### Note by the Secretary-General

#### Addendum

1. The Secretary-General has received notification of the resignation of NneNne Iwuji-Eme (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland) from the Committee on Contributions, with effect from 23 April 2013. Accordingly, the General Assembly will be required to appoint, at its current session, a person to fill the vacancy for the remaining period of the term of office of Ms. Iwuji-Eme, which expires on 31 December 2014.
2. The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland has nominated Thomas David Smith to fill the vacancy arising from the resignation of Ms. Iwuji-Eme.
3. In a communication dated 29 April 2013, the Secretariat was informed by the Chair of the Group of Western European and other States that the candidature of Mr. Smith had been endorsed by the Group.
