. The activities of the Unit are carried out in Santiago in close coordination with the Department of Public Information at United Nations Headquarters and include: (a) organizing press conferences and issuing press releases; (b) producing and disseminating booklets and information kits about the work of ECLAC and the United Nations; (c) placing opinion pieces in the region's media; (d) producing and editing a bimonthly newsletter; and (e) attending to journalists and the general public.

External factors

- 20.36 The component is expected to achieve its objectives and expected accomplishments on the assumption that all stakeholders are fully engaged.

Outputs

- 20.37 During the biennium 2010-2011, the following final outputs will be delivered:
- (a) Servicing of intergovernmental and expert bodies (regular budget):
 - (i) Substantive servicing of meetings: biennial session of ECLAC and its subsidiary bodies (10);

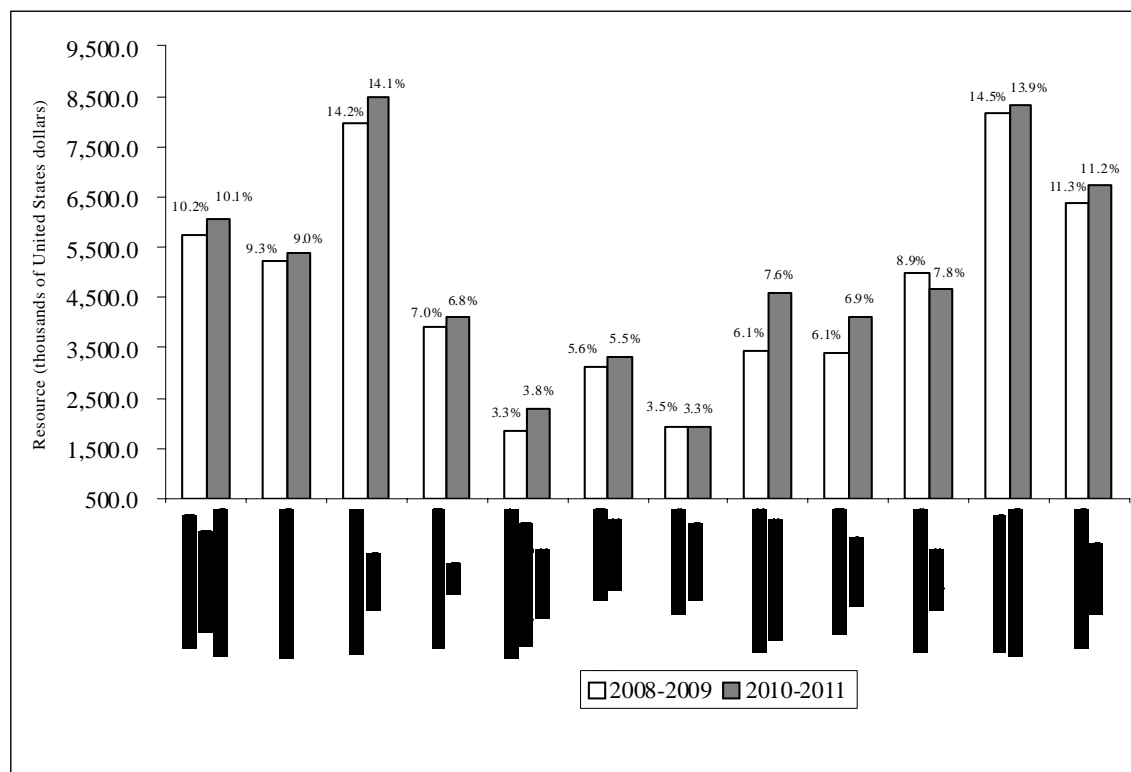
- 20.38 An amount of \$5,614,700 in post requirements, reflecting a decrease of \$244,300 is proposed to fund 30 posts (10 Professional and above and 20 Local level) as indicated in table 20.9. The decrease in post resources reflects the outward redeployment of one P-3 post to subprogramme 8 to strengthen the research and policy analysis capabilities and the provision of technical cooperation services in the areas of sustainable development and climate change. The non-post requirements of \$691,500, reflecting a decrease of \$1,000, relates to inter alia, general temporary assistance, consultants and experts, other staff costs, travel of staff, contractual services, and general operating expenses.
- 20.39 During the biennium 2010-2011, expected extrabudgetary resources amounting to \$360,000 will provide for three posts (see table 20.9), and reflect an increase of \$70,000, compared to the estimates for 2008-2009, primarily a result of a change in the composition of the post structure to strengthen strategic alliance and coordination with donors and cooperation partners, such as the United Nations funds, programmes and specialized agencies, multilateral organizations, Governments, research institutions, civil society organizations, non-governmental organizations and the private sector in technical cooperation activities to better meet the development needs of ECLAC developing member States.

Resource requirements (before recosting): \$6,066,600

- 20.40 Substantive responsibility for the subprogramme rests with the International Trade and Integration Division in collaboration with the ECLAC Office in Washington, D.C. The strategy will take special account of the relevant provisions relating to the goals and targets set forth in the outcomes of the major United Nations conferences and summits in the economic and social fields, including those set forth in the Millennium Declaration and the 2005 World Summit Outcome, particularly those related to the global partnership for development. The subprogramme will assist member States in drawing on the potential benefits of and addressing the main challenges posed by the globalized world economy, to further develop an open, rule-based, predictable, non-discriminatory trading system and to deepen and expand the economic integration processes of member States within the region and with other regions.
- 20.41 The subprogramme will be implemented in accordance with the strategy detailed under subprogramme 1 of programme 17 of the strategic framework for the period 2010-2011.

- 20.42 The subprogramme is expected to achieve its objectives and expected accomplishments on the assumption that: (a) the international community supports the member States of ECLAC and responds to specific needs and concerns in relation to international trade and integration, taking into account General Assembly and Economic and Social Council guidelines as well as internationally agreed development goals, including those contained in the Millennium Declaration and commitments derived from the various bilateral, subregional and multilateral trade agreements; (b) the regional integration processes of Latin America and the Caribbean continue to strengthen in the changing context of the global economy. In this scenario, important emerging actors continue to gain increasing influence in order to maximize benefits and reduce costs for the majority of the population, who will be the beneficiaries of economic and social development; (c) the international community and the region in particular endeavour to realize the potential benefits which may result from the current negotiations in the framework of World Trade Organization or other international forums, particularly in the areas of trade facilitation and Aid for Trade.

Outputs

- 20.44 The amount of \$5,789,800 in post requirements provides for 26 posts (17 Professional and above, 9 General Service and Local level) as shown in table 20.13. The amount reflects a net increase of \$338,000 due to: (a) delayed impact of two additional posts (1 P-4 and 1 P-3) established in 2009 in connection with improving the effective and efficient delivery of mandates of the development-related activities, partly offset by the outward redeployment of one Local level post to

subprogramme 9 to strengthen technical support to research and policy analysis capabilities, particularly in the areas of sustainable management of natural resources, provision of energy and infrastructure with emphasis on trade facilitation and transport. The non-post requirements of \$276,800 are required for other staff costs, consultants and experts and travel of staff.

- 20.45 During the biennium 2010-2011, expected extrabudgetary resources amounting to \$840,000 will provide for one post reflected in table 20.13 and non-post resources for: travel of staff, consultants, other operational requirements and seminars. The amount reflects an increase of \$135,000, compared with the biennium 2008-2009, related to Asia-Latin American economic relations and the increase in planned project activities focusing on the fulfilment of Millennium Development Goal 8.

- 20.46 The execution of the subprogramme will be the responsibility of the Division of Production, Productivity and Management in close collaboration with the ECLAC Office in Brasilia. The strategy to be followed will take special account of the relevant provisions relating to the goals and targets set forth in the outcomes of the major United Nations conferences and summits in the economic and social fields, including those set forth in the Millennium Declaration and the 2005 World Summit Outcome, particularly those related to the global partnership for development.
- 20.47 The subprogramme will be implemented in accordance with the strategy detailed under subprogramme 2 of programme 17 of the strategic framework for the period 2010-2011.

In this regard, guidelines established by the General Assembly and the Economic and Social Council as well as the internationally agreed development goals, including those contained in the Millennium Declaration, will be taken into account.

20.49 During the biennium 2010-2011, the following final outputs will be delivered:

- 20.50 The amount of \$5,381,800 reflecting an increase of \$180,800 provides for the continuation of 21 posts (16 Professional and above and 5 Local level) (\$5,104,700) and non-post requirements (\$277,100) such as other staff costs for temporary assistance during peak workload periods, consultants and experts and travel. The increase of \$180,800 is due mainly to the delayed impact of one P-3 post established in 2009 in connection with development-related activities. The non-post requirements of \$277,100 are required for other staff costs, consultants and experts, and travel of staff.
- 20.51 During the biennium 2010-2011, expected extrabudgetary resources amounting to \$3,330,000 will provide for five posts as reflected in table 20.15 and non-post resources for travel of staff, consultants, other operational requirements and seminars. The amount reflects a net increase of \$230,000 as compared to the biennium 2008-2009, related to project activities in the area of ICT application, focusing on the fulfilment of the Millennium Development Goals, from the continued and increased project funding from the Commission of the European Communities (EuropeAid).

Subprogramme 3

Macroeconomic policies and growth

Resource requirements (before recosting): \$8,482,400

- 20.52 Substantive responsibility for the execution of the subprogramme rests with the Economic Development Division in collaboration with ECLAC Offices in Brasilia and Buenos Aires. The strategy to be followed will take special account of relevant provisions relating to the goals and targets set forth in the outcomes of the major United Nations conferences and summits in the economic and social fields, including those set forth in the Millennium Declaration and the 2005 World Summit Outcome. In particular, it will place emphasis on those referring to the eradication of extreme poverty and hunger, in order to develop a global partnership for development, which will include the commitment to further develop an open, rule-based, predictable, non-discriminatory trading and financial system, and to deal comprehensively with the debt problems of developing countries through national and international measures. In working towards those goals and targets, the subprogramme will cooperate and interact with other entities of the United Nations system and other regional and subregional institutions working in the area of development.
- 20.53 The subprogramme will be implemented in accordance with the strategy detailed under subprogramme 3 of programme 17 of the strategic framework for the period 2010-2011.

- 20.54 The subprogramme is expected to achieve its objectives and expected accomplishments on the assumption that: (a) stable conditions will prevail in the international economy and in the management of macroeconomic policies of the countries of the region, placing the economies in a better position to cope with external shocks or disruptions; and (b) the international community will support and assign priority to the concerns and needs of ECLAC member States with respect to their macroeconomic policies and long-term growth strategies in the context of the regional and international development agenda. In this regard, the guidelines established by the General Assembly and the Economic and Social Council, as well as internationally agreed development goals, including those deriving from the Millennium Declaration, instruments adopted at the world summits and conferences in the economic and social spheres, will be taken into account.

- 20.56 The amount of \$8,180,300 in post requirements, reflecting an increase of \$502,000, provides for 37 posts (24 Professional and above and 13 Local level) shown in table 20.17. The increase of \$502,000 is in connection with the inward redeployment of three posts (2 P-2 and 1 Local level), along with their functions, from subprogramme 10, Statistics and economic projections, to realign resources and improve programme delivery of publishing economic projections and forecasting activities. The amount of \$302,100 for non-post requirements provides for other staff costs, consultants and experts and travel of staff.
- 20.57 During the biennium 2010-2011, expected extrabudgetary resources amounting to \$5,145,000 will provide for four posts as reflected in table 20.17 and non-post resources for travel of staff, consultants, other operational requirements and seminars. The amount reflects a net decrease of \$280,000 compared to the biennium 2007-2009, in connection with activities in the area of macroeconomic policy and the labour market. The subprogramme will utilize extrabudgetary resources for activities focusing on the fulfilment of the Millennium Development Goals, particularly Goal 8. It is expected that the host Governments of ECLAC national offices will continue to fund the technical cooperation activities in the respective countries.

Subprogramme 4

Social development and equity

Resource requirements (before recosting): \$4,097,800

- 20.58 The Social Development Division will be responsible for the implementation of the subprogramme. The strategy will take into account the internationally agreed development goals stemming from the major United Nations conferences in the economic and social fields, including those set forth in the Millennium Declaration. In particular, technical cooperation services will be provided to the countries of the region to follow up on the plans of action adopted at United Nations international conferences and summits in the social sphere.
- 20.59 The subprogramme will be implemented in accordance with the strategy detailed under subprogramme 4 of programme 17 of the strategic framework for the period 2010-2011.

20.62 The amount of \$3,915,100 in post requirements, reflecting an increase of \$180,800, provides for 17 posts (12 Professional and above and 5 Local level) as shown in Table 20.19. The increase in post resources relates to the delayed impact of one P-3 post established in the context of General Assembly resolution 63/260 on development-related activities, effective 1 January 2009. The amount of \$182,700 for non-post requirements provides for, inter alia, consultants and experts and travel of staff.

20.63 During the biennium 2010-2011, expected extrabudgetary resources amounting to \$2,215,000 will provide for two posts reflected in table 20.19, and non-post resources for travel of staff, consultants, other operational requirements and seminars. The amount reflects an increase of

\$140,000, as compared to the biennium 2008-2009, in connection with activities in the areas of social inclusion, cohesion and protection. The subprogramme will utilize extrabudgetary resources for its activities focusing on the fulfilment of the Millennium Development Goals, particularly Goal 8.

Subprogramme 5

Mainstreaming the gender perspective in regional development

Resource requirements (before recosting): \$2,305,500

- 20.64 Substantive responsibility for the execution of the subprogramme rests with the Division on Gender Affairs of the Commission. Special attention will be paid to the provisions relating to the goals and targets set forth in the major United Nations human rights instruments and mandates. The subprogramme will also concentrate on developing new knowledge that sheds light on the nature of the problems that have arisen in the sphere of gender policies in the region, incorporating that knowledge into the capacity-building strategy in the countries of the region and, above all, into the gender mainstreaming strategy of national mechanisms for the advancement of women. It will also continue to support the collection of basic data on the situation of women and men, the development of gender indicators and the provision of technical assistance for capacity-building to sectoral ministries and selected entities, such as national statistical offices. The subprogramme will also support the sharing of experiences and good practices among member States of the Regional Conference on Women in Latin America and the Caribbean. Other stakeholders from academia and relevant sectors of civil society will be included in the subprogramme's activities as beneficiaries.
- 20.65 The subprogramme will be implemented in accordance with the strategy detailed under subprogramme 5 of programme 17 of the strategic framework for the period 2010-2011.

- 20.68 An amount of \$2,136,900 in post requirements, reflecting an increase of \$440,200, provides for nine posts (7 Professional and above and 2 Local level) as shown in table 20.21. The increase of \$440,200 relates to the delayed impact of two posts (1 P-5 and 1 P-3) established in the context of General Assembly resolution 63/260 on development-related activities, effective 1 January 2009. The requirements for non-post resources of \$168,600 comprise other staff costs, consultants and experts and travel of staff.
- 20.69 During the biennium 2010-2011, expected extrabudgetary resources amounting to \$820,000 will provide for one post, reflected in table 20.21, and non-post resources for travel of staff, consultants, other operational requirements and seminars. The amount reflects an increase of \$180,000 compared to the biennium 2008-2009. The subprogramme will utilize extrabudgetary resources for technical cooperation projects focusing on the fulfilment of the Millennium Development Goal 3, follow up on the 15+ Beijing review; violence against women and the Cairo Agreement which recognizes gender equality as a prerequisite for achieving sustainable development. The increase is expected from the continuation of project funding from multilateral and bilateral sources such as the United Nations Population Fund, the Spanish International Cooperation Agency for Development and the Swedish International Cooperation Agency.

Subprogramme 6 Population and development

Resource requirements (before recosting): \$3,324,600

- 20.70 The Latin American and Caribbean Demographic Centre of the Population Division of the Commission will be responsible for the implementation of the subprogramme. - 20.74 The amount of \$3,150,700 in post requirements, reflecting an increase of \$180,700, provides for 16 posts (8 Professional and above and 8 Local level) as shown in table 20.23. The increase relates to the delayed impact of one P-3 post established in the context of General Assembly resolution 63/260 on development-related activities, effective 1 January 2009. 20.80 The amount of \$1,837,800 in post requirements provides for the continuation of 11 posts (3 Professional and 8 Local level) as shown in table 20.25. The amount of \$110,100 for non-post requirements provides for other staff costs, consultants and experts and travel of staff.

- 20.81 During the biennium 2010-2011, expected extrabudgetary resources amounting to \$3,870,000 will provide for nine posts reflected in table 20.25 and non-post resources for: travel of staff, consultants, other operational requirements and seminars. The amount reflecting a decrease of \$215,000, compared to the biennium 2008-2009, is due mainly to the completion of a large-scale and multi-year project. Extrabudgetary resources would be used to support outputs aimed at increasing the capacity of public officials on budgetary policies and result-based public management, strategic management of local and regional development, evaluation of public sector programmes and projects with particular attention to relevant provisions of Millennium Development Goal 8.

- 20.90 The subprogramme is expected to achieve its objectives and expected accomplishments on the assumption that: (a) socio-economic and institutional stability will prevail in the region, with no major external shocks or disruptions affecting the priorities of the programme of work; and (b) the international community will support and assign priority to concerns and specific requirements in relation to the sustainable management of natural resources and the provision of public utilities and infrastructure services, in the context of the regional and international development agenda. To this end, the guidelines established by the General Assembly and the Economic and Social Council will be taken into account, together with the internationally agreed development goals, including those deriving from the Millennium Declaration.

Outputs

- 20.91 During the biennium 2010-2011, the following final outputs will be delivered:

20.92 The amount of \$3,864,900 in post requirements, reflecting an increase of \$735,500, provides for 18 posts (12 Professional and above and 6 Local level) reflected in table 20.29. The increase relates to the delayed impact of four posts (1 P-4, 1 P-3, 1 P-2 and 1 Local level) established in the context of General Assembly resolution 63/260 on development-related activities, effective 1 January 2009, and an inward redeployment of one Local level post from subprogramme 1, Linkages with the global economy, regional integration and cooperation, to strengthen technical support to research and policy analysis capabilities in the areas of sustainable management of natural resources, provision of energy and infrastructure with emphasis on trade facilitation and transport. The amount of \$268,400 for non-post requirements provides for general temporary assistance, consultants and experts and for travel of staff.

- 20.93 During the biennium 2010-2011, expected extrabudgetary resources amounting to \$1,150,000 will provide for one post reflected in table 20.29 and non-post resources for: travel of staff, consultants, other operational requirements and seminars. The amount reflecting an increase of \$185,000, compared to the biennium 2008-2009, in connection with technical advisory services on sustainable management of natural resources (energy, water and mine) and infrastructure services (land and sea transport) as well as studies on energy crisis and renewable sources of energy. The subprogramme will take into consideration the internationally agreed development goals, particularly Millennium Development Goal 7.

Subprogramme 10

Statistics and economic projections

Resource requirements (before recosting): \$4,677,300

- 20.94 The Statistics and Economic Projections Division will be responsible for the implementation of the subprogramme. Given its interdisciplinary nature, it will work in close collaboration with other ECLAC divisions, to which it will continue to provide services.
- 20.95 The subprogramme will be implemented in accordance with the strategy detailed under subprogramme 10 of programme 17 of the strategic framework for the period 2010-2011.

- 20.96 The subprogramme is expected to achieve its objectives and expected accomplishments on the assumption that: (a) socio-economic and institutional stability will prevail in the region, allowing the normal functioning of and progress of work at the national statistical offices; (b) the international community will continue to support the work of the Statistical Conference of the Americas of ECLAC and the priorities it sets for statistical development in the region, in response to the specific needs and concerns of ECLAC member States in this field. To that end, the guidelines established by the General Assembly and the Economic and Social Council, as well as the internationally agreed development goals, including those contained in the Millennium Declaration, will be taken into account; and (c) international agencies and organizations working in the region support the coordination efforts aimed at increasing the efficiency and helpfulness of their statistical cooperation activities.

- 20.98 The provision of \$4,381,700 in post requirements, reflecting a net decrease of \$321,200 provides for 24 posts (9 Professional and above and 15 Local level) as shown in table 20.31. The net decrease relates to the outward redeployment of three posts (2 P-2 and 1 Local level), along with their functions, to subprogramme 3, partly offset by the delayed impact of one P-3 established in the context of General Assembly resolution 63/260 on development-related activities, effective 1 January 2009. The amount of \$295,600 for non-post requirements provides for other staff costs; consultants and experts; and travel of staff.
- 20.99 During the biennium 2010-2011, expected extrabudgetary resources amounting to \$750,000, reflecting a decrease of \$5,000, as compared to the biennium 2008-2009, will provide for travel of staff, consultants, other project requirements and seminars relating to technical cooperation projects. It is expected that UNDP and other existing donors will continue their funding for projects under this subprogramme. In addition, the subprogramme will assist countries in the region in the production of indicators to follow up on the achievement of the Millennium Development Goals and in closing the gaps between national data and those employed by international agencies, updating the methodology for measuring poverty and in the production of their national poverty estimates. The subprogramme will also continue to strengthen the role of the Statistical Conference of the Americas.

Subprogramme 11

Subregional activities in Mexico and Central America

Resource requirements (before recosting): \$8,325,700

- 20.100 The ECLAC subregional headquarters in Mexico will be responsible for the execution of the subprogramme, focusing on the countries of the Central American isthmus, Cuba, the Dominican Republic, Haiti and Mexico, and in coordination with other ECLAC subprogrammes on sectoral specialization. Special account will be taken of the relevant provisions of the internationally agreed development goals, including those set forth in the outcomes of the major United Nations conferences and summits in the economic and social fields, including those set forth in the Millennium Declaration and the 2005 World Summit Outcome, in particular regarding the eradication of extreme poverty and hunger, the promotion of gender equality and women's empowerment, ensuring environmental sustainability and the building up of a global partnership for development.
- 20.101 The subprogramme will be implemented in accordance with the strategy detailed under subprogramme 11 of programme 17 of the strategic framework for the period 2010-2011.

- 20.104 The provision of \$7,828,600 for post requirements, reflecting a net increase of \$161,800, provides for 43 posts (23 Professional and above and 20 Local level) as indicated in table 20.33 above. The net increase relates to the delayed impact of three posts (1 P-4, 1 P-3 and 1 Local level) established in the context of resolution 63/260 on development-related activities, effective 1 January 2009, partly offset by the outward redeployment of one P-4 post, along with its functions, to subprogramme 8. The amount of \$497,100 for non-post requirements provides for: other staff costs; consultants and experts and travel of staff.
- 20.105 During the biennium 2010-2011, expected extrabudgetary resources amounting to \$1,100,000 will provide for: one post, travel of staff, consultants, other project requirements and seminars relating to technical cooperation projects. The amount reflecting a decrease of \$363,000, as compared to the biennium 2008-2009, is due to the completion of a large-scale, multi-year project in Mexico. The subprogramme will provide advisory services on the impact of macroeconomics policy and

external shocks on poverty and income inequality, intellectual property rights and innovation policies, environmental standards, cooperation in trade agreements, regulation and competition in the air passenger transportation industry, the climate change (including the costs of its foreseen impact and of alternative response scenarios), sustainable and efficient consumption of wood fuel, diagnosis on energy in the transports sector, and projections of fuel and biofuel consumption and greenhouse gas emissions.

Resource requirements (before recosting): \$6,729,100

- 20.106 Responsibility for the implementation of the subprogramme is entrusted to the ECLAC subregional headquarters for the Caribbean, which also serves as the secretariat for the Caribbean Development and Cooperation Committee. It will continue to provide technical cooperation and support to member and associate member Governments of the subregion to facilitate public policymaking and decision-making in response to meeting the challenges of sustainable development, globalization and subregional and regional integration.
- 20.107 The subprogramme will be implemented in accordance with the strategy detailed under subprogramme 12 of programme 17 of the strategic framework for the period 2010-2011.

- 20.108 The subprogramme is expected to achieve its objectives and expected accomplishments on the assumption that: (a) the excellent rapport and trust existing between the Caribbean Development and Cooperation Committee and the key national authorities are maintained and strengthened; (b) the collaboration and cooperation existing between regional and international organizations operating in the subregion and which are crucial to the overall success of the subprogramme are further strengthened.

Outputs

- 20.109 During the biennium 2010-2011, the following final outputs will be delivered:
- (a) Servicing of intergovernmental and expert bodies (regular budget and extrabudgetary):

- 20.110 The amount of \$6,282,900 in post requirements, reflecting an increase of \$374,400, provides for the continuation of 36 posts (17 Professional and above and 19 Local level) as shown in table 20.35. The increase relates to the delayed impact of two P-3 posts established in the context of General Assembly resolution 63/260 on development-related activities, effective 1 January 2009. The amount of \$446,200, reflecting a decrease of \$2,000 for non-post requirements relates to other staff costs, consultants and experts and travel of staff.
- 20.111 During the biennium 2010-2011, expected extrabudgetary resources amounting to \$865,000, will provide for one post, travel of staff, consultants, other project requirements and seminars relating to technical cooperation projects. The amount reflecting an increase of \$498,000, compared to the biennium 2008-2009, provides for the implementation of technical cooperation projects to be financed by new donors. The resources would provide for advisory services and training activities which promote evidenced-based programme and policy planning on the Mauritius Strategy for the further Implementation of the Barbados Programme of Action for Small Island Developing States, particularly on the relevant provisions of Millennium Development Goals 1, 3, 7 and 8.

D. Programme support

Resource requirements (before recosting): \$38,803,700

- 20.112 The activities carried out under programme support comprise conference services, library services, management of technical cooperation activities and administration and common services.
- 20.113 Programme support comprises (a) conference services, whose functions relate to the provision of substantive services for the meetings of the intergovernmental organs of ECLAC, the provision of conference services to ECLAC and the publications programme, distribution of ECLAC and United Nations Headquarters publications; (b) library services providing information services to ECLAC staff members and external users, the publication of bulletins and bibliographies on a periodic basis and the provision of services to remote users through the Internet. Furthermore, the ECLAC Library acts as the United Nations depository library in Chile, concentrating all the official documentation produced by the Organization; (c) management of technical cooperation activities formulated to complement the regular budget resource allocation. This component is geared to strengthening and expanding the economic and social research agenda and to the application of research findings to the provision of advisory services and training for the benefit of ECLAC member States; (d) administration and common services providing the overall management and coordination of administrative services, policy formulation and the establishment of managerial and administrative guidelines at ECLAC, human resources management, financial

management, general support services, implementation and administration of IMIS, language training and the electronic information activities.

Outputs

20.114 During the biennium 2010-2011 the following final outputs will be delivered:

- (a) *Conference services.* The activities are carried out by the Documents and Publications Division in Santiago and the Editorial, Documents and Conference Services. The main activities relate to the provision of technical services to the meetings of policymaking organs of ECLAC and other intergovernmental meetings held under its auspices; the provision of conference services to the meetings of policymaking organs of ECLAC and other intergovernmental meetings held under its auspices, including translation, interpretation, editing and verbatim reporting; the publications programme, distribution of ECLAC publications; and collaboration with the United Nations Sales Unit in the commercial distribution of United Nations publications;
- (b) *Library services.* Library services are provided to ECLAC staff members and external users by the libraries at Santiago and Mexico City. Activities include the publication of bulletins and bibliographies; the provision of services to remote users through the Internet; United Nations depository library in Chile; establishment of agreements and cooperation with other libraries in the subregion; dissemination of the substantive documentation of ECLAC; processing of external bibliographic resources and information in support of the substantive activities of the Commission in the subregion; answering reference queries; publication of bulletins and bibliographies on paper and through electronic means; and daily updating of the section of the ECLAC webpage pertaining to the Library;
- (c) *Management of technical cooperation activities.* The activities are carried out by the Project Management Unit of the Programme Planning and Operations Division. The ECLAC technical cooperation activities are formulated to supplement the regular budget resource allocation. The Regular programme of technical cooperation (section 22 of the budget) is also managed by the Programme Planning and Operations Division in ECLAC to bring programmatic and substantive coherence to both the regular budget and extrabudgetary-funded components of the technical cooperation activities carried out by ECLAC in its totality. Both are part of a programme designed with a holistic approach and driven by the same set of substantive and programmatic priorities at the department level. They supplement each other and are shaped by common logical framework models at the subprogramme level. The technical cooperation activities are geared to strengthening and expanding the economic and social research agenda and to applying research findings to the provision of advisory services and training for the benefit of ECLAC member States. They play an active role in integrating substantive activities financed from extrabudgetary funds with those financed from the regular budget. They also aim at maintaining a mutually supporting balance between substantive research and operational activities. The anticipated outputs during the biennium are as follows:
 - (i) Publication of reports on the activities carried out by the ECLAC system to support and/or promote technical cooperation among developing countries at the regional, subregional and national levels; institutional arrangements for technical cooperation activities existing in developing member States of ECLAC; operational activities carried out in the region to promote interregional cooperation;

- (ii) Advisory services to Governments and/or regional institutions in the identification and/or elaboration of technical cooperation programmes and project proposals, to be implemented at the regional, national or interregional level;
 - (iii) Coordination with the technical cooperation focal points in other regional commissions for the promotion of interregional cooperation activities;
 - (iv) Consultations with other regional organizations that carry out technical cooperation in Latin America and the Caribbean, to identify priorities to be included in the regional programme;
 - (v) Collaboration with substantive units in the ECLAC system and subregional offices, for the preparation and implementation of projects to promote and support technical cooperation among developing countries components in the ECLAC programme of work;
 - (vi) Assistance to Governments in the identification of technical and cooperation demands and opportunities and in the preparation of project proposals;
 - (vii) Preparation of project agreements and proposals in accordance with the operational and financial rules and procedures established by the contributing organization, institution or government and by the United Nations;
 - (viii) Preparation of budgets for extrabudgetary activities;
 - (ix) Monitoring project implementation;
 - (x) Administration of extrabudgetary funds in close collaboration with the substantive units responsible for the implementation of such projects;
- (d) *Administration and common services.* The main activities of the Division of Administration at ECLAC-Santiago are: (a) the overall management and coordination of administrative services, policy formulation and the establishment of managerial and administrative guidelines at ECLAC and overseeing administrative activities at two ECLAC subregional headquarters in Mexico City and Port of Spain and five national offices; (b) human resources management: recruitment, placement and career development of staff, staff administration and classification, maintenance of the classification system for General Service posts established under the relevant administrative instruction (see ST/AI/1998/9; see also ST/AI/410 and Corr.1), internship programme, medical and employee assistance, general advice and individual counselling; (c) financial management and control through establishment of procedures for the control and maintenance of regular and extrabudgetary funds, implementation of financial regulation and rules and financial reporting and accounting, including treasury services; (d) general support services: including communications and transportation; procurement, facilities management and maintenance, archives and records management; (e) planning and coordinating the implementation and administration of IMIS in the ECLAC system; (f) language training at all ECLAC duty stations (excludes training activities funded centrally and directed by the Office of Human Resources Management); and (g) electronic information activities carried out by the Electronic Information Section in consultation with the ECLAC Information Management Committee, whose main activities are to advise the Executive Secretary on policy formulation for the automation processes at ECLAC, including the allocation of material and financial resources; provide technical advice and support services to substantive areas, ensuring the appropriate functioning of the ECLAC automation platform, including the website, Internet, communications and IMIS services; supervise the maintenance services of ECLAC computer hardware and ensure the security of its information systems.

- 20.115 The amount of \$26,912,300 in post requirements, which reflects an increase of \$104,800, provides for 190 posts (43 Professional and above, 147 National Officer and Local level posts) as shown in table 20.36 above. The increase in posts relates to the delayed impact of two posts at the National Officer category established in 2008-2009.
- 20.116 The amount of \$11,891,400 for non-post requirements includes resources for other staff costs, travel of staff; contractual services (including language teachers); and overall operating requirements. The amount reflects a net decrease of \$472,600, as a result of decrease in requirements for communication costs owing to the use of more economical providers, lower requirements under supplies and materials as well as equipment based on expenditure patterns and refinement of needs.
- 20.117 During the biennium 2010-2011, expected extrabudgetary resources amounting to \$1,095,000 will be utilized to cover programme support costs related to various technical cooperation projects. The amount reflecting a decrease of \$240,000, compared to the biennium 2008-2009, is due to the reduction in the requirement for a programme management expert associated with the projects which have been finalized in the biennium 2008-2009.

This includes a decrease of \$548,700 under posts, resulting from a net decrease of two Professional posts and one Local post. utilize resources more productively. It requests that the experience acquired in the course of such efforts be shared with the other regional commissions (para. V.50).

The Advisory Committee was informed that ECLAC had experienced some difficulty in finalizing agreements for extrabudgetary funding of its projects with certain international financial institutions and had to forgo some funding opportunities. Certain clauses contained in the agreements proposed to ECLAC by the Inter-American Development Bank and other international financial institutions were not compatible with the standard United Nations Secretariat agreements and were even contrary to the United Nations Financial Regulations and Rules. The Committee trusts that this issue will be resolved expeditiously in order to facilitate the Commission's fund-raising efforts (para. V.51).

Office of Internal Oversight Services

ECLAC_007. All programme managers should ensure that all evaluation reports are made available on the Internet and/or the Intranet in user-friendly form to increase transparency and permit a greater level of common learning across the Secretariat (para. 69).

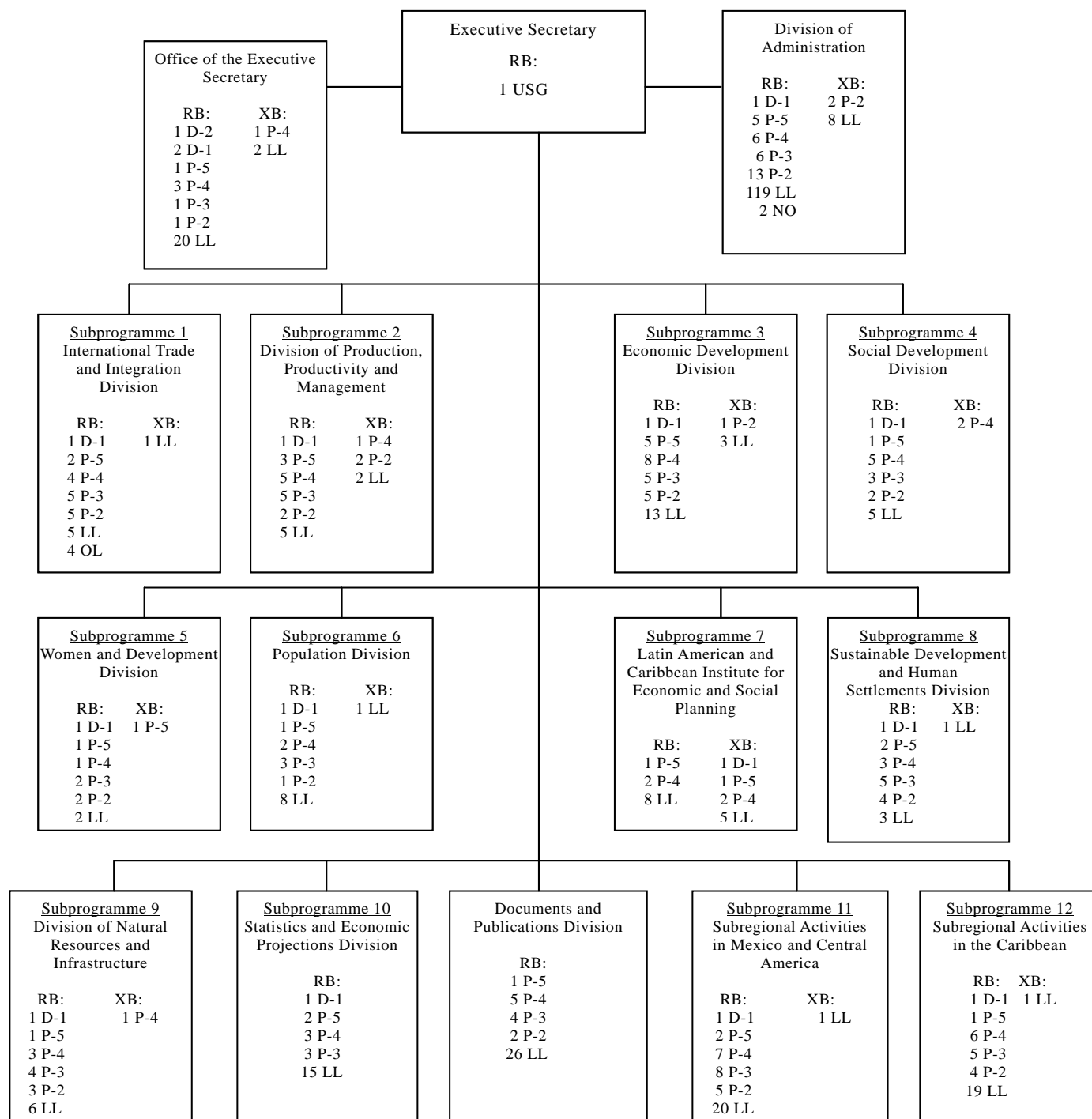

All programme managers should ensure that evaluation plans at the programme and subprogramme levels are developed, setting out the evaluation activities to be performed, by whom, by when and with what resources. The evaluation plans should further establish a mechanism for accurate tracking of resource use in order to know what the "cost" of evaluation is and thus understand what types of evaluation best serve the needs of the programme/subprogramme (paras. 45-46). (IED-2006-006)

A technical solution was found that respects the financial regulations and rules of both institutions and is therefore agreeable to both parties. At the time of writing, a standard model agreement is being used between the Inter-American Development Bank and ECLAC and several projects are currently under implementation.
