Report of the Fifth Committee

1. At its 23rd and 25th meetings, on 16 and 23 December 2011, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement submitted by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/66/10) on the programme budget implications of draft resolution A/C.3/66/L.55/Rev.1. At the 23rd meeting, the Chair of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions introduced the related report of that Committee (A/66/7/Add.15). The draft decision submitted by the Chair following informal consultations was before the Committee (see para. 3).

2. The statements and comments made in the course of the Fifth Committee's consideration of this question are reflected in the relevant summary records (A/C.5/66/SR.23 and 25).

Decision of the Fifth Committee

3. The Fifth Committee, having considered the statement of programme budget implications submitted by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/66/10) and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/66/7/Add.15), decides to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution A/C.3/66/L.55/Rev.1, additional resources amounting to \$1,200,500 would be required for the period from 1 January to 31 December 2012 under



section 3, Political affairs, and \$157,600 under section 37, Staff assessment, to be offset by the same amount under income section 1, Income from staff assessment, of the programme budget for the biennium 2012-2013 for the continued efforts of the good offices of the Secretary-General relating to the situation in Myanmar. Approval for those requirements is being sought in the context of the report of the Secretary-General on estimates in respect of special political missions, good offices and other political initiatives authorized by the Assembly and/or the Security Council in documents A/66/354/Add.1 and Corr.1.
