Appointments to fill vacancies in subsidiary organs and other appointments: appointment of members of the Committee on Contributions

Report of the Fifth Committee

1. At its 2nd plenary meeting, on 17 September 2010, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include in the agenda of its sixty-fifth session the item entitled “Appointments to fill vacancies in subsidiary organs and other appointments: appointment of members of the Committee on Contributions” and to allocate it to the Fifth Committee.

2. At its 14th meeting, on 5 November 2010, the Fifth Committee had before it the following documents:

(a) Note by the Secretary-General concerning the vacancies in the membership of the Committee on Contributions that would occur as a result of the expiration of the term of office of six of its members on 31 December 2010 (A/65/102/Rev.1);

(b) Note by the Secretary-General containing the names of six persons nominated by their respective Governments for appointment or reappointment to the Committee on Contributions for a three-year term of office beginning on 1 January 2011 (A/C.5/65/5).

3. At the same meeting, the Committee decided, by acclamation, to recommend to the General Assembly that it appoint Joseph Acakpo-Satchivi (Benin), Juan Ndong Mbomio Mangue (Equatorial Guinea), Bernardo Greiver del Hoyo (Uruguay), Pedro Luis Pedroso (Cuba), Gordon Eckersley (Australia) and Thomas Schlesinger (Austria) as members of the Committee on Contributions for a three-year term of office beginning on 1 January 2011 (see para. 4).
