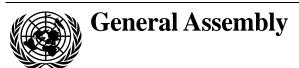

Standards of accommodation for air travel

Report of the Secretary-General

Summary

The present report of the Secretary-General on the standards of accommodation for air travel is submitted in accordance with General Assembly resolutions 42/214, 45/248 A, 53/214, 63/268 and 65/268 and decisions 44/442 and 46/450, as well as decision 57/589, in which the Assembly requested the Secretary-General to submit a report to it on a biennial basis. The present report provides information on standards of accommodation for air travel for the two-year period ended 30 June 2012 and comparative statistics for the two-year period ended 30 June 2010, as well as trend analyses for the past 10 years.

I. Introduction


- 1. The United Nations standards of accommodation for air travel are governed by a series of General Assembly resolutions and decisions, including resolutions 42/214, 45/248 A, 53/214, 63/268 and 65/268 and decisions 44/442, 46/450 and 57/589. Pursuant to the discretionary authority vested in the Secretary-General to authorize exceptions to air travel on a case-by-case basis and business-class travel by air in special circumstances that warrant it, the Secretary-General promulgated administrative instruction ST/AI/2006/4 for the purpose of implementing the various staff rules relating to the standards of accommodation for air travel and the exceptions thereto.
- 2. In the past, certain categories of exceptions to the standards have been established, including, but not limited to, the following: travel of eminent persons; travel of prominent individuals who are donating their services to the Organization free of charge; travel under circumstances that have been deemed to be arduous or under which, for medical reasons, it has been deemed appropriate to upgrade the accommodation of air travel; travel of the security officials travelling with the Secretary-General, his spouse or his personal representatives; and travel under circumstances when the normal standard of accommodation is not available and it is considered prudent to authorize an upgrade.
- 3. In its resolution 63/268, the General Assembly endorsed the recommendations contained in the report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/63/715) which, inter alia, called for future reports on this matter to contain analysis of the trends in the number of exceptions and provide analysis of the trends for the past 10 years and possible explanations as appropriate.
- 4. In its resolution 65/268 of 4 April 2011, the General Assembly endorsed the recommendations contained in the report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/65/632) in which the Committee requested, inter alia, that the travel data of the United Nations Secretariat and other United Nations entities be combined in one table showing all authorized exceptions for the respective time periods (see tables 1 and 2 below). In the same resolution, the Assembly also decided to extend to the Deputy Secretary-General the entitlements regarding official travel accorded to the Secretary-General in paragraph 2 of General Assembly resolution 42/214. In this regard, the first-class travel of the Deputy Secretary-General has been reported as an exception for the period up to 3 April 2011 only.
- 5. In addition to the Secretary-General being entitled to travel first class, it has been the custom and practice of the Organization, since the days of the first Secretary-General, to pay for first-class travel of one member of his immediate family to travel with him on official trips. Given this custom and practice, the official travel of the spouse or other immediate family member of the Secretary-General has been treated as an entitlement and not reported as an exception, and will continue to be treated as such unless explicitly precluded by the General Assembly.
- 6. Since the General Assembly decided in its resolution 65/268 to extend to the Deputy Secretary-General the entitlements regarding official travel accorded to the Secretary-General, the first-class official travel of the spouse or other immediate family member of the Deputy Secretary-General will be treated in the same manner

as an immediate family member of the Secretary-General unless explicitly precluded by the General Assembly.

II. Travel of delegations


- 7. In accordance with General Assembly resolution 42/214, payment of first-class accommodation by air is limited to the heads of delegations of the least developed countries to the regular and special sessions of the Assembly. During the reporting period, 18 first-class trips were approved at a cost of \$211,218, compared with 28 trips at a cost of \$309,380 for the period from 1 July 2008 to 30 June 2010.
- 8. As shown in figure I below, the number of trips and hence the total cost for the travel of delegates of the General Assembly peaked in the 2004-2006 biennium, after which they began to drop. The main reason for the peak in 2004-2006 was the World Summit held at the sixtieth session of the Assembly in 2005.

9. At the same time, as shown in figure II below, the average cost per trip has been rising steadily. With respect to the increased trend noted in the average trip cost, this pattern is consistent with the global industry trend, owing in large part to the added cost of security measures, fuel surcharges and operating expenses, which have been passed along to the consumer. In addition, certain markets lack competition to drive costs downwards. Currency fluctuation is also a factor.

III. Travel of the President of the General Assembly

10. To strengthen the ability of the President of the General Assembly to effectively and efficiently discharge the responsibilities of the Office, the Assembly, by resolution 53/214, decided that its President, consistent with the approved programme budget, should have full authority to use the funds provided in the budget for the Office. During the reporting period, five trips were taken at an additional cost of \$26,223, compared with two trips at an additional cost of \$2,759 in the period from 1 July 2008 to 30 June 2010. Detailed information on travel authorized by the President is provided in annex VI to the present report.

11. The number of trips taken by the President of the General Assembly peaked in the 2004-2006 period, but total additional cost and the average additional cost per trip peaked in the 2010-2012 biennium at \$26,223 and \$5,245 respectively, as a result of the general increase in first-class airfares (see figures III and IV below).





IV. Exceptions authorized by the Secretary-General

12. By General Assembly resolution 42/214, the Secretary-General was authorized to exercise his discretion in making exceptions to allow first-class air travel on a case-by-case basis. Such discretionary authority is also exercised in accordance with paragraph 4.5 of ST/AI/2006/4 when, in the opinion of the Secretary-General,

special circumstances warrant it. In exercising such authority, the Secretary-General takes into consideration, inter alia, the following circumstances:


- (a) A medical condition that may necessitate a level of comfort not available in the standard of accommodation to which the traveller is entitled. Such cases are referred to the Director of the Medical Services Division for recommendation. Advanced age alone is not considered sufficient justification to grant an exception;
- (b) The normal standard of accommodation is unavailable and, owing to the exigencies of service, the traveller is required to travel on a particular date. Cases also arise when accommodation at the normal standard of entitlement is not available and the cost of daily subsistence allowance while the traveller waits for the next available seat would be greater than the cost of the higher standard of travel;
- (c) The traveller is considered an eminent person, such as a former Head of State, or an international figure in the political, humanitarian or cultural arenas;
- (d) The traveller is a prominent person who is donating his or her services free of charge to the Organization and, in some cases, at a loss in personal income. Such individuals may be accorded the standard of accommodation to which they are accustomed;
- (e) The traveller, after completing a full day of work, is required to travel through the night in order to resume work, attend meetings or present a paper at another location on the following morning or immediately upon arrival. Where such cases involve arduous journeys, it has been deemed reasonable that the standard of accommodation accorded the traveller should provide the best rest possible while travelling, or provide the conditions most conducive to work while flying, or both.
- 13. As shown in figure V below, the number of trips and the total additional cost of the exceptions authorized by the Secretary-General (such as medical condition, normal standard of accommodation not available, eminent and prominent persons) have increased steadily.


14. Figure VI below indicates that there were insignificant fluctuations in the average additional cost per trip in the last three bienniums, where the average additional cost per trip was \$1,609, \$1,593 and \$1,619 respectively. The steady average additional cost per trip can be attributed to the fact that more offices booked their trips at least two weeks in advance, as requested by the Administration.


15. Exception is also granted where the traveller provides security services to the President of the General Assembly, the Secretary-General and the Deputy Secretary-General and their spouses or to any other official authorized to travel on behalf of the Secretary-General as his personal representative. In the biennium ended 30 June 2012, there was an increase in the number of trips and associated additional costs incurred by security personnel, with 93 trips at an additional cost of \$478,327, compared with 72 trips at an additional cost of \$325,103 for the previous biennium ended 30 June 2010, as shown in figure VII below.

16. As shown in figure VIII below, the average additional cost per trip for security personnel has increased since the 2006-2008 biennium. The major reason for this is a higher number of longer trips, combined with the global industry trend of more expensive airfares.

17. On 18 March 1998, the Secretary-General decided that, as an exception, all travel of the Deputy Secretary-General should be in first class, in keeping with his/her special status. In its resolution 65/268 of 4 April 2011, the General Assembly

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decided to extend to the Deputy Secretary-General the entitlements regarding official travel accorded to the Secretary-General in paragraph 2 of General Assembly resolution 42/214. In this regard, the first-class travel of the Deputy Secretary-General has been reported as an exception for the nine-month period ended on 3 April 2011, during which she took 10 trips at an additional cost of \$70,628 and an average additional cost per trip of \$7,063.

18. Pursuant to General Assembly resolution 65/268, the current report introduces a new consolidated summary of the exceptions authorized in respect of the United Nations and its affiliated entities during the period under review, as shown in table 1 below, and a comparative consolidated summary of the exceptions authorized in the biennium ended 30 June 2010 in table 2 below.

21. A summary of the exceptions authorized in respect of other United Nations affiliated entities during the period under review is contained in table 5 below and a summary of those authorized in the biennium ended 30 June 2010 appears in table 6. Details of exceptions authorized for the United Nations Development Programme, the United Nations Children's Fund, the United Nations Institute for Training and Research, the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, the United Nations Environment Programme, and the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime for the current period are contained in annexes VII, VIII, IX, X, XI and XII, respectively.

22. Figures IX and X below indicate that for the other United Nations affiliated entities, the number of trips increased to 146 during the period under review, compared with 72 trips in the previous biennium. The total additional cost increased to \$248,575, compared with \$108,141 for the previous biennium. However, the average additional cost per trip of \$1,703 for the period under review is similar to the average additional cost for the United Nations Secretariat and remains well below the peak average of \$2,042 reached in the biennium ended 30 June 2008.




