#### **Report of the Fifth Committee**

1. At its 26th and 27th meetings, on 17 and 23 December 2010, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement submitted by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/65/13) on the programme budget implications of draft resolution A/65/L.50. At the 26th meeting, the Chair of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions introduced the related oral report of that Committee. The draft decision submitted by the Chair following informal consultations was before the Committee (see para. 3).

2. The statements and comments made in the course of the Fifth Committee's consideration of this question are reflected in the relevant summary records (A/C.5/65/SR.26 and 27).

#### **Decision of the Fifth Committee**

3. The Fifth Committee, having considered the statement of programme budget implications submitted by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/65/13) and the related oral report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (see A/C.5/65/SR.26), decides to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution A/65/L.50, additional resources in the amount of \$152,600 would be required for the biennium 2010-2011, comprising \$126,800 under section 2, General Assembly and Economic and Social Council affairs and conference management,



and \$25,800 under section 28D, Office of Central Support Services. This would represent a charge against the contingency fund and, as such, would require appropriation for the biennium.
